Please allow me to take this opportunity to commend you on your selection of Bo Callaway to bring our message to the citizens of this part of the country. He arrived in Florida at 6:00 pm on Sunday and departed at 6:00 pm on Tuesday. During that forty-eight hour period, he covered thirty-seven out of the sixty-seven counties. We met with Republican leaders from the State Chairman down to precinct workers.

It was a delight to have a man of his caliber performing this function. It gave me a great feeling of pride to see the manner in which he handled the Rockefeller matter and other difficult questions. He was very well received by those with whom he met, including those who may have come with some reservations. The press coverage of his visit was outstanding and it was a most successful trip to the state.
