This memorandum seeks your approval of the nomination of J. Blaine Anderson to be U. S. Circuit Judge for the Ninth Circuit Court. A career profile is attached for your review (Tab A).

J. Blaine Anderson, 54, a Republican, currently is U. S. District Judge for the District of Idaho. Prior to that appointment in 1971, he was a Partner in the law firm of Furchner, Anderson & Martsch. He has also served as City Attorney for Blackfoot and Arco, Idaho.

A graduate of the University of Washington with a J. D. from the University of Idaho, Judge Anderson resides in Boise, Idaho. He is represented by Congressman Hansen (R).
