1. S Lloyd Bentsen                      Suggests that George Jessel receive the Presidential Medal of Freedom.
2. S Bill Brock                         Asks that the President autograph a photograph for Miss Peaches Stevens.
3. S James McClure                     Suggests that the President by Executive Order reclassify policy-making positions, that were put under Civil Service by Executive Order in the past; specifically requests that the two positions recently occupied by Vic Gauzza and George Gauzza in the Department of Interior be reclassified as Schedule C.
4. S Henry Bellmon                     Recommends that Dr. Charles L. Hosler be appointed to the National Advisory Committee on Oceans and Atmospheres.
5. S John Sparkman                     Recommends that Roger Yurchuck be appointed as Chairman of the Federal Home Loan Bank Board.
6. S Herman Talmadge                  Asks that Presidential birthday greetings be sent to W. O. Easterlin.

1. Charles Bennett Asks that consideration be given to copy of enclosed letter he received from George Regas who is requesting a Presidential pardon.
2. Bill Frenzel When the President visits the Twin Cities on August 19, the Congressman would like to suggest that in one of the President's speeches he mention the newly developed Freshwater Biological Institute.
3. James Corman Asks that the President now initiate a letter to the future President of the United States, to be opened in 1984, requesting the then President to offer an Air Force Academy appointment to the daughter of Major Allen T. Richardson, USAF(Ret.). She will be 18 years of age at that time.
4. Spark Matsunaga Asks that the President support new sugar legislation; since the expiration of the Sugar Act, the U. S. has become dependent upon the world market for its sugar; feels that legislation is needed to stabilize prices and guarantee a market for our domestic sugar industry.
5. Les Aspin Recommends that C. Thomas Burke and Richard N. Sharood be appointed to the Federal Maritime Commission.
6. Bob Wilson Recommends that H. Cushman Dow be appointed as General Counsel for the Department of Defense.
