

The enrolled bill would designate and name the plaza fronting the new Federal building at 1220 Southwest Third Street, Portland, Oregon, as the "Terry Schrunk Plaza".

The late Terry D. Schrunk was a distinguished Oregonian who rendered many years of public service to his native State. A recipient of two wartime combat medals, he returned to the Portland area and became successively Captain of the Portland Fire Bureau, Sheriff of Multnomah County, Oregon, and finally four-term Mayor of Portland. During his tenure as Mayor, he was selected as president of the U.S. Conference of Mayors and as president of the League of Oregon Cities.

REPORT

[To accompany S. 1971]

The Committee on Public Works, to which was referred the bill (S. 1971), to designate the plaza area of the Federal Building, Portland, Oreg., the "Terry Schrunk Plaza," having considered the same, reports favorably thereon without amendment and recommends that the bill do pass.

PURPOSE

The purpose of S. 1971 is to appropriately designate and name the plaza adjacent to the new Federal building at 1120 Southwest Third Street in Portland, Oreg., as the "Terry Schrunk Plaza."

GENERAL STATEMENT

The late Terry D. Schrunk was a highly distinguished Oregonian who served as Mayor of the City of Portland from January 1957 until his retirement in January 1973.

Terry Schrunk is remembered by Oregonians for his unselfish commitment to the betterment of urban life in that State. A recipient of the Purple Heart and Silver Star during wartime, Terry Schrunk returned from the Navy to rise to the rank of Captain of the Portland Fire Bureau. In 1949, he was appointed Sheriff of Multnomah County, Oreg., a post in which he served for 7 years until his election as Mayor of Portland in the autumn of 1956. In all, Mr. Schrunk was elected to the mayoralty for 4 consecutive terms. During this period of service, he was also chosen as president of the U.S. Conference of Mayors and as president of the League of Oregon Cities.

COMMITTEE VIEWS

Oregon Republicans and Democrats alike are actively promoting this legislation and the Committee agrees it provides an appropriate and dignified way of recognizing a public servant of the quality and caliber of Terry D. Schrunk.

COST OF LEGISLATION

Section 252(a)(1) of the Legislative Reorganization Act of 1970 requires publication in this report of the Committee's estimate of the cost of reported legislation, together with estimates prepared by any Federal agency. There is no cost to the Federal Government as a result of this legislation. Because there is no cost involved, no report of the Congressional Budget Office is included herein.

ROLLCALL VOTES

Section 133 of the Legislative Reorganization Act of 1970 and the rules of the Committee on Public Works requires that any rollcall votes be announced in this report. During the Committee's consideration of this bill, no rollcall votes were taken. The measure was unanimously ordered reported on a voice vote.

CHANGES OF EXISTING LAW

In compliance with subsection 4 of rule XXIX of the Standing Rules of the Senate, it is reported that this bill effects no change in existing law.

The Committee on Public Works and Transportation, to whom was referred the bill (H.R. 13727) to designate the plaza area of the Federal Building, Portland, Oregon, the "Terry Schrunk Plaza", having considered the same, report favorably thereon without amendment that the bill do pass.

In 1949, he was appointed Sheriff of Multnomah County, Oregon, serving in that position for seven years until his election as Mayor of Portland in 1956. Terry Schrunk was elected as Mayor of Portland for four consecutive terms. During this period of service, he was chosen as president of the United States Conference of Mayors and as president of the League of Oregon Cities.

COSTS OF THE LEGISLATION

Clause 7(a) of rule XIII of the Rules of the House of Representatives requires a statement of the estimated cost to the United States which would be incurred in carrying out H.R. 13727, as reported. There would be no costs resulting from enactment of H.R. 13727, as reported.

VOTE

The committee ordered the bill reported by voice vote.

COMPLIANCE WITH CLAUSE 2(1) OF RULE XI OF THE RULES OF THE HOUSE
OF REPRESENTATIVES

(1) With reference to clause 2(1)(3)(A) of rule XI of the Rules of the House of Representatives, no separate hearings were held on the subject matter of this legislation by the Subcommittee on Investigations and Review. However, the Subcommittee on Public Buildings and Grounds held hearings on this subject matter which resulted in the reported bill.

(2) With respect to clause 2(1)(3)(B) of rule XI of the Rules of the House of Representatives the bill, as reported, does not provide new budget authority or increased tax expenditures. Accordingly, a statement pursuant to section 308(a) of the Congressional Budget Act is not required.

(3) With reference to clause 2(1)(3)(C) of rule XI of the Rules of the House of Representatives, the committee has not received an estimate and comparison prepared by the Director of the Congressional Budget Office under section 403 of the Congressional Budget Act.

(4) With reference to clause 2(1)(3)(D) of rule XI of the Rules of the House of Representatives, the Committee has not received a report for the Committee on Government Operations pertaining to this subject matter.

(5) With reference to clause 2(1)(4) of rule XI of the Rules of the House of Representatives, H.R. 13727, as reported, will not affect prices and costs since it does not authorize additional funds. Therefore, H.R. 13727, as reported, would not have an inflationary impact on the national economy.

An Act

To designate the plaza area of the Federal Building, Portland, Oregon, the
"Terry Schrunk Plaza".

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the
United States of America in Congress assembled, That the plaza
fronting the Federal Building, 1220 Southwest Third Street, and
bounded on the north by Madison Street, on the south by Jefferson
Street, on the east by Third Avenue and on the west by Fourth Ave-
nue, Portland, Oregon, is hereby designated as the "Terry Schrunk
Plaza".*

SEC. 2. Any reference in a law, map, regulation, document, record,
or other paper of the United States to such plaza shall be held to be
reference to the "Terry Schrunk Plaza".
