THE PRESIDENT HAS SEEN

MR. PRESIDENT:

Congressman Del Latta visited with me this afternoon and wanted you to have the following message:

Del feels very strongly that you should give serious consideration to Reagan for the Vice Presidential nomination. He feels it is the best way to present a unified ticket. He also states there is a tremendously strong feeling by the Reagan forces which could cause problems in uniting the Party unless Reagan is selected.

You should be aware that Reagan was not Del's original choice for Vice President, but he said he wants to win November.
