I. PURPOSE

To permit Representatives Jones and Harsha to discuss the vacancy on the Board of Directors of the Tennessee Valley Authority and to propose the appointment of their candidate, John Watson of Batavia, Ohio.

II. BACKGROUND, PARTICIPANTS AND PRESS PLAN

A. <u>Background</u>: Rep. Bill Harsha represents the Sixth Congressional District of Ohio. He serves as the ranking minority member of the House Public Works and Transportation Committee.

Rep. Jones represents the Fifth Congressional District of Alabama, which borders the State of Tennessee and TVA area on the North. He presently serves as Chairman of the House Public Works and Transportation Committee.

The TVA Directors are responsible for supervising the actions of the TVA which include operation of the river control system, investigation of the need for and feasibility of additional river control projects. Additionally, assistance is given to state and local governments to reduce local flood problems and aids in supplying power to industry and Federal installations.

Since James Hooper's nomination reached a stalemate, the Presidential Personnel Office has been searching for a candidate who would meet the demanding characteristics required for this post. The Personnel Office has narrowed the choice down to several candidates, not including John Watson. The Personnel Office will be meeting with the President very shortly on this subject.

In view of the fact that no final decision has been made, it will not be necessary for the President at this meeting to totally rule out John Watson, the candidate supported by Representatives Jones and Harsha. Mr. Watson's resume and a letter from Bill Harsha to the President are attached at Tab A.

It is recommended, therefore, that the President listen to the views of Representatives Jones and Harsha and agree to consider their candidate.

III. TALKING POINTS

A. I understand that you wanted this opportunity to speak with me in behalf of your candidate, John Watson, for appointment to the vacancy on the TVA Board of Directors.

CAVEAT:

You should be aware John Rhodes has advised me that it is his view that appointments of incumbent Republicans to Federal posts which may mean the loss of the Republican seat in Congress should be discouraged. Therefore, he does not favor this proposal.
