If the President decides to go with a nationwide inoculation to avert a possible epidemic of swine influenza. I am of the view there should be developed a careful plan and concerted briefing program for the Members of Congress.

Some of the elements would include:

- 1. Letter and fact sheet to every Member.
- Presidential briefing for Mansfield, Scott, Albert, O'Neill and Rhodes at a minimum.
- Pre-public briefing by experts from HEW of jurisdictional committee leadership to include Appropriations Subcommittee with ex officio Members and the leadership of the Budget committee.
- 4. A general forum briefing in the Caucus Room conducted by experts. This would occur after the pre-notice briefing.

I would recommend that Kurzman be alerted to this possible briefing requirement and that he be tasked to prepare a briefing plan that incorporates the above guidance together with your recommendations and his own.

This should be done on a close-hold basis and he should review the plan with you and Members of your staff. It must be emphasized that it is a contingency plan based upon what decision the President makes.

It may be that the President may announce within the next 48 hours a national inoculation program to avert a possible influenza epidemic described as "swine influenza." This is a particularly virulent strain of virus which if contacted by humans, is likely to result in a fatality.

Should the virus occur in the wide spread manner of other types of influenza next Fall and Winter, projections of U. S. fatalities have been made of possibly one million.

If medical evidence points to an epidemic of swine influenza, it is expected there will be announced an effort to mass produce the vaccine which has been developed, and secondly, a nationwide inoculation program. There has been speculation in the press on this subject. Thus far there has been no White House confirmation of the problem. Therefore, it is essential you treat this memo with greatest sensitivity and I would request that you not disclose its contents to anyone other than Ted Marrs. His medical background should be of great help in this situation. The principal White House responsibility is focused on Jim Cannon of the Domestic Council, and I would appreciate your not taking any action, except of a contingency planning nature, without coordinating with Jim. No affirmative action should be taken until there has been a Presidential decision.



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

#### DRAFT MESSAGE

SWINE INFLUENZA IMMUNIZATION PROGRAM

The nation faces a serious potential public health threat this winter from a **pertuin** strain of virus known as swine influenza.

One month ago this strain of influenza was discovered and isolated among Army recruits at Ft. Dix, New Jersey. The appearance of this strain has caused concern within the medical community because this virus is very similar to the one that caused a widespread and very deadly flu epidemic late in 1918-19. Some Americans will recall that 548,000 people died in this country during that tragic period -- and 20 million people worldwide.

I have consulted with members of my Administration, Secretary Mithews and Dr. Cooper and leading members of the health community and public officials about the implications of this new appearance of swine flu. I have been advised that there is a very real possibility that unless we take effective counter-action, there could be an epidemic of this dangerous disease next fall and winter here in the United States.

The facts that have been presented to me in the last authorities few days have come from many of the best medical many in this country. These facts do not suggest there is any cause for alarm. The scientific community essentially understands what we are dealing with and they have developed a vaccine that will be effective in combatting it. The facts do suggest, however, that there is a need for action now -- action by the Government, action by industry and the medical community, and most importantly, action by all of our citizens.

Although no one knows at this time exactly how serious this threat could be, we cannot afford to take chances with the health of our people. Accordingly, I am taking the following action.

I am asking the Congress for a special supplemental appropriation of \$135 million -- prior to their April recess -for the production of sufficient vaccine to inoculate every man, woman and child in the United States.

I have directed HEW Secretary David Mathews, and the Assistant Secretary for health, Dr. Theodore Cooper, to develop and implement plans that will make this vaccine available to all Americans.

Finally, I am asking each and every American to make certain he or she receives the vaccine this fall. Inoculations are to be available at schools, hospitals, physicians' offices, and public health facilities.

Extraordinary measures are necessary because of the short time period available to assure adequate vaccine production and to mobilize the nation's health care delivery system. An extensive immunization program must be in full-scale operation

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by the beginning of September and should be completed by the end of November, 1976.

I urge the Congress to act immediately to pass this special supplemental oppropriation separately. This \$135 million appropriation, if acted on immediately, will be a key factor in putting this threat behind us before next winter.

Congressional Notification of the President's Program on Swine Influenza Immunization

On Monday the President met with Secretary Mathews and others about a possible outbreak of swine influenza this coming winter. The President, concerned with the potential seriousness of this situation, has convened a panel of influenza experts, medical professionals, public health officers, pharmaceutical executives, and public officials to discuss his plans for a Federal initiative to immunize all Americans against the swine influenza.

The meeting will take place in the Cabinet Room at 3:30 p.m. today. Following his discussion with the group, the President will announce his decision. You may want to notify key members of the Health Authorization and Appropriation Committees of the President's decision at 4:00 p.m. this afternoon. The members include Congressmen Rogers, Carter, Flood, and Michel, and Senators Kennedy, Schweiker, Magnuson, and Brooke.

#### TALKING POINTS

- 1. I am calling to inform you that the President and Secretary Mathews are now meeting with influenza experts, medical professionals, public health officials, pharmaceutical executives, and public officials to discuss a possible swine influenza epidemic next winter.
- This meeting is a result of a briefing on Monday by HEW detailing the potential seriousness of this situation.
- 3. The President will announce his decision to give the go-ahead to industry to produce enough vaccine to immunize every American.

 The President will send up a \$134 million supplemental appropriation request for the FY 1976 budget to support this necessary effort.

Congressman Paul Rogers (D-Fla.) Chairman of the House Commerce Health Subcommittee which has jurisdiction over the President's Swine Flu vaccination program, called this afternoon with the following recommentations.

Swine Flu

That the President meet as soon as possible, hopefully Thursday, with the four leading drug manufacturers and about 13 of the appropriate insurance executives to urge that the impasse be broken regarding liability insurance for the swine flu program.

Rogers believes that the insurance companies are being intransigent in not underwriting the liability policies and that the President could resolve the controversy if he got these people together and insisted the insurance companies cooperate as a public responsibility.

Rogers indicated that he believes the insurance companies are now ready to go about \$20 million in coverage and he indicated that he would support some legislation to back up the insurance companies if they would show movement at this time.

I understand Secretary Matthews would support such a meeting and I would defer to the Secretary and Jim Cannon to the substantive desirability of such a meeting at this time.

However, Rogers indicated that if the President does not intercede he intends to hold hearings on Friday pertaining to this matter. He said it was his desire not to have the hearings and he would just as soon the White House take action without necessitating his committee holding hearings.





#### ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- 1. On August 12, 1976, the President signed P.L. 94-380, The National Swine Flu Immunisation Program of 1976, to enable the resolution of the liability issue through the utilization of the Federal Torts Claim Act.
- Public information materials, including television and radio spots, posters, and billboards, have been developed in prototype with distribution scheduled to begin in mid-August.
- 3. Requisitions for influenza vaccines with guidelines for ordering quantities of vaccines have been distributed to grantees.
- 4. All jet injector devices ordered for the mass immunization program have been shipped to grantees. Hanuals of instruction for the operation, repair, and maintenance of jet injector devices have also been distributed.

#### PROBLEMS

- Finalize the written information/registration form as mandated under the provisions of P.L. 94-380. "The Mational Swine Influenza Immunization Program of 1976".
- 2. To negotiate the vaccine contract with manufacturers.

#### ACTIONS TAKEN TO RESOLVE PROBLEMS

- 1. Consultation with the National Commission for the Protection of Human Subjects of Biomedical and Behavioral Research is scheduled for August 17, to approve the information/registration form.
- 2. We have requested the drug manufacturers to submit new distribution and price schedules.

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

PITTSBURGH (UPI) -- MEDICAL DETECTIVES FROM THE CENTER FOR DISEASE CONTROL IN ATLANTA AND LOCAL HEALTH AUTHORITIES TODAY INVESTIGATED THE DEATHS OF THREE ELDERLY RESIDENTS WHO RECEIVED SWINE FLU INOCULATIONS WITHIN ONE HOUR OF EACH OTHER MONDAY AND DIED LATER IN THE DAY.

PITTSBURGH AP - Allegheny County shut down all 13 of its swine flu inoculation clinics today after the deaths of three elderly persons just hours after they received swine flu shots at a Pittsburgh clinic.

No links directly relating the deaths to the flu sbots were established, health officials said, and the closing of the clinics was

described as a precautionary measure. "At the same time, we are talking about three deaths involving the same facility within hours after inoculation, and the odds of that happening are formidable, " said County Coroner Cyril Wecht. All three of the people who died had chronic heart conditions, Wecht said, and the stress of getting the shots may have contributed to their deaths.

A spokesman for the federal Center for Disease Control in Atlanta said there were no plans to curtail the nationwide program aimed at immunizing up to 200 million Americans against swine flu. The center is administering the program.

A spot check with state health departments across the country indicated no immediate plans to discontinue or cut back local programs.

Two doctors from the Disease Control Center were dispatched to Pittsburgh to investigate the deaths. Wecht said the federal doctors and local health investigators would look into the possibility of a bad batch of vaccine as well as the procedures used to inoculate.

In Washington, the national director of the swine flu program. Dr. W. Delano Meriwether, said, "We have absolutely no reason to believe there is a specific problem with the vaccine... And in Michigan, state health officials said some swine flu vaccine distributed there came from the same lot as the vaccine given to three persons who died in Pittsburgh. They said there have been no reports of ill effects among some 6,000 Michigan residents who already have been inoculated.
