CONGRESS IN APPROVING THIS LEGISLATION HAS TAKEN

A FUNDAMENTAL STEP TO RESTORE THE LONG-TERM ECONOMIC HEALTH

OF THIS VERY NECESSARY AMERICAN INDUSTRY.

THE REGULATORY REFORM PROVISIONS IN THIS BILL

ARE LONG OVERDUE.

EVERY PRESIDENT SINCE HARRY S. TRUMAN --
