Dear Mr. President

I am chagrined that our Washington state convention did not do better in selection of national delegates. Even though we gained one more than we expected, the total isn't good enough.

While I will not be a delegate to Kansas City, I am willing to do whatever you think effective in the drive toward nomination and election.

Even though I have long felt that governors have good experience to be national candidates I am terribly distressed by the two remaining examples.

You have brought this country a long way since the dark days of 1974 and have restored honor and decency to the White House. That strong should be enough for reflection but the people aren't yet aware. Keep fighting for us and tell me what I can do.
