In regard to your note concerning the question by the President as to completing transfer of his Vice Presidential papers to the University of Michigan, I wish to advise that this Office is in the course of reviewing the status of all the President's pre-Presidential papers. It may be that we will want to ship additional papers to the University. However, the more important decision is how the entire collection, including papers during the period of the Ford Presidency, should be handled. This decision will probably have to await the studies and recommendations to Congress by the new Presidential Documents Commission and the resulting legislation, if any, from Congress.
