Mrs. Sueko Yasukawa, wife of the Japanese Ambassador, is regarded as an accomplished pianist and a good bridge player. The Yasukawas have three children; two teenage daughters in the U.S., and a son studying journalism in Japan. Mrs. Yasukawa is 50 years old and speaks English well.

Mrs. Ei Mori, wife of Mrs. Miki's youngest brother, also acts as Mrs. Miki's personal secretary. She has travelled extensively overseas and speaks fluent English. She is 38 years old. She is fond of pets, particularly dogs.

Mrs. Eleanor Ingersoll, wife of the Deputy Secretary of State, has been married to Robert S. Ingersoll for 37 years. She spent two years in Japan (1971 - 1973) when her husband was the American Ambassador there. Her interests include hospital volunteer work, gardening, golf, tennis, needlework, symphony concerts, and her eight grandchildren. She and her four daughters are graduates of Smith College. She is 60 years old, and grew up in Chicago.
