On November 28, 1975, you signed legislation (P.L. 94-136) creating a National Center for Productivity and Quality of Working Life. The Center absorbs the functions of the National Commission on Productivity and Work Quality and is also authorized to assist in the formation of national productivity policies, to coordinate federal productivity activities, to review the effect of regulatory agencies on productivity, and to stimulate and support private and public productivity efforts.

On December 9, the Center presented a 1977 budget request for \$5 million and 40 full-time permanent employees. This request, which was strongly supported by the Vice President in his capacity as Chairman of the Center's Board of Directors, would substantially increase funding for federal productivity efforts. The 1976 budget for the predecessor Productivity Commission was \$2.0M and provided for 20 employees. Nevertheless, the Center's 1977 request is consistent with the enlarged federal productivity responsibilities envisioned in the legislation.

I recommend acceptance of the Center's request for 1977 as a means of demonstrating your strong support for federal productivity efforts.
