HIS WORDS AND EXAMPLES ARE A LIVING LEGACY FOR EVERY AMERICAN.

IN DISCUSSING PUBLIC VALUES AND PRINCIPLES,
ALF LANDON ALWAYS HAS MAINTAINED HIS PERSPECTIVE AND
