SUBJECT: Recent Grain Sales to the Soviet Union

The Department of Agriculture reported today the last in a new series of grain sales to the Soviet Union which have been finalized during the period April 28-May 4, 1976.

The sales during this period total 4.9 million tons of grain including:

2,700,000 tons of old crop corn 1,650,000 tons of new crop corn 550,000 tons of new crop wheat

The old crop corn is scheduled for delivery prior to September 30, 1975. The new crop corn and wheat, under the U.S.-U.S.S.R. Grain Agreement, is scheduled for delivery after October 1, 1976.

Sales under the Grain Agreement now total 2.2 million tons.

Sales to the Soviet Union from the 1975 crop "old crop" wheat and feed grains now total 16.5 million tons including 4.4 million tons of wheat and 12.1 million tons of feed grains.

USDA reports that as far as they know there are no other active discussions with the Soviet Union for additional purchases at this time.
