MEMORANDUM FOR: THE PRESIDENT

FROM: JACK MARSH *J. Marsh*

Senator Hugh Scott had his Staff Assistant, Richard Quick, call from their aircraft enroute to Washington to advise of the following:

1. Scott says the Pennsylvania people are not receptive to the Schweiker announcement.
2. It is believed the announcement will backfire and increase the Ford support.
3. He is aware of the 6:00 meeting tonight in Philadelphia to develop a counter strategy to Schweiker.
4. Scott is issuing a statement reiterating his support of the President and urging the delegates to hold fast.
5. Scott urges that Drew Lewis replace Schweiker as a delegate and that he be named to the Rules Committee.
