President's Mail - April 14, 1976

Senate

- 1S Edmund Muskie Sends detailed telegram urging an effective tariff quota to provide import relief to the domestic footwear industry.
- 2S Bob Dole 2  
Writes in detail about recent action taken by the HEW Region VII Health Administrator in naming a non-profit private corporation to be the comprehensive planning entity for the Kansas/Missouri Health Service Area 4/1. Says this action was taken even though both Governor Bennett and Governor Bond had made strong recommendations to the contrary. Wants an investigation.
- 3S J. Glenn Beall, Jr. Endorses Joseph R. Fogarty for the FCC.
- 4S Robert Morgan Recommends Mrs. Maurice Honigman for the National Council on the Arts.
- 5S Philip Hart Writes on behalf of constituents to recommend Kenyon Y. Taylor and Professor Henry Kroeze for the Metric Board.
- 6S Russell Long Sends resume of John Burr Scofield, who is interested in being considered to fill the District Court Judgeship vacancy for the Western District of Louisiana.
- 7S James Buckley Writes on behalf of Patrick Leonard, Director of Alumni Relations at Sienna College, to obtain letter of congratulations from the President to the Reverend Matthew T. Conlin, who is being honored at a testimonial dinner on April 23.
- 8S Gaylord Nelson Writes as a member of the American Youth Hostels Board of Directors to invite the President to a breakfast on May 4 in the Dirksen Building to commemorate national Youth Hostel Week.
- 9S Herman Talmadge Endorses invitation to address the Southern Commodity Producers Conference in Birmingham on July 29.
- 10S Hugh Scott Endorses invitation to attend the premiere performance of Menotti's The Hero on June 1 at the Academy of Music in Philadelphia.

Burke                      Sends two letters concerning the domestic footwear industry, along with the names of 55 colleagues who urge adoption without modification of the compromise relief plan suggested by the American Footwear Industries Association. The Members do not believe trade adjustment assistance would provide the necessary relief.
2. Carl Perkins                        Writes on behalf of his constituents to urge tariff and import quota action for the relief of the domestic footwear industry.
3. William Armstrong                Endorses Jeanne Davies for the Advisory Committee for the White House Conference on Libraries.
4. James Broyhill                    Endorses Hirman Walker for the Fourth Circuit Court of Appeals.
5. John Breaux                        Recommends Dr. Norman Efferson for the International Agricultural Development Board.
6. William Hughes                    Writes on behalf of Bernard Friedman, recipient of the Man of the Year award from the Atlantic City Elks, who wants an autographed photograph of the President.
7. Edwin Forsythe                   Strongly endorses request of the Women's Republican Club of Jackson, New Jersey, for an appointment at the White House during May, June or July.
8. Guy Vander Jagt                   Strongly endorses invitation from the County of Muskegon to dedicate its Wastewater Management System on July 12.
