CONFERENCE REPORT ON H.R. 4222, NATIONAL SCHOOL LUNCH ACT

Mr. PERKINS submitted the following conference report and statement on the bill (H.R. 4222), National School Lunch Act:

CONFERENCE REPORT (H. REPT. NO. 94-427)

The committee of conference on the disagreeing votes of the two Houses on the amendment of the Senate to the bill (H.R. 4222) to amend the National School Lunch Act and the Child Nutrition Act of 1966 in order to extend and revise the special food service program for children and the school breakfast program, and for other purposes related to strengthening the school lunch and child nutrition programs, having met, after full and free conference, have agreed to recommend and do recommend to their respective Houses as follows:

That the House recede from its disagreement to the amendment of the Senate and agree to the same with an amendment as follows: In lieu of the matter proposed to be inserted by the Senate amendment insert the following:

That this Act may be cited as the "National School Lunch Act and Child Nutrition Act of 1966 Amendments of 1975".

SCHOOL BREAKFAST PROGRAM

SEC. 2. Section 4(a) of the Child Nutrition Act of 1966 (80 Stat. 885, as amended) is amended by striking out "for the fiscal years ending June 30, 1973, June 30, 1974, and June 30, 1975."

SEC. 3. Section 4 of the Child Nutrition Act of 1966 is amended by adding at the end thereof the following new subsection:

"(g) As a national nutrition and health policy, it is the purpose and intent of the Congress that the school breakfast program be made available in all schools where it is needed to provide adequate nutrition for children in attendance. The Secretary is hereby directed, in cooperation with State educational agencies, to carry out a program of information in furtherance of this policy. Within 4 months after the enactment of this subsection, the Secretary shall report to the committees of jurisdiction in the Congress his plans and those of the cooperating State agencies to bring about the needed expansion in the school breakfast program."

DIRECT FEDERAL EXPENDITURES

SEC. 4. Section 6(b) of the National School Lunch Act (80 Stat. 230, as amended) is amended—

(a) By striking out "nonprofit private" the first time such term occurs in the proviso of the third sentence and inserting in lieu thereof "any of the".

(b) By striking out "nonprofit private" the second time such term occurs in the proviso of the third sentence and inserting in lieu thereof "such".

EMERGENCY LOAN PROGRAM

Mr. BERGLAND filed the following conference report and statement on Senate bill (S. 555) to amend the Consolidated Farm and Rural Development Act:

CONFERENCE REPORT (H. REPT. No. 3)

The committee of conference on the agreeing votes of the two Houses on amendment of the House to the bill (S. 555) to amend the Consolidated Farm and Rural Development Act, having met, after full free conference, have agreed to recommend and do recommend to their respective Houses as follows:

That the Senate recede from its dissent to the amendment of the House agree to the same with an amendment as follows:

In lieu of the matter proposed to be inserted by the House amendment insert the following:

Sec. 2. Subsection (a) of section 3 of the Act is amended to read: "The Secretary shall designate any area in the United States, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands as an emergency area if he finds that a natural disaster has occurred in said area and substantially affected farming, ranching, aquaculture operations. For purposes of this subtitle 'aquaculture' means husbandry of aquatic organisms under a controlled selected environment."

Sec. 3. Subsection (b) of section 3 of the Act is amended as follows:

(a) in the first sentence after the words "major disaster" insert "or emergency strike the words "oyster planters" "oyster planting" and insert in lieu thereof the words "persons engaged in aquaculture and "aquaculture", respectively; and

(d) delete everything after the first comma, strike the period, and insert: "are unable to obtain sufficient credit where to finance their actual needs at reasonable rates and terms, taking into consideration prevailing private and cooperative rates and terms in the community in which the applicant resides for loans for similar purposes and periods of time, provisions of this subsection shall not be applicable to loan applications filed prior to July 9, 1975."

Sec. 4. Section 322 of the Act is amended to read: "Loans may be made under subtitle for any of the purposes authorized for loans under subtitle A or B of this Act as well as for crop or livestock credit deemed desirable by the applicant: Provided, That such loans may include, but are not limited to, the amount of the actual sustained as a result of the disaster."

Sec. 5. Section 324 of the Act is amended to read: "Loans made or insured under this Act shall be (1) at a rate of interest in excess of 5 per centum per annum on the amount of the actual loss caused by the disaster, and (2) for any portions of loans in excess of that amount the interest rate will be that prevailing in the private market for similar loans, as determined by the Secretary. All such loans shall be repayable at such times as the Secretary may determine, taking into account purposes of the loan and the nature and effect of the disaster, but not later than provided for loans for similar purposes under subtitles A and B of this title, and upon full personal liability of the borrower upon the best security available, as the
