CLOTHING NOTES

ALASKA

Fairbanks: There will be a half-hour program in a hangar (temperature: about 30 degrees) immediately upon arrival. You will probably want to wear pants, and you may want some long winters underneath them. Boots or closed, very warm shoes with heavy socks underneath.

Mrs. Ford will then go for two hours and 20 minutes to a nearby house.

Anchorage: Same clothing requirements if you're planning on walking around there. (there are about four hours of personal time.) Dress for evening reception is long and casual (There may be some short cocktail dresses, but on the whole, Alaskans do not dress up very much.)

HAWAII

Temperature had been consistently about 80 degrees, but it is not a hot or muggy 80. One day time dress would probably be required. Long casual dresses and slacks seem to be the generally accepted evening dress. Nights are quite cool, and long sleeves or a warm sweater are needed.
