In the Money

Lawyers for multimillionaire George Storer, 74year-old founder of the Storer Broadcasting Co., call the \$2.261 million dollar allmony settlement for his third wife "punitive."

But the Florida court upped all this to a \$2 million settlement, plus \$200,000 legal fees and title to a \$750,000 oceanfront home in Miami.

Sills Recovering

After undergoing an operation for pelvic malignancy, singer Beverly Sills was released from a New York hospital yesterday with the promise that she will be sufficiently well to resume her career by Nov. 20.

Royal Pain

Prince Charles, the 25year-old heir to the British throne, is getting "slightly irritated" by all the publicity given his reported romances.

He said Tuesday in London that he accepted the treatment because he is accustomed to the news media, but he added that "It can make things very difficult" for girl friends.

"It's got nothing to do with anybody else," he said.

"Who I might want to marry or anything like that."

Private Business

Millionaire Ambassador to Great Britain Walter Annenberg left London for home in Philadelphia yesterday in his private jet.

Although he is retiring from government affairs, the 66-year-old Annenberg has "a lot of private business to attend to," a spokesman said. He is considering setting up a school of international communications in either New York or Washington. He already has set up such schools in Pennsyl-

vania and California, where he has homes in both states.

Settling for Less

Martha Mitchell, who is separated from former Attorney General John Mitchell, finds it rough going trying to live on her \$1,000 weekly alimony. She wants \$3.000 a week.

This is the sum she first sought in her separation suit, but Manhattan Supreme Court Justice Manuel Gomez cut down her request by one-third.

Mitchell is currently on trial in Washington in connection with the Watergate coverup.
