Dear Mr. President:

I want to express my deep thanks to you for the kind and reassuring words you provided Perry Duryea and me on Wednesday. They have done much to dispel the efforts of the calculated campaign that was being waged in Albany and New York City to distort your position on the steps which must be taken here.

As a matter of fact, that very evening Governor Carey switched his position, and yesterday the Senate Minority Leader told the New York Times that Governor Carey "had them (Duryea and me) bamboozled for a while and even had the President's people confused. It would have been great if it had worked." Thankfully, Mr. President, it hasn't worked.

As soon as we had hung up it occurred to me that I had wanted to join with you in looking forward to a big Michigan victory over Ohio State Saturday. By the time you read this, the suspense over that situation, at least, will be ended.
