TALKING POINTS: BOY OF THE YEAR, WEDNESDAY, MARCH 19, 1975

1. As honorary chairman of the Boys' Clubs of America, I am pleased to participate in this ceremony honoring Kenneth Ivory as the "Boy of the Year."

2. Kenneth, I congratulate you on being selected as the person to represent the over one million members of the Boys' Club. You have distinguished yourself in athletics and student leadership. And I know your home club in Milwaukee and your friends are proud of your accomplishments.
