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

It is not necessary to play the Anthems at strictly social functions or at formal luncheons and dinners, as awkward situations and inconveniences may result. It is not the custom in Washington, D.C. to play the National Anthems at State Dinners or Luncheons. When the Anthems are played at events,

it is customary to play the Anthem of the visitor's country first, then the National Anthem of the

United States.

FLAGS:

When the flags of the United States and the visitor's country are used, consider the area where the flags are to be placed as a stage or focal point, then place the flag of the United States on the left as viewed from the audience, and the visitor's flag

on the right.

PRIME MINISTER AND MRS. MIKI'S

PREFERENCES ON FOOD AND DRINK

I. Prime Minister:

- A. Prefers Japanese to Western food. He also likes Chinese food.
- B. The Prime Minister enjoys noodles and in particular "soba" (buckwheat noodles). "Gomoku-sushi" (boiled vinegared rice mixed with vegetables and fish) and "sekihan" (rice steamed together with red beans) are among the favorites. As for "sashimi" (raw fish), he prefers white meat. He also enjoys mussels, including soft "ear shells."
- C. Western food: The Prime Minister prefers thinly-cut and smaller portions of meat rather than large steaks. Chicken and small fowl (and, in particular, the latter such as quail) are also preferred. He does not like lobster, but is fond of shrimp. He is not fond of fresh salad with the exception of fresh asparagus.
- D. Fruit: The Prime Minister likes all fruits with fresh grapefruit and honeydew cantelope as his favorites.
- E. The Prime Minister does not drink, but will occasionally take a sip of beer or wine.
- F. The favorite drink of the Prime Minister is Japanese tea, having no preference of any particular brand.
- G. Does not smoke except for Kent filters.

II. Mrs. Miki:

- A. No particular preferences but it is better to avoid foods with strong odors such as garlic, red pepper, and green peppers.
- B. She does not drink carbonated beverages such as beer, champagne, 7-Up, Coca-Cola, etc. She will occasionally drink a little of alcoholic beverages, but does not smoke.
