OUTSTANDING INDIVIDUALS AS KOSCIUSKO (KOSH-CHOOŚ-KO)

AND PULASKI (PU-LAS-KI) .

PEOPLE OF POLISH DESCENT HELPED TO DEVELOP MY OWN

STATE OF MICHIGAN AND OTHER AREAS OF AMERICA. THE POLISH

CAPACITY FOR HARD WORK, POLISH IMAGINATION, AND POLISH

DETERMINATION REBUILT YOUR COUNTRY IN THE LAST THIRTY YEARS.

THESE SAME POLISH QUALITIES HELPED BUILD OUR OWN NATION.

OUR DISCUSSIONS. MR. FIRST SECRETARY. HAVE CONVINCED ME THAT COOPERATION BETWEEN OUR TWO COUNTRIES WILL CONTINUE TO INCREASE. I AM VERY PLEASED THAT THE GOALS FOR THE EXPANSION OF BILATERAL TRADE WHICH WE ESTABLISHED DURING YOUR VISIT TO WASHINGTON ARE EXPECTED TO BE ACHIEVED.

I AM ALSO GRATIFIED THAT OUR COOPERATION IN

SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY HAS CONTINUED TO DEVELOP.

PARTICULARLY IN THE CRUCIAL FIELD OF ENERGY RESEARCH.

WE WILL BOTH ATTEND THE CONFERENCE ON SECURITY

AND COOPERATION IN EUROPE. THIS PROVIDES A FURTHER

OPPORTUNITY TO EXPAND THE FRIENDLY AND CONSTRUCTIVE

RELATIONS BETWEEN OUR TWO COUNTRIES. I AM PLEASED THAT

MY VISIT TO POLAND TOOK PLACE IMMEDIATELY BEFORE THE

HELSINKI CONFERENCE.

THIS MADE IT POSSIBLE FOR US TO BEGIN TO DISCUSS

HOW WE MIGHT BEST IMPLEMENT THE SPIRIT OF HELSINKI. AND

WE ANTICIPATED THE FUTURE BY EXCHANGING IDEAS ON HOW WE

MIGHT BEST REINFORCE THE ATMOSPHERE OF DETENTE IN EUROPE AND

PROMOTE PEACE.

WE THANK YOU, MR. FIRST SECRETARY. AND WE

THANK YOUR ASSOCIATES AND ALL THE POLISH PEOPLE FOR MAKING

OUR VISIT ENJOYABLE AND PRODUCTIVE.
