
Dear Mr. President:

As a follow-up to our earlier conversation and my recent telephone discussion with Secretary Kissinger regarding your possible visit to Alaska in November, I am hopeful that your schedule will permit you to be in Anchorage on Friday, November 28. I have suggested this date to your staff and to Secretary Kissinger on the basis that we have made plans to have my annual public birthday celebration on November 28 in Anchorage, and we decided on this particular date with the hope that it would correspond satisfactorily with your visit to China.

With this date in mind, I would recommend that you visit the pipeline on the morning of the 28th, touch down in Fairbanks, and continue to Anchorage for the dinner on my behalf. We have always had good support at the birthday dinner each year, and I would really appreciate your joining us if possible.

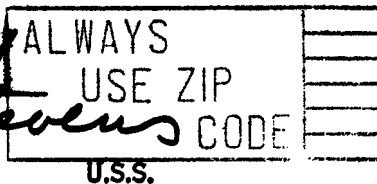
