Dear Mr. President:

Over the past few weeks I have had conversations with several individuals that have reinforced some concerns I have had on the way in which we are approaching financing of the Presidential campaign and the RNC. I am concerned about two things. First, whether we are making effective fundraising efforts in both areas, and, second, whether the efforts that are under way are coordinated with each other. If you would like, I would be willing to discuss both of these with you at your convenience.

As events continue to move in the Middle East, I think it may be useful to discuss with you some of the political implications in the Jewish community. Right now the community is uneasy; in fact, considerably more uneasy than are the Israelis. I think that with a little bit of preparation, we can resolve the problem in a beneficial way. Again, at your convenience I could meet with you either here or in Vail.

We have organized for the big dinner for October 10th in Michigan. Unfortunately, I have been pressed to make this the big kick-off for Michigan, which it will be. Jun the channe gui.
