The President has instructed that the following procedures be observed by White House and National Security Council Staff officers in making contacts within the United States with diplomatic and other official representatives of the USSR, Poland, Czechoslovakia, Hungary, Romania and Bulgaria:

-- In advance of each proposed contact, the submission of written notification to the Assistant to the President for National Security Affairs, indicating the national advantage or other purpose expected to be derived from the contact, and specifying the hour, date and place of the contemplated meeting (a copy of this submission to be furnished to Mr. Russell Ash of the NSC Staff in advance of the proposed meeting date).

-- After a contact has been made, the submission of a memorandum of conversation to the Assistant to the President for National Security Affairs, covering any policy-related matters of substance that may have been discussed (with a copy of the memorandum furnished to Mr. Ash).

Adherence to these procedures will facilitate the coordination and consideration of matters of national security interest that may arise in the course of contacts made outside the usual diplomatic and protocol channels.
