Arson Suspected in 6-Death Fire

PHILADELPHIA — Fire officials suspect arson in a weekend boarding house fire that killed six elderly persons and injured 15 others.

Fire Commissioner Joseph Rizzo said the Saturday night blaze at the Johnson Boarding Home was "of an incendiary nature, suspicious and under continued investigation." Police were questioning an 18-year-old employe of the home.

Rizzo said about 22 elderly persons were in the three-story building at the time of the fire. Five of the dead were found on the floor and a sixth was pronounced dead at a nearby hospital. Five of the injured remained in the hospital.
