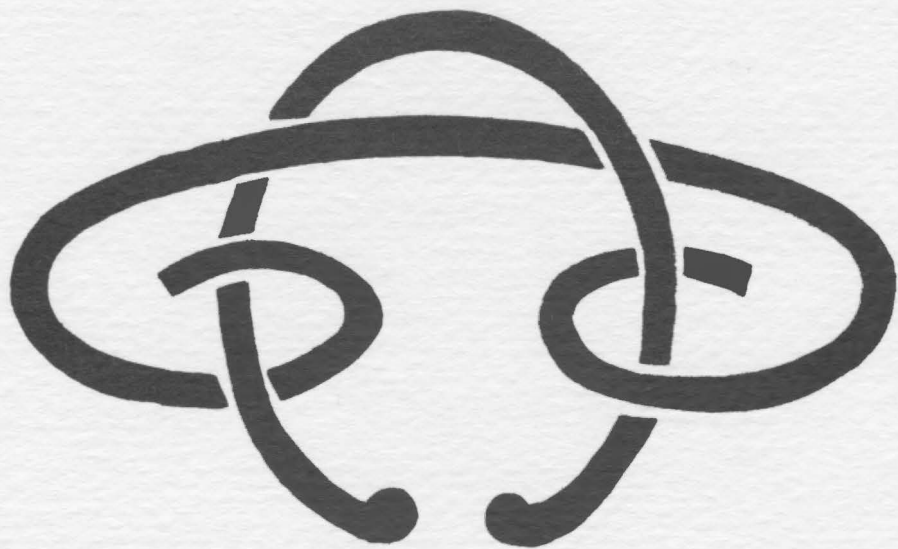


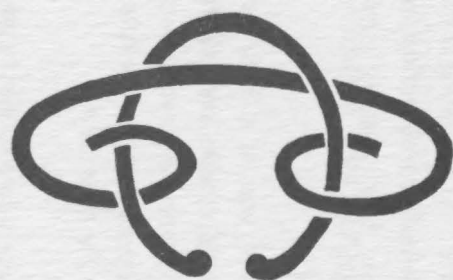

One is the Family Center, an innovative community facility recently established in Washington to work with abused children and their parents. The Center has four programs — hotline crisis counseling, therapeutic day care, multilevel family treatment, and a training program for professionals and para-professionals.

The second recipient is the Children's Hospital Fund for purchase of an EMI scanner — a revolutionary X-ray procedure. The scanner permits a view of the brain and lesions within the brain without the risk and discomfort of the conventional neuroradiological tests and procedures.

The third recipient is the Washington Chapter of Recording for the Blind which we had the pleasure of helping last year. The purpose of this nation-wide non-profit group is to assist students whose visual, perceptual, or physical impairment prevents them from reading.

Because of our affection and admiration for our First Lady, the Congressional Club contributes, in her name, to these three deserving organizations — the Family Center, the Children's Hospital, and the Washington Chapter of Recording for the Blind.

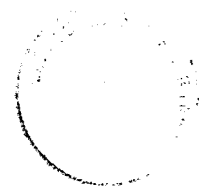

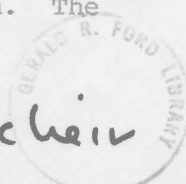

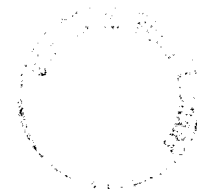

Secretary of State Henry Kissinger slipped away early from a Norwegian state dinner for NATO delegates in Oslo the other evening to visit Norwegian actress Liv Ullmann at her home, according to an Oslo newspaper.

Under the front-page headline, "Nocturnal Summit," it was reported that Kissinger's limousine arrived outside Ullmann's Oslo apartment at 10:30 p.m. and that he stayed almost two hours. He was described as appearing somewhat surprised by the lights and activity outside when he departed.

Kissinger and Ullmann have met several times before at social events in the United States.

More on Kissinger: The New York Times Co. has discussed with him the possibility of his publishing his memoirs in book form and writing a column for its feature service, a Times official said yesterday. He added, "Kissinger said he would not make a decision until he no longer was Secretary of State." The State Department said it had no knowledge of the matter.

Chris English of Washington, whose hobby of riding in airplanes has taken him more than 400,000 miles the last nine years, will be on board the initial commercial Concorde flight to the United States, landing at Dulles on Monday from London. There also will be a simultaneous flight to Dulles from Paris.

English, professing that he wouldn't trade this flight even for his personal record of 184 different flights in three weeks, flew over to London last night so he could take the flight back. He gave the Concorde good grades when he took the first commercial flight from Paris to Rio de Janeiro in January, but his favorite plane is still the almost extinct Convair 990.
