For the past three years, No Greater Love has sponsored a Christmas Party with the Redskins for the children of our men who were missing and killed in action.



We plan to have approximately 60 children at this year's party. They would, I'm sure, be thrilled if you could join us.

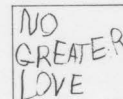

BACKGROUNDER on Redskins-No Greater Love party for children of MIA-KIAs -- Wednesday, Dec. 4, 1974 -- Dulles Airport Holiday Inn

This is the third annual party for these children that the Redskins and No Greater Love have sponsored.

About 60 children have been invited. They are all children of MIAs or KIAs (killed in action) -- most are now KIAs. Their brothers and sisters and mothers will also be attending. They are from the Washington, D.C. area and from the Virginia Beach area.

The Redskins Park is located near the Holiday Inn, and members of the team will be coming after practice. Many have worked with the kids before, as one of the No Greater Love (NGL) programs involves pairing the children and athletes in a Big Brother sort-of-fashion.

**\*\*** No Greater Love stresses strongly that this is a non-profit, totally non-political organization involved strictly in seeing that these children are remembered. It is not involved with the League of Families or VIVA. It is not involved in any type of action to pressure Administration officials in accounting for those still unaccounted for. It's total purpose is "to sponsor programs of friendship and care for children of servicemen missing or killed-in-action."

It is a nationwide program, though parties like this one do not take place everywhere simply because they don't have the funds to staff or organize. It is funded through public donations, though NFL has given a grant for a lot of the cost, and four unions donate office space. They have only one paid employee, a secretary.

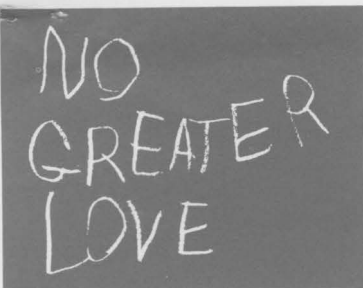

- Watergate Coverup Trial heard tape on which former President Nixon offered to make \$200,000 to \$300,000 in cash available to H. R. Haldeman and John D. Ehrlichman for legal and family expenses when they were leaving the White House.
- The Democrats at their first national non-presidential convention opening Thursday in Kansas City give top priority to developing a program to handle the nation's economic problems.
- Vice President-designate Nelson Rockefeller makes his last appearance before House judiciary committee Thursday. His brother Laurence testified Wednesday he loaned \$35,000 to former Rep. William Miller (R. N.Y.), the candidate for Vice President in 1961, at Nelson's request. Most of it was repaid.
- The Senate approved 46-45 a \$2.67B foreign aid bill which would cut off aid to Turkey in mid-February and sent it to the House.
- The House (by voice vote) agreed President Ford should spend \$540.6 million of the \$657.6 million he sought to cut from the Federal budget. The challenge to his impoundment powers now goes to the Senate.

#### Mrs. Ford Passes Fur-covered Football

Washington (UPI) -- The occasion was Christmas but the theme was football, and First Lady Mrs. Betty Ford scored off the Washington Redskins.

The Redskins, sponsors of the party for 60 children of Washington area servicemen killed or missing in Vietnam, presented Mrs. Ford, the guest of honor, with a football signed by all the members of the team.

Mrs. Ford accepted the ball from defensive end Ron McDole -- at six-foot-four and 265 pounds probably the season's most massive Santa Claus -- and then in a neat hand off, slipped him a fur-covered football.

Maheu**, whom he had fired in 1970, said Hughes, because "he's a no-good, dishonest son of a bitch and he stole me blind." So far, that remark is going to cost Hughes \$2,823,333.30—the amount that a Federal jury in Los Angeles awarded Maheu last week in his defamation suit. Hughes's Summa Corp. plans to appeal and so does Maheu, who wants \$11 million more in punitive dam-ages that were ruled out by the judge.

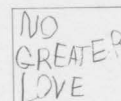

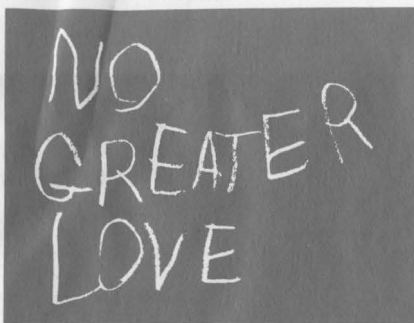

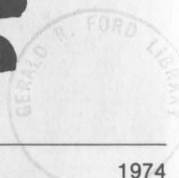

"If I am able to help the children of our men who did not return from Indochina, and our hospitalized veterans, I feel I will be doing something really worthwhile," said Aaron in accepting the presidency of No Greater Love.

## "For a Change" Pilot Program for Paralyzed Vets

At the Bronx VA Hospital on June 5, NGL initiated a new motivational program for paralyzed vets. Called "For a Change," it asks prominent athletes to reverse roles for an afternoon and sit in wheelchairs for sports competition with paralyzed vets. The idea for the program came from vet Peter Arballo, Wheelchair Olympics Gold Medalist, who wanted to do something for his fellow paraplegic veterans. "For a Change" is designed to foster physical activity and involvement among wheelchair vets.

On hand for the Bronx pilot program were three stars of the New York Jets—Steve Tannen, Eddie Bell, and Phil Wise.

Mrs. Helen Springborn, one of the owners of the Jets, visited with patients and presented Jets' autographed footballs to the winners of the wheelchair relay race.

After watching the Jets and veterans compete in wheelchair volleyball, football, and relay races, one patient said, "Maybe I'll try some of that volleyball business tomorrow. Looks like a lot of fun; better than just sittin' around." "That's what the program is all about," a NGL spokesman noted.

NGL plans to make "For a Change" a national program, holding similar sports events throughout the country at VA hospitals which serve spinal cord injury patients.

## How We Started . . .

No Greater Love did not come into existence as an organization until 1971 but the idea behind it was already conceived and growing in 1966.

At that time, Carmella LaSpada, a Special Projects Aide in the White House, arranged an Armed Forces Day party for wounded veterans at Bethesda Naval Hospital in Maryland.

It was such a great success that officials of Walter Reed Army Hospital asked her if she would do the same there. Carmella recalls she went through the amputee ward and asked the boys what they would most like to see. The reply was "pretty girls and athletes." Carmella obliged by getting attractive girl friends, secretaries from Capitol Hill and the White House, and members of the New York Yankees, including Mickey Mantle, to visit the hospital. The program, called V.I.P. (Very Important Patients) developed into weekly events. The athletes of America quickly grasped the opportunity to show their gratitude to the hospitalized veterans with the question, "What else can we do?"

In May 1971, Ms. LaSpada took leave from her government career and along with Johnny Unitas, Ted Williams, and other athletes, organized America's Sports Stars for POWs-MIAs in an effort to secure information about, and provide help for the men held in captivity. Letters from children of these men led to the creation in December 1971 of No Greater Love, a program of friendship and care for the children of POWs-MIAs.

The first year, No Greater Love sent more than 2,000 gifts, wrapped and shipped by Georgetown University student volunteers, to these children. This effort has continued, still with volunteer help.

With the return of our POWs in early 1973, families of those still missing in action asked No Greater Love to continue for the benefit of their children.

In addition, families of men killed in action heard about No Greater Love and asked that the program be expanded to include their children.

The main thrust is to help fill the void left by the absence of the fathers on special occasions such as birthdays and holidays. The program for the hospitalized vets also has continued.

S.J. Res. 227. A joint resolution designating Monday, February 10, 1975, as a day of salute to America's hospitalized veterans. Referred to the Committee on the Judiciary.

Mr. HUGH SCOTT. Mr. President, I am happy today to introduce with the distinguished majority leader (Mr. MANSFIELD), a resolution designating Monday, February 10, as a day of salute to America's hospitalized veterans.

Last year on February 12, the first anniversary of the release of the first group of POWs, an organization named No Greater Love, sponsored the first salute to hospitalized veterans. It was extremely successful, consisting of visits by prominent Americans to the VA hospitals and special activities for paralyzed veterans. As a member of the advisory council of No Greater Love, I have been asked to introduce a resolution proclaiming February 10, 1975 as a salute to these courageous men. The distinguished House majority leader, Mr. O'NEILL and the distinguished house minority leader, Mr. RHODES are introducing today a similar resolution in the House.

I hope this special day will further instill in all Americans a greater understanding and appreciation for what these hospitalized servicemen are going through and will further serve as a focal point for activities in our VA hospitals to honor these outstanding men.

They have given us so much; let us give them at least our time and our support.

Whereas certain organizations sponsor throughout each year for these veterans a series of programs, celebrity visits, and special activities for paralyzed veterans, and formally call the nation's attention to these special Americans, and,

Whereas these servicemen and service-women deserve an annual recognition from the citizens through the United States for the sacrifices they made to help keep America a free country: Now, therefore be it

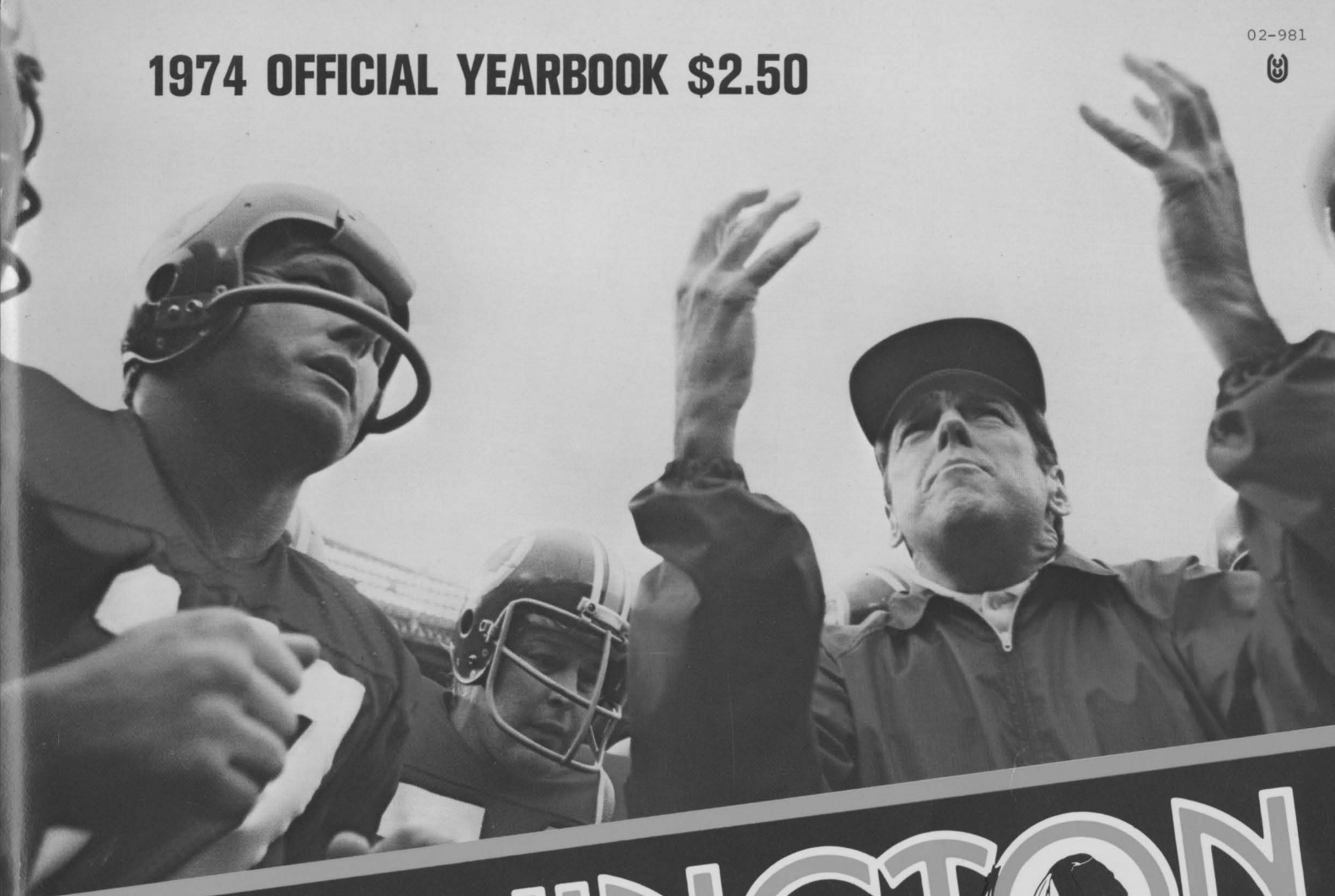
