- James Scheuer Expresses concern over a press report asserting that 1. the Department of State has been exerting pressure on the Dept. of Justice to refrain from actively prosecuting Bechtel. Says "such encroachment on the jurisdiction of the Department of Justice cannot be tolerated."
- Expresses concern over a reported 50% cut being Marilyn Lloyd 2. recommended by OMB in the proposed budget of the Defense Civil Preparedness Agency, which would seriously hurt her District.
- James Abdnor Understands that a \$240 million proposed moderniza-3. tion of the Minuteman missiles at Ellsworth Air Force Base in South Dakota has been eliminated from funding DoD. Requests information on this and urges that the funds be restored.
- Requests that in the future the National Bar Associa-Charles Rangel 4. tion, the oldest Black legal organization in the U.S., also be included among those organizations called upon to review potential Supreme Court nominees.
 - Thinks it would be a great mistake if the Overseas Voters Bill is not signed.

Joins Olin Teague in urging that the Congressional Space Medal of Honor be awarded to Virgil Grissom, Roger Chaffee and Edward White II. Suggests that the award be made on January 27, 1976, "the anniversary of the date upon which these brave men lost their lives."

- Hopes "you will consider both the past and future James Symington accomplishments made possible through Land and Water Conservation Program and recommends its full funding for Fiscal Year 1977." Points out that the program "has exemplified the new kind of federalism called for by a growing number of Americans."
- Bill Nichols Expresses his concern, and that of local officials, 8. over possible cuts in the land and water conservation fund for FY '77. "I know it is difficult to hold federal spending to a reasonable level when everyone is asking for their program to be fully funded, however, I would ask that the great benefits which this program has rendered be given every consideration as you and your staff deliberate on this budget request for FY '77.
