RULES

of the Republican State Committee

Adopted July 5, 1972

1. MEMBERS. The unit of representation shall be by Assembly District. Members will be chosen from Assembly Districts subject to the following conditions:

A. (1) Where Assembly Districts are coterminous within a county they shall have two members.

(2) Where an Assembly District is made up of two or more whole counties each County shall have two members.

(3) Where an Assembly District is made up of parts of counties or a combination of a whole county or counties and part or parts of another county or counties, each county and part county unit shall have two members.

B. Each member shall be an enrolled voter of the Republican Party within the unit from which each member is elected.

C. Representation by sexes from each unit shall be equal.

2. ELECTION OF MEMBERS. Members shall be elected at primary elections biennially in each even numbered year unless otherwise provided by law. Such election shall be at the Fall primaries except that in a year when electors of a President and Vice-President of the United States are to be elected, such members shall be elected at the Spring primary. Such members shall hold office until the election of their successors, unless otherwise provided by law.

3. ORGANIZATION MEETING. The Committee shall, within fifteen days after its election, meet and organize by the election of officers and for the transaction of such other business as may properly come before the meeting. Such meeting shall be held at such place and at such hour as shall be set forth in the notice of meeting which meeting shall be called by the Secretary of the outgoing Committee.

4. NOTICE OF ORGANIZATION MEETING. Notice of the time and place of the organization meeting shall be served by mailing a notice of meeting to each member not less than five days before such meeting. Such notice shall be directed to each member at his address as it appears on the records of the Committee.

5. MEETINGS. Meetings of the Committee other than the organization meeting, shall be held upon the call of the Chairman, or in the case of vacancy in the Chairmanship, on the call of the Vice Chairman—Party Organization. Upon written petition of forty or more members of the Committee, representing not less than twenty counties, filed jointly or separately in the office of the Chairman, asking for a meeting of the Committee, it shall be the duty of the Chairman within 10 days after receipt of said petition to issue a call for a meeting of the Committee to be held in the City of New York, the date of such meeting to be not later than 20 days or earlier than 10 days from the issuance of the call. In the event that the Chairman shall fail to call such meeting within 10 days after the filing of such petition the same shall be called by the Vice Chairman—Party Organization or Secretary.

6. NOTICE OF MEETING. Notice of the time and place of every meeting other than the organization meeting, shall be served by mailing a notice of meeting to each member not less than three days before such a meeting. Such notice shall be directed to such member at his address as it appears on the records of the Committee.

7. QUORUM. At all meetings of members there shall be present in person or represented by proxy, at least a major-

ity of the members in order to constitute a quorum, and for the purpose of determining whether a quorum is present the officers of the Committee shall be considered as members of the Committee. If a quorum is not present, a less number may adjourn the meeting to some future time, not more than 10 days later.

8. VOTING.

Section I.

State Committee Members representing each Unit of Representation as described in Article I, shall cast the number of votes cast for Governor on the line or column of the Republican Party in the last preceding election from the district or portion thereof which they represent.

Section II.

Nominations for statewide office. Each member of the State Committee shall cast the number of votes cast for Governor on the line or column of the Republican Party in the last preceding election from that portion of the state that he or she represents.

9. PROXIES. Voting by proxy at any meeting of members shall be valid. Proxies shall be in writing and revocable at the pleasure of the person executing the same.

10. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE. The chairman shall appoint an Executive Committee of forty-one members, including two members (one male and one female) from each Judicial District nominated by the members of the State Committee representing the units of representation of said Judicial District, the elected officers of the State Committee, the two members of the National Committee from New York State, the President of the Association of New York State Young Republican Clubs, Inc., the chairman of the Finance Committee and the remaining members at large, including another member of the Finance Committee. If there shall be a vacancy in respect to any member of the Executive Committee originally appointed by the Chairman, the Chairman shall have power to fill such vacancy subject to the foregoing requirements for membership on the Executive Committee. Proxies shall not be valid at meetings of the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee shall elect such officers as it shall deem requisite for the direction of its affairs from its own membership. The Executive Committee shall meet upon the call of its Chairman. In the intervals between meetings of the State Committee, the Executive Committee shall exercise, so far as is consistent with law, all powers of the State Committee. Notice of the time and place of meetings of the Executive Committee shall be given to each member thereof in person or by mail, at least two days before such meeting. If mailed, the notice shall be directed to each member at his address, as it appears on the records of the State Committee. At all meetings of the Executive Committee there shall be present at least a majority of the members thereof in order to constitute a quorum. All questions shall be decided by a majority of the vote of persons present and entitled to vote thereon. If a quorum is not present a less number may adjourn the meeting to some future time not more than 10 days later.

11. OTHER COMMITTEES. There shall be a Finance Committee. Members shall be appointed by the Chairman of the Committee and need not be members of the State Committee. Any funds raised by the Finance Committee shall be for the use of the State Committee or for any other party committee as directed by the State Committee. The Chairman of the State Committee shall appoint the Chairman of the Finance Committee.

The Chairman of the State Committee may appoint special committees, of such number and composed in whole or in part of persons not members of the State Committee, as he may deem advisable. No such committee shall solicit funds or contributions unless duly authorized as provided by law.

12. OFFICERS. The officers of the State Committee shall be a Chairman, a Vice Chairman—Party Organization, a Vice Chairman—Federation Activities, a Secretary, a Treasurer, and such other officers as the Committee shall determine from time to time. Such officers shall be elected by the Committee at its organization meetings; and within 3 days thereafter a certificate stating the names and post office addresses of such officers shall be filed as provided by law. Such officers shall be enrolled voters of the party but need not be members of the Committee. Such officers shall have power to vote on all matters acted upon by the Committee. Each of such officers shall hold his office until his successor is chosen. The officers shall have such authority and perform such duties as may be from time to time authorized or prescribed by the members of the State Committee. Any vacancy occurring among the officers may be filled by appointment by the Chairman, such appointment to continue until the next meeting of the Committee, at which time the Committee shall fill the vacancy by election.

In the event of a vacancy in the position of Chairman, the Vice Chairman—Party Organization shall serve until a new Chairman is elected.

13. REMOVAL. Except as may be otherwise provided by law, a member may be removed by the Committee for disloyalty to the party or corruption in office, after notice and a hearing upon written charges, to be heard by the Committee or a sub-committee appointed for that purpose, which shall report the findings to the full Committee.

14. PRIMARIES. All primaries shall be conducted in accordance with law, rules and regulations of the party in the political sub-divisions in which such primaries are held.

15. CANDIDATES FOR NOMINATIONS. No candidacies for any nomination for public office shall be endorsed by the State Committee.

16. NOMINATIONS FOR SPECIAL ELECTIONS AND FILLING VACANCIES OCCURRING AFTER PRIMARY. Nominations for an office to be filled at a special election or to fill a vacancy in a nomination made at a primary, or a vacancy occurring after the fifth Tuesday preceding the primary election, shall be made in convention by a majority vote or a quorum of the Judicial, Congressional, Senatorial or Assembly Committee members last chosen as provided in Rule 17 for the political subdivision in which such vacancy occurs. If no such District Committee exists for such political subdivision, then said nominations shall be made by a majority vote of a quorum of the Republican County Committee members last elected in said political subdivision. The Chairmen of the County Committees of those Committees included in the political subdivision shall issue a call for such nominating convention.

17. JUDICIAL, CONGRESSIONAL, SENATORIAL AND ASSEMBLY COMMITTEES SHALL HEREAFTER BE CHOSEN AS FOLLOWS: Judicial District Committees shall be comprised of two members from each Assembly District contained within the Judicial District.

However, when a Judicial District is comprised of a part of an Assembly District together with the whole or a part of one or more Assembly Districts, such Judicial District Committee shall be comprised of two members from each whole Assembly District wholly contained within a county, and one member from each portion of an Assembly District comprising either an entire county or portion of a county, contained within said Judicial District. Each unit of representation shall be entitled to cast as many votes as were cast for the Republican candidate for Governor in the last gubernatorial election in said unit of representation.

Congressional District Committees shall be comprised of two members from each County contained within the Congressional District. Each County shall be entitled to cast as many votes as were cast for Republican candidate for Congress in such County in the last preceding Congressional election.

However, when a Congressional District is comprised of a part of a County, together with the whole or a part of one or more other Counties, such Congressional Committee in each County included within the Congressional District, shall be entitled to cast as many votes as were cast for the Republican Candidate for Congress in such County, or portion thereof, in the last preceding Congressional election.

Senatorial District Committees shall be comprised of two members from each County contained within the Senatorial District. Each County shall be entitled to cast as many votes as were cast for Republican candidate for Senate in such County in the last preceding Senatorial election.

However, when a Senatorial District is comprised of a part of a County, together with the whole or a part of one or more other Counties, such Senatorial Committee in each County included within the Senatorial District, shall be entitled to cast as many votes as were cast for the Republican Candidate for Senate in such County, or portion thereof, in the last preceding Senatorial election.

Assembly District Committees shall be created in all cases where Assembly Districts cross county lines. The composition of these committees shall be as follows:

Assembly District Committees shall be comprised of two members from each County contained within the Assembly District. Each County shall be entitled to cast as many votes as were cast for Republican candidate for Assembly in such County in the last preceding Assembly election.

However, when an Assembly District is comprised of a part of a County, together with the whole or a part of one or more other Counties, such Assembly Committee in each County included within the Assembly District, shall be entitled to cast as many votes as were cast for the Republican Candidate for Assembly in such County, or portion thereof, in the last preceding Assembly election.

The members of said committees shall be chosen by the respective county committees in said districts at a meeting prescribed by law for the organization of County Commit-

tees, or failing a choice at said organization meeting, then in accordance with the rules of the County Committee or of the political subdivision involved. In cases where portions of Assembly Districts are entitled to representation on the various committees, the members of the county committee representing that portion shall choose its representative to the respective committees at the same time.

When a Judicial District, Congressional District or Senatorial District is coterminous with or less than the limits of but wholly within an entire city or county, the members of the County Committees, residing in such Judicial District, Congressional District or Senatorial District shall constitute the Judicial District, Congressional District or Senatorial District Committee, or as provided for by the County Committee rules of said County.

18. STATE CONVENTIONS. The following shall be the basis of representation in future State Conventions: Each County shall be entitled to one delegate and one additional delegate for each 2500 votes or major fraction thereof cast for the Republican candidate for Governor at the election at which a Governor was elected next preceding such convention. However, in Counties having one or more whole Assembly District, and in Counties having in addition thereto part of one or more other Assembly Districts: Each whole Assembly District shall be entitled to one delegate and one additional delegate for 2500 votes or major fraction thereof cast for the Republican candidate for Governor at the election at which a Governor was elected next preceding such convention and each portion of an Assembly District within such County shall be entitled to one delegate and one additional delegate for each 2500 votes or major fraction thereof cast for the Republican candidate for Governor at the election at which a Governor was elected next preceding such convention. Each unit shall be entitled to one alternate for each of its delegates. The time, subject to the limitations provided by law, and the place of meeting of the State Convention shall be fixed by the State Committee.

19. JUDICIAL CONVENTIONS. The following shall be the basis of representation in future Judicial Conventions:

First District	Sixth District
Second District	Ninth District
Fifth District	Tenth District
Eleventh District	

Each Assembly District or appropriate portion thereof elects one delegate and one additional delegate for each 2,500 votes or major fraction thereof cast for the Republican candidate for Governor at the last Gubernatorial election.

Third District Fourth District

Each Assembly District or appropriate portion thereof elects one delegate and an additional delegate for each 4,000 votes or major fraction thereof, cast in such district for the Republican candidate for Governor at the last Gubernatorial election.

Seventh District Eighth District

Each Assembly District or appropriate portion thereof elects one delegate and an additional delegate for each 5,000 votes or major fraction thereof, cast in such district for the Republican candidate for Governor at the last Gubernatorial election.

However, delegates and alternates to Judicial District conventions shall be elected from counties or portions of counties in all cases where Assembly Districts are not wholly contained within a county.

20. VACANCIES. In case of the death, declination, disqualification, removal from district or removal from office of a member, or the failure to elect a member, as by reason of a tie vote, the vacancy created thereby shall be filled by the remaining members of the Committee by the selection of an enrolled voter of the party qualified for election from the unit of representation as to which such vacancy shall have occurred, except as may otherwise be provided by law.

21. AMENDMENTS. These rules or any of them may be altered, amended, added to or repealed or new rules may be adopted by the vote of a majority of the members at any organization meeting, or at a special meeting if notice thereof is given in the notice of said special meeting as provided by the Election Law.

22. ADDITIONAL RULES. The rules of the Assembly of the State of New York shall govern in all meetings of the Committee in so far as they are applicable and not inconsistent with these rules.

23. COMMITTEES AS REQUIRED UNDER SECTION 137 OF THE ELECTION LAW. The Committees shall be the same as provided for under Rule 17 of these rules in all instances where the public office to be filled is not wholly contained within a county. This rule shall not apply to the city of New York.

Buckley, Peyser to Square Off

Sen. James Buckley is expected today to receive the backing of the Republican Party for his reelection bid, a free lunch, courtesy of Vice President Rockefeller, and a stinging attack from his only primary challenger, Westchester Rep. Peter Peyser.

Buckley and Peyser will address the Republican State Committee before the members vote on their choice, and Peyser promises to give "a hardhitting talk on what Buckley's nomination would mean to the future of the Republican Party."

"I will ask the members: 'How can the party endorse a man who won't back President Ford and who says he will run as a conservative if he doesn't get Republican backing,'" said Peyser.

Bronx County Republican Chairman Sen. John Calandra

said he did not expect Peyser to get the necessary 25% of the vote to put his name on the primary ballot, "but anything's possible."

He will probably get a sprinkling of support from some upstate committeemen who are unhappy with the lack of cooperation from the Conservative Party," said Calandra. They are concerned, he said, because the Conservatives are endorsing Democrats in some of the races.

Peyser said that even if he does not get the necessary num-

ber to get on the ballot he has already begun circulating petitions to get the 20,000 signatures that will put him in the primary race.

Following the committee meeting, the luncheon, at which Rockefeller will be host, will be held in the Starlight Roof of the Waldorf-Astoria.

A high spot of the day will be the "Salute to Women" dinner 7 p.m. at which first lady Betty Ford and Republican National Committee Chairman Mary Louise Smith will be honored.

Kojak went to court in England yesterday and The London Daily Mail lost \$59,500.

Actor Telly Savalas had sued the British tabloid for defamation of character after the paper printed a story claiming that a wild night out had left him unable to remember lines in front of the camera.

The Mail's publisher, Associated Newspapers, did not try to justify the report and apologized in court to the 54-year-old actor. But defense lawyer Richard Hartley contended Savalas suffered no damage from the report.

"The article had as much effect on you as a paper dart would have on an express train," Hartley told Savalas, and claimed the piece was written in a spirit of charity.

If that was an example of (the author's) spirit of charity," Judge Melford Stevenson said, "one shudders to think what might have appeared if he was really trying to be nasty."

In other news of the courts, domestic this time, singer Diana Ross announced yesterday in New York that she has filed for divorce from her husband of 5½ years, Robert Silberstein.

The couple, who have three daughters, were reported to have worked out the divorce agreement and are "still friendly" according to Michael

Roshkind, vice-chairman of the board of Motown Industries.

Still another legal note: Actress Stella Stevens was two weeks late in filing a \$7-million invasion-of-privacy suit against Playboy magazine for publishing a nude photo of her, a Los Angeles judge ruled. The photograph, in the January, 1974 issue, showed her reclining on a couch her eyes crossed and her tongue sticking out. It had been shot in a session for a January 1960 issue and was run in a 20-year survey of centerfold playmates.

In other news of the flesh, Raquel Welch went topless in Baltimore Sunday night, something she has never done in her films. But it wasn't on purpose.

While hoofing her way through "Jazzman," a tribute to the '30s at Painters Mill Music Fair, something slipped in Welch's tassled hot pink costume and it slid to her waist.

The music stopped. The audience remained silent.

Welch readjusted her costume and gasped: "This has never happened before. Well, at least I didn't let myself down."

The mother of the future king of Belgium left Washington yesterday af-

ter a three-day visit in which she was virtually incognito.

Princess Paola, who is the sister-in-law of Belgium's King Baudouin, came to attend the opening of Belgium's famed Ballet of the 20th Century at Wolf Trap Farm Park on Monday night. Yesterday she was guest of honor at a garden party luncheon at the Lowell Street home of Charge d'Affairs Alfred Cahen in the absence of Belgian Ambassador and Mrs. Willy Van Cauwenberg, who are back in Belgium on home leave.

Princess Paola is the wife of Prince Albert, younger brother of King Baudouin. Since the king and his brother Albert are near the same age, and the king, after 16 years of marriage, has no children, the son of Prince Albert is now regarded as the heir to the throne of Belgium. He is Prince Philippe, now 16.

First Lady Betty Ford will fly to New York Thursday to attend two campaign fund-raising events. Dr. Sarah Kerr Myers has become the first woman director of the 124-year-old American Geographical Society. The marriage next Saturday in Sweden of King Carl XVI Gustav to West German commoner Silvia Sommerlath will cost the royal court and taxpayers an estimated \$1.3 million dollars.
