As I mentioned Michigan State University and East Lansing, a twinkle of neighborliness came into her eyes.

"May I tell the people of Michigan that you are happy to be in the White House?" I asked.

"You certainly may! And give them all my very best wishes," she answered.

I attended a similar function at the White House three years ago, when Pat Nixon was its hostess. It was in January of 1972, just months before the horror of Watergate broke loose, but Mrs. Nixon's demeanor betrayed no hint of what was to come. fabric, with a turquoise print scarve at her neck.
