## Discussion

Beneficiary is a 46 year old native and citizen of Czechoslovakia. He was admitted to the United States on February 28, 1968, with his 23 year old son for permanent residence. He is employed by the U.S. Government.

Beneficiary was born in Czechoslovakia and enlisted in the army in Czechoslovakia in 1949. He rose to the rank of Major General and defected to the United States in 1968. From 1946 to 1968 he was a member of the Czechoslovakian Communist Party.

The Immigration Act prohibits naturalization of aliens who were within subversive classes within ten years of their filing of a petition for naturalization.



Mr. Sejna's wife and two adopted children, a father, and a married sister are still in Czechoslovakia. He has had no personal contact with them since his defection.

The report of the Senate Committee on the Judiciary states that the Committee:

"after consideration of all the facts in the case, is of the opinion that the bill (S. 2594) should be enacted."
