
The Enrolled Joint Resolution was introduced and passed in the Senate on June 9 and also passed by the House on June 9.

The Resolution provides that Congress declares twenty-one days from Flag Day, June 14, through Independence Day, July 4, as a period to honor America through appropriate public gatherings and activities.

On the floor of the House, Representative Rhodes stated that "This is the sixth annual observance and it records our nation's 199th birthday...a program that is nonpolitical, nonpartisan, just simply, purely patriotic... I urge that all Americans... attend or take part in the festivals, concerts, folklore, and craft exhibitions that will be reminders of the rich heritage nearly two centuries of Americanism have produced."



Since June 14, Flag Day, marks the beginning of the 21 day period of observance, it is important that the Enrolled Joint Resolution be signed by that date if it is to have the full effect which Congress intended.



## Joint Resolution

To honor America.

*Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That Congress declares the twenty-one days from Flag Day through Independence Day as a period to honor America, and further declares that there be public gatherings and activities at which the people of the United States can celebrate and honor their country in an appropriate manner.*
