WASHINGTON (AP) -- WITH PRESIDENT FORD SAYING HE WAS HOPEFUL OF SUCCESS, SECRETARY OF STATE HENRY A. KISSINGER EMBARKED TODAY ON AN "OPEN-ENDED" NEGOTIATING TRIP TO THE MIDDLE EAST.

FORD'S COMMENT CAME AFTER HE AND MRS. FORD WALKED WITH KISSINGER TO HIS LIMOUSINE ON THE WHITE HOUSE SOUTH LAWN AFTER A FINAL CONFERENCE IN THE OVAL OFFICE.

AFTER A KISS FROM MRS. FORD AND A HEARTY HANDSHAKE FROM THE PRESIDENT, KISSINGER HEADED FOR ANDREWS AIR FORCE BASE AND THE FIRST LEG OF HIS JOURNEY TO TRY AND ARRANGE TERMS FOR A BROAD ISRAELI WITHDRAWAL IN THE SINAI.
