Dear Mr. President -

I am so sorry the way things turned out in this special election. We just had no conception that such a protest vote against the "establishment" - and myself as an exponent thereof - would be involved. Apparently organized labor put literally thousands of out-of-state people into the field on election day as well as hundreds of thousands of dollars.

And, as I pleaded with Mr. Ruth, the failure of the Justice Department to wind up the Fisher investigation was inexcusable and I'm afraid deliberate. In fact I think that is what they assured Austin before the Senate vacated the seat.

In any event it was no rejection of you in any way. Rather it was a blue collar

vote against big oil, big business and  
a "typical" Senator image. They wanted  
somebody to go to Washington and  
shake the system up - or so it seems  
to me.

Whatever I can do to help you in  
any way at any time - I am at your  
service. I can never thank you enough  
for your tremendous effort in my behalf  
It was just wonderful!
