Research by Bob Wolthuis has turned up additional "partisan political" appointments by Kennedy and LBJ.

The list is attached. We are working on researching all ex-Democratic Congressmen during this period.

Max:

The following have turned up.

1. Price Daniel of Texas
 - a. Former U.S. Senator
 - b. Former Governor of Texas
 - c. John Connally defeated Daniel in Democratic Primary in 1962
 - d. L.B.J. appointed him Director of the Office of Emergency Preparedness in 1967 and Assistant to the President for Federal-State Relation

2. Senator Maurene Neuberger
 - a. Retired in 1967 as Senator from Oregon
 - b. L.B.J. appointed her as a member of the General Advisory Committee of ACDA

3. David S. King
 - a. Defeated for U.S. Senate 1962
 - b. Elected 1964 to House and defeated for re-election in 1966
 - c. L.B.J. appointed him Ambassador to the Malagary Republic and to Mauritius concurrently in 1967

4. Orville Freeman
 - a. Defeated as candidate for Minnesota A.G. 1950
 - b. Defeated as Candidate for Governor 1952
 - c. Appointed Secretary of Agriculture 1961-1969
