COMMENTS: Prior to attending the opening performance of the Royal Danish Ballet, Queen Margrethe II and her husband, His Royal Highness the Prince of Denmark, will host a dinner aboard their royal yacht. Although Mrs. Ford will not attend the dinner, en route to the Kennedy Center arriving at the Washington Navy Yard around 7:50, she will board the yacht for a few minutes at the conclusion of their dinner and then she and the Queen and her husband will ride together to the Kennedy Center. Because the Queen is the hostess for the evening and Mrs. Ford will be attending at her invitation, I would presume Mrs. Ford would ride in the Queen's car. I understand the ballet itself is long (3 hours). The Queen will host a reception following the performance in the Atrium of the Kennedy Center. Mrs. Ford, however, will not attend the reception. I understand Sue Davis (O: 338-5704; H: 244-4652) will do the advance.



Queen Margrethe and Prince Henrik are visiting the United States to honor our Bicentennial year--from May 9th to June 1st. They are participating in programs marking the Bicentennial and will visit Washington, D. C. plus 11 states, Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands. The Royal Danish Ballet is one of a large number of contributions Denmark is making to our Bicentennial.

- Take position just inside door of East Room ... Ambassador Catto will present your guests.
- After receiving line, follow guests into State Dining Room.

Luncheon:

- Round tables
- No press coverage of the luncheon ... toasts will be piped to the press ... transcripts will be released to the press ... there will be mini-camera coverage of the toasts with a small photo pool.

After Luncheon:

- 2:00 p.m. ... guests proceed to parlors for demitasse, liqueurs, and cigars. You and Mrs. Ford will escort Queen Margrethe II and Prince Henrik to the Blue Room where you will visit informally with your guests.

Departure:

The President and Mrs. Ford are hosting a luncheon honoring Queen Margrethe II of Denmark and Prince Henrik Tuesday, May 11 at 12:30 p.m. The Queen is on a private visit to honor the American bicentennial.

Mrs. Ford has selected a spring garden theme, reflecting the Danish love of flowers. One of the favorite Danish flowers, freesia, will be featured in the table bouquets of iris, tulips, violets, lilies of the valley, miniature carnations, bachelor buttons and broom. These informal, free-style bouquets of wild and cultivated flowers will be in baskets. Azaleas and roses in shades of red and white will decorate the foyer and the cross-hall to honor the red and white of the Danish flag.

The ficus trees on the State Floor will have ivy planted at the bases. Ivy will also be used around the napkins along with a spray of lilies of the valley.

The round tables will be draped with tableclothes of yellow. Tables will be set with the Johnson china, the King Charles silver and Morgantown crystal.

Flowers in the State Floor Parlors will be matched to the historic period of the rooms. For example, urns will be filled with flowers in the Red Room in keeping with early 19th century custom. These decorations are patterned after paintings from the era.

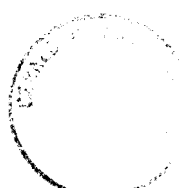
Mrs. Jody Shoemaker of the Winthur Museum in Delaware and Ms. Jeanne Shanks of the Philadelphia Museum of Art have donated their personal time to coordinate the decorations. Both specialize in historic flower arranging, which matches the flowers, containers and style of arrangement to the period of the room.

Included among the guests are many Americans of Danish descent.

The menu: Lobster with Remoulade Sauce; Roast Saddle of Lamb; Almond Potatoes; Parmesan Asparagus; Bibb Lettuce Salad; Danish Bleu Cheese Mousse; Glace Praline; Petits Fours; Demitasse.

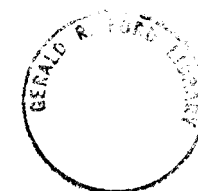

WHITE HOUSE ANNOUNCEMENT OF LUNCHEON FOR QUEEN MARGRETHE II

President and Mrs. Ford will give a luncheon at the White House in honor of Her Majesty Queen Margrethe II of Denmark and His Royal Highness Prince Henrik on Tuesday, May 11, 1976. As announced by the Government of Denmark last November, Her Majesty will be paying a visit to the United States during May on the occasion of the US Bicentennial year. Following their stay in Washington, Queen Margrethe II and Prince Henrik will travel extensively throughout the United States.

\* \* \* \*

Q: Will the President also have a substantive meeting with the Queen?

A: No meeting apart from the luncheon is planned. The Queen is in the United States on a visit in connection with our Bicentennial celebration as indicated in the announcement. The President wanted to take the opportunity afforded by her presence in the United States to host a luncheon in her honor.

Q: What is the Queen's role in Danish political system?

A: The Queen is the Head of State. Denmark is<sup>a</sup> constitutional monarchy in which we understand the Queen has largely ceremonial duties. In consultation with Parliamentary leaders, she appoints the Prime Minister.

Q: How long has Margrethe been Queen?

A: Her Majesty ascended the throne on January 14, 1972, on the death of her father, King Frederik IX.



The President and Mrs. Ford are hosting a luncheon honoring Queen Margrethe II of Denmark and Prince Henrik Tuesday, May 11 at 12:30 p.m. The Queen is on a private visit to honor the American bicentennial.

Mrs. Ford has selected a spring garden theme, reflecting the Danish love of flowers. One of the favorite Danish flowers, freesia, will be featured in the table bouquets of iris, tulips, violets, lilies of the valley, miniature carnations, bachelor buttons and broom. These informal, free-style bouquets of wild and cultivated flowers will be in baskets. Azaleas and roses in shades of red and white will decorate the foyer and the cross-hall to honor the red and white of the Danish flag.

The ficus trees on the State Floor will have ivy planted at the bases. Ivy will also be used around the napkins along with a spray of lilies of the valley.

The round tables will be draped with tableclothes of yellow. Tables will be set with the Johnson china, the King Charles silver and Morgantown crystal.

Flowers in the State Floor Parlors will be matched to the historic period of the rooms. For example, urns will be filled with flowers in the Red Room in keeping with early 19th century custom. These decorations are patterned after paintings from the era.

Mrs. Jody Shoemaker of the Winthur Museum in Delaware and Ms. Jeanne Shanks of the Philadelphia Museum of Art have donated their personal time to coordinate the decorations. Both specialize in historic flower arranging, which matches the flowers, containers and style of arrangement to the period of the room.

Included among the guests are many Americans of Danish descent.
