

In response to Mr. Marsh's memorandum of February 23, I submit the following visitation information:

- Hotel/motel occupancy for January 1976 was down nine percent from January 1975. We have no figures for February as yet. Please understand that extracting figures from the Hotel/Motel Association is somewhat akin to breaking the Iron Curtain.
- Tourmobile patronage for January and February are up 53 percent from a similar period in 1975.
- With respect to the major monuments under the cognisance of the Park Service for the period January-February 1976 as opposed to January-February 1975, I submit the following:
 - White House up 11 percent, Lincoln Memorial up 27 percent, Washington Monument approximately even, Jefferson Memorial a slight decrease.

The decrease in hotel/motel occupancy can best be explained by the fact that Congress convened rather late in January, as most visitations at this time of the year are business oriented. The increased Tourmobile patronage and the increased visitations to monuments, I feel, are caused by greatly increased local and suburban sightseers, attributable to the fact that February 1976 set an all-time record for warm temperatures.



On balance, I see no reason at this time to deviate from the previous estimate of a 23-25 percent increase in visitations for the Calendar Year 1976, or, in approximate figures, an influx of 17-18 million people.

Tourist Galore

Two million Bicentennial visitors are expected to visit the Capitol Building in 1976, and the chief of the Capitol Guide force says the "crush" is starting.

"We've reached the saturation point—about 10,000 visitors a day—several times this year," Tom Nottingham, the Chief Guide said. "But all that means, is that we eliminate the group's visit to one of the two Chambers. They get their choice of seeing everything else on the agenda and either the Senate or the House Chamber."

Thus far in 1976, 205,115 visitors (January-March) have taken the 25-minute guided tours (but April statistics have not been compiled and added to the totals). The 45,509 who visited in January and the 53,890 visiting in February "represented an increase of about 40 percent per month," Nottingham said. The March totals, 105,716 visitors, represented only a four per cent increase, because Easter Day was in March in 1975. "We'll make up for that low increase in our April statistics."

Since 1929, Nottingham said, the Capitol Guide force has been operating with 24 full-time personnel, and even though a record number of visitors is expected, only four part-time employees have been added to assist in handling the crowds.

As for yearly totals of visitors, here's a look at the past three years: 1975, 1,511,000 visitors; 1974, 1,157,000 visitors; 1973, 1,215,000 visitors. 1975 is the current record year.

New tickets—which are free souvenirs in reality—have been printed in Bicentennial redwhite-and-blue.

Nottingham said that although the new electronic detection devices at the entrance to the House chambers cause "some delay," there have been no difficulties.

"When you're ased to handling between 5,000 and 7,000 people a day, and the average is between 7,000 and 9,000 a day now; you know you're earning your money," Nottingham said.

Plans by the Congress to initiate planned 'self-guided' tours of the Capitol have not yet materialized—possibly, conjectures Nottingham, because it has been proven that the guide force can handle the larger crowds.

"We'll try it, sure," said Nottingham. "But Ken Harding (the House Sergeant at Arms, and the Guide Board Chairman) has not said anything to me about it recently. I understood the project was supposed to start on April 1."

Visitation at memorials and monuments for the month of June through June 13 continues well above visitation for the same period last year (443,000 visits v. 376,000 last year). The White House and Mount Vernon are 10% and 18%, respectively, above last year at this period.

The museums and galleries, with 644,000 visits trail last year's 765,000 visits for the period.

Tourmobile ridership is down 9% for June thus far, and the Kennedy Center leads the way in visitation increase, up 77% over last year.
