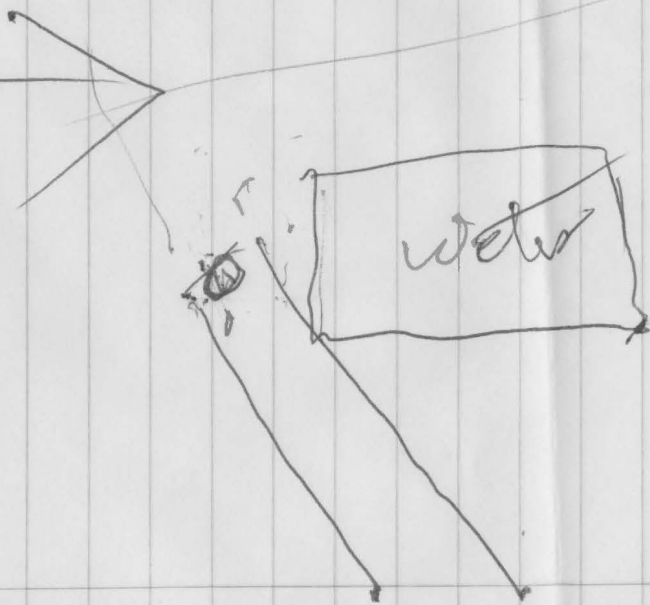

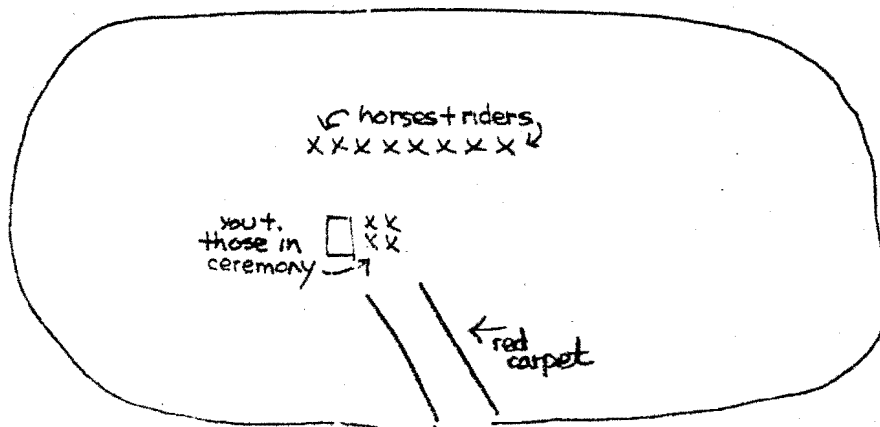

Mr. Sundlun, who will be sitting near you, will let you know when it's time to go down to the ring. When you get there, you'll be met by:

Mr. and Mrs. J. Richard Grieb (He is president of Smirnoff Beveridges and will present the replica of the Presidents Cup in the ceremonies).

The four of you will walk out to the edge of a red carpet, where there will be a table with the trophies set up on it. The eight participants will be lined up in front of you, on their horses.



10-ish The announcer will tell who the winner is. That person will dismount and walk toward you, and Mr. Sundlun will hand you the cup to give to the winner.

note: Both the audience and photographers will be especially interested, and if it seems appropriate to turn with the winner so that spectators on both sides of the ring can see, it would probably be appreciated.

Mr. Grieb will then present the replica to the winner (the trophy the winner gets to keep) and a black velvet cooler to the horse. The national anthem of the winner's country will then be played.

option: if you feel like it, you might want to take Mr. Sundlun and walk past the runners-up to congratulate them (not necessary, but might be a nice touch -- the only thing is, you might want to see how grungy the ring is by that time.)

10:10- Mr. Sundlun will stand with you and the Budweiser Hitch
ish will make its entrance and come over and pick you up. You and the driver (Walt Brady -- he's driven it for 34 years) and a dalmation would then make a figure eight around the ring.

10:20- Mr. Sundlun will meet you when the ride is over and help

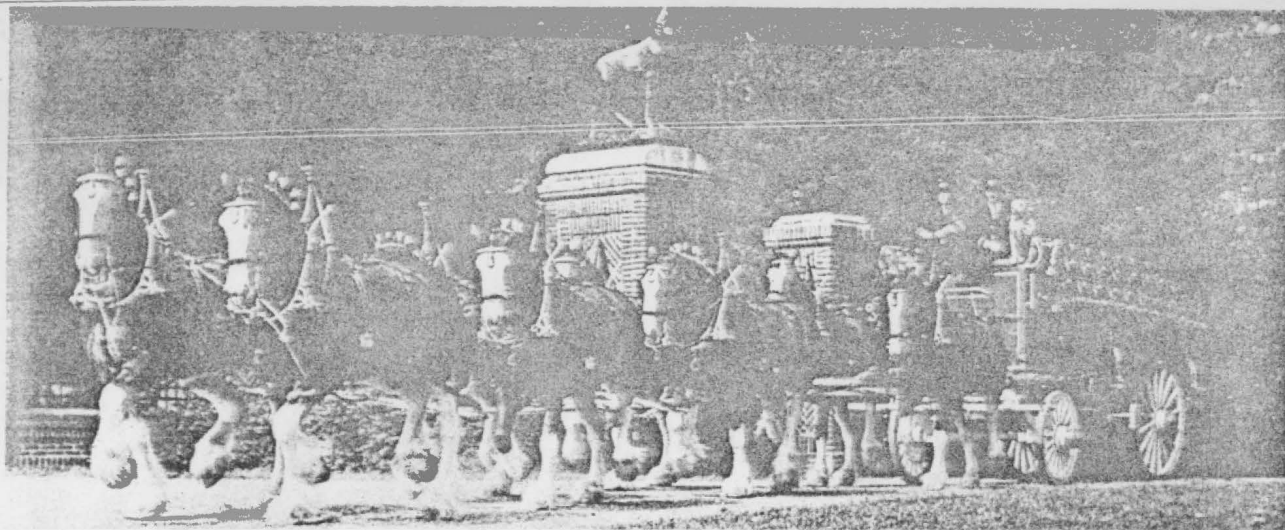

THE BUDWEISER HITCH

The world-famous Budweiser Clydesdales will perform every night during the Washington International Horse Show. This replica of the coaches and teams that were once familiar to everyone now thrills spectators across the country. With thundering hooves and jangling harness, the team will exhibit the breathtaking maneuvers once necessary for pulling a delivery wagon.

Noted for their gentleness, even tempers and intelligence, these tremendous horses remain well-behaved even in the thickest traffic. Their driver, Mr. Walt Brady, has also trained hard for years to handle the

team so skillfully. To have individual control of each horse, he holds four reins laced through his fingers of each hand. The harness is entirely handmade and costs ten thousand dollars. Once bought by Budweiser in Scotland (their homeland) and Canada, the horses are now bred and trained on the company's own farm in St. Louis. It is fortunate that the Clydesdales are so willing to cooperate for each averages about eighteen hand (or six feet at the shoulder), weight around 2,000 pounds, and wears shoes weighing nearly five pounds a piece.

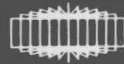

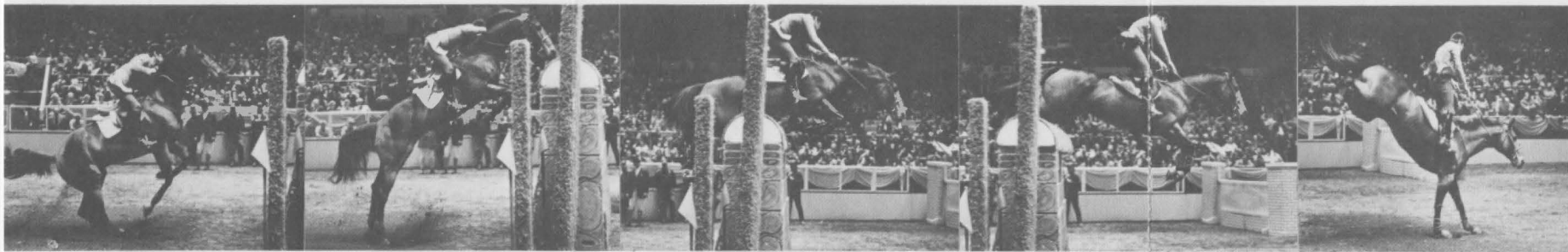

In the thrilling, suspense-filled international jumping classes, featured at each evening performance, riders from as many as nine countries—Argentina, Canada, France, Germany, Great Britain, Ireland, Italy, Puerto Rico, and the United States—are expected to compete for jumper supremacy in stirring, Olympic-style events.

The top-ranked show jumper rider, Rodney Jenkins, on the remarkable all-time top money-winner Idle Dice, Michelle McEvoy aboard her dazzling chestnut Sundancer, and U.S. team captain Frank Chapot will be among those striving for the coveted titles.

Be a part of the action. Even if you've never sat on a horse, you can have a hand in choosing the blue ribbon winners in the glittering saddle horse division. The five-gaited high steppers actually respond to your ovations as they "rack on" to victory. Pick your favorite—then cheer him on to win!

For the many youngsters who will be riding, competing in the National is the culmination of years of trials, of hours upon hours of gruelling training for both themselves and their mounts. But victory in the "finals" is a reality for only a few—particularly the winners of the Maclay (Sunday afternoon) and Good Hands (Saturday afternoon) trophies. See this equitation at its finest, when one perhaps imperceptible flaw means instant elimination for most, and the perfect ride achieves the pinnacle of success in this demanding sport.

In the hunter classes, held during the daytime performances, only the cream of the country's top horses are invited to negotiate the National's complex courses of gates, stone walls, and picket fences—obstacles similar to those that would be found on a real chase.

Always popular are the jumper competitions—especially the Gambler's Choice (Saturday evening) when

riders must make split second changes in their jumping strategy—a 60-second shot at ten jumps which can be taken in either direction and in any order. The clock never stops running, and the winner is decided on the most points in the fastest time.

Will there be another record-breaking jump over the Great Wall? (Thursday evening) Can another horse beat Sympatico's record-shattering victory?

The brilliant hackney ponies, the exhibition of carriages, the Parade of Champions, and the spirited bands such as the New York City Police Department's Emerald Society are just some of the features that make the 1974 National an attraction for the entire family.

You, too, can own a champion show horse

An annual highlight of the National Horse Show is the Arabian Horse contest which offers free, a champion Arabian show horse. This year's prize, Erkavim, a grey gelding and Legion of Merit winner, who will be given away at the final performance on Nov. 12. Entry blanks are available in the lobby of Madison Square Garden throughout the run of the Show.

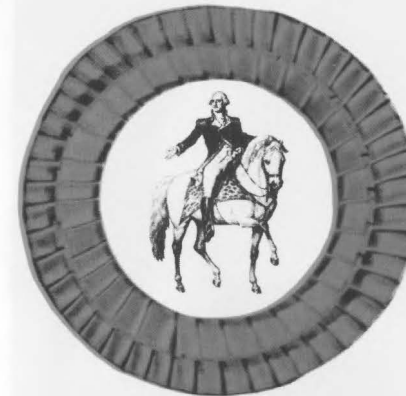

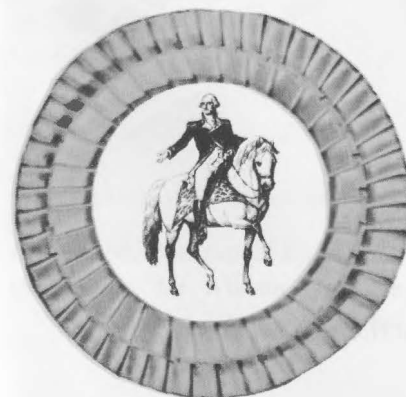

"Eyes That Others Might See"

The Washington International Horse Show Association, Ltd. is honored to be able to present the Opening Night of its 1974 Show for the benefit of the Lions of District 22-C and District 24-A Eye Bank and Research Foundation, Inc.

In accordance with the People-to-People Sports Committee objectives, The Lions Eye Bank, since its establishment in 1957, has supplied Corneal Tissue to Doctors in virtually all free countries in the World for use in operations to restore sight.

The Lions of District 22-C, Eye Bank and Research Foundation, Inc. was organized in 1957 to fill the need in the Washington Metropolitan Area for an agency to support local Ophthalmologists in the obtaining of Corneal Tissue. This tissue is used to restore sight impaired or lost because of corneal disorders. The Eye Bank fills its function by processing the desires of individuals to donate their eyes after death for transplantation to restore the sight of an individual in need.

District 24-A is also participating in the Horse Show this year along with District 22-C. Founded in 1956 as the Hunt Memorial, it was incorporated in 1961 into the Old Dominion Eye Bank and Research, Inc.

Donors are increasingly needed due to the fact that more Ophthalmologists are entering the field of eye surgery. Individuals are beginning to have the recommended eye examinations every two years and the availability of tissue permits the increase in cases of surgery where such an operation might prove successful in returning or giving sight to one who has been blind.

Methods of preservation have been improved to permit the banking of tissue for specific types of operations. Corneal material received is continuing to be used in the research program of attempting to pin-point the causes of blindness with the expectation that success in this program would open the door to development of cures for some types of blindness.

A further service of the Eye Bank is to provide a link in the chain of Eye Banks throughout the World in which Ham Radio Operators, Commercial Airlines, Ophthalmologists and Medical Doctors continue their efforts in seeing that necessary Corneal Tissue is furnished whenever needed.

The Eye Bank research is conducted with the objective to seek the causes of and to develop the cures for blindness. Basic research in Corneal Preservation has enabled the development of a supply of Corneal Tissue to meet needs as they occur. Improved means of transporting eye tissue have been discovered, better operating techniques have been adopted, and refined surgical instruments have been developed, all of which improvements have contributed to the increasing success with Corneal Transplant Operations.

The miracle of sight for thousands of blind people throughout the World has become a reality. If the answers are to be found that will help to lift the curtain of darkness for millions of blind persons who cannot be helped by Corneal Transplants, we must continue and accelerate our full cooperation, support and financial backing to those dedicated individuals who comprise the Lions of District 22-C and 24-A Eye Bank and Research Foundation, Inc.

Following the Show

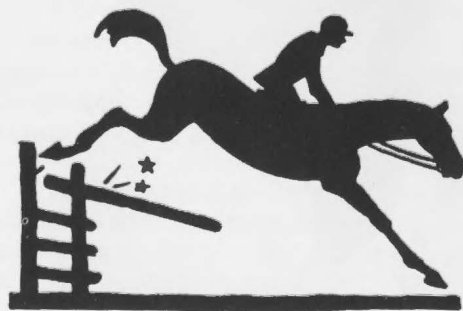
Horse Shows, like all sports, can be more enjoyable if one has a basic understanding of the terms and general rules. The heading above each class gives the specifications followed by a list of the contestants. A number is assigned each horse for the entire show. More information on each entry can be found in the Index of Horses where the full name, registration number, color, height, age and classes entered are listed. Abbreviations for colors are: Bay, B; Black, Blk; Buckskin, Bk; Brown, Br; Chestnut, Ch; Dun, D; Grey, Gr; Palomino, Pal; Roan, Rn; Sorrel, S; Spotted, Sp. The height of the horse is measured in hands—one hand equaling four inches. After a horse becomes ten years of age, it is listed as Aged.

In Hunter and Jumper classes, a course is simply a collection of obstacles arranged in such a manner as to test the ability of the horse. The height and spread (width) of the fences along with their placement determine the degree of difficulty. In spread jumps two or more sets of standards are used and the space between each set determines the width.

On the completion of each class, ribbons are awarded to the first six to eight horses, with a blue ribbon for first; red, second; yellow, third; white, fourth; pink, fifth; green, sixth; purple, seventh; and brown, eighth. General terms in the specifications of the classes include: (a) halter or model classes—equine "beauty contest" with no performance; (b) amateur classes—open to amateur riders only; (c) open classes—for all riders, amateur or professional; (d) the stake classes—the most important event of the division. Listed below are the various types of horses shown at the Washington International and a description of how faults are scored.

THE APPALOOSA

The Appaloosa breed, descended from the mounts of similar coloring brought to this country by the Spanish Conquistadores, was developed and refined by the Nez Perce Indians of the Pacific Northwest. Today the Appaloosa retains the hardiness of bone and muscle and the even temperament for which they were prized by the Indians. The Appaloosa became quite rare in the early 20th century. In the 1920's it was revived by breeders and spread to the midwest. We now find the "raindrop" horses from coast to coast. Crossbreeding, particularly with quarter horses and thoroughbreds, is also practiced. The breed's physical characteristics include pink skins, white coats with varied patterns of black spots, striped hooves and a white ring around the eyes. Although primarily used as stock horses, the Appaloosa can now be seen jumping in the show ring and in the hunting field.

THE ARABIAN

Arabians were ancient warrior horses of the Near East—bred in the desert sand of Arabia 1,000 years before the birth of Christ. Their great beauty is denoted by their bold dark eyes and tiny ears. The Arabian is reputed to be the foundation stock for the majority of light-horse breeds of today, and has been used over the centuries to refine each. His most famous descendent is the Thoroughbred. The Arabian is noted for great soundness of wind and limb, freedom from leg ailments and extreme endurance, plus the ability to thrive even under adverse conditions. He has a friendly and docile disposition, is very versatile and is a good family horse.

The Arabians are shown three ways: as pleasure horses under English tack, pleasure horses under Western tack and as park or "showy" horses under English tack. In the pleasure classes manners and suitability are emphasized whereas in the park horse classes brilliance is emphasized by showing off the horse to the utmost.

THE HUNTER

A Hunter is a horse of any breed which is schooled to carry an individual cross-country over many types of obstacles such as those found in the hunting field while following a pack of hounds.

A Hunter may clear all of the obstacles in the show ring and still not be "in the ribbons." Foxhunters should gallop over the course at an even pace—jumping should not be too high nor pace too fast or too slow—with long easy strides and without excessive motion. A Hunter should approach every fence perfectly straight and jump in stride without hesitation, land and "get away" all in one motion and proceed to the next obstacle. A Hunter should have good manners (easy control) and a smooth even performance.

The Hunters shown at the Washington International are classified as:

Amateur-Owner Hunters

A Hunter that is ridden by the owner who is an amateur horseman or an amateur member of the owner's immediate family. Judged on performance and soundness with emphasis on manners. Fences at 3'6".

Conformation Hunters

Judged not only on performance but also on conformation—or build and general appearance—the beauty contest of the Hunters. Fences at 4'.

Green Hunters

A Green Hunter is a horse of any age that is in his first or second year of showing. Fences are set at 3'6".

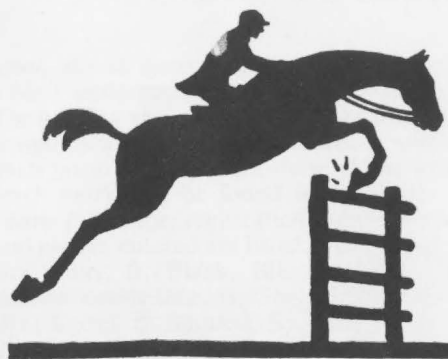

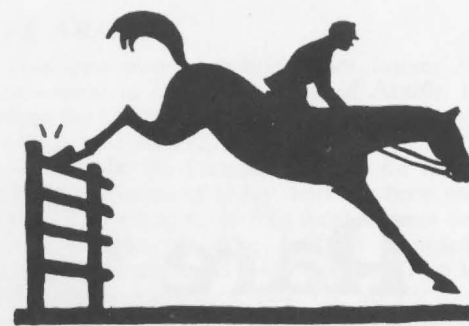

for first year horses and 3'9" for second year horses. Due to the inexperience (or "greenness") a Green Hunter is not required to gallop in under saddle classes.

Regular Working Hunters

Judged on performance and soundness over 4' fences and on the flat. The Working Hunter division is open to both amateur and professional riders. In under saddle classes, the Regular Working Hunter must gallop.

THE JUMPERS

A Jumper can be a horse of any age or breed. Jumpers are classified as to the prize money they have won. An Intermediate Jumper is a horse that has won less than \$3,000 in jumper classes since March 1, 1969. An Amateur-Owner Jumper is a horse that is ridden by the amateur-owner or amateur rider of the owner's immediate family. An Open Jumper is a horse that has won \$3,000 or more in jumper competitions since March 1, 1969. However, any horse, regardless of money won, is eligible to compete in the Open Jumper section.

Jumper Faults

The Intermediate Jumpers, Amateur-Owner Jumpers and Junior Jumpers are scored under the *American Horse Shows Association* rules. In classes where touches count, a touch with any portion of the horse's body behind the stifle (hindquarters or back leg portion), ½ fault; in front of the stifle, 1 fault; touch of stand or wing, 1 fault; touch of flags, starter or markers, 1 fault. A knockdown counts 4 faults. The first refusal counts 3 faults, the second refusal, 6 faults and the third refusal results in elimination. Further explanation will be given in the specifications listed for each class.

The International-Open Jumper section is scored

under the *Federation Equestre Internationale (FEI)*, the governing body of all international equestrian events. Table A: First refusal, 3 faults; second refusal, 4 faults; third refusal, elimination; obstacle knocked down or one or more feet in water or on marking strip of water jump, 4 faults; fall or horse and/or rider or both, 8 faults; exceeding the time allowed for each second commenced, ¼ fault.

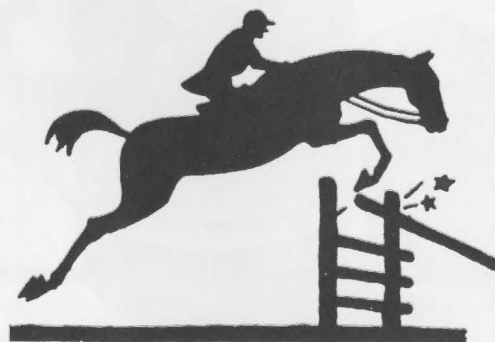
Table B: Faults are scored in seconds. Knockdown, 10 seconds; refusal plus knocking down an obstacle, 6, 8, or 10 seconds; exceeding the time allowed for each second commenced, 2 seconds; third refusal, elimination.

Table C: Scored in seconds added to the time of the round.

Further explanation will be given in the specifications listed for each class.

THE WESTERN HORSE

The Western Horse may be of any breed or combination of breeds. Among these are the Arabian, Appaloosa and Quarter Horse, as well as Morgans, Pintos and crossbreeds. They are not required to be registered in any stud book. They are shown under western tack. As a Pleasure Horse, they are shown at the walk, jog and lope. The walk should be free moving and ground covering with good engagement of the hind quarters. The jog should be smooth, comfortable and without restraint. The lope should be free and ground-covering with a long, low stride. A full mane is not required. Stock horses are shown under the conditions required to successfully move stock or cattle. They must turn and stop readily and have smooth, easy gaits. Gymkhana events are speed events which show the versatility and maneuverability of the mount. In this show the gymkhana events are the race events such as the pole bending, barrel racing and stump racing.

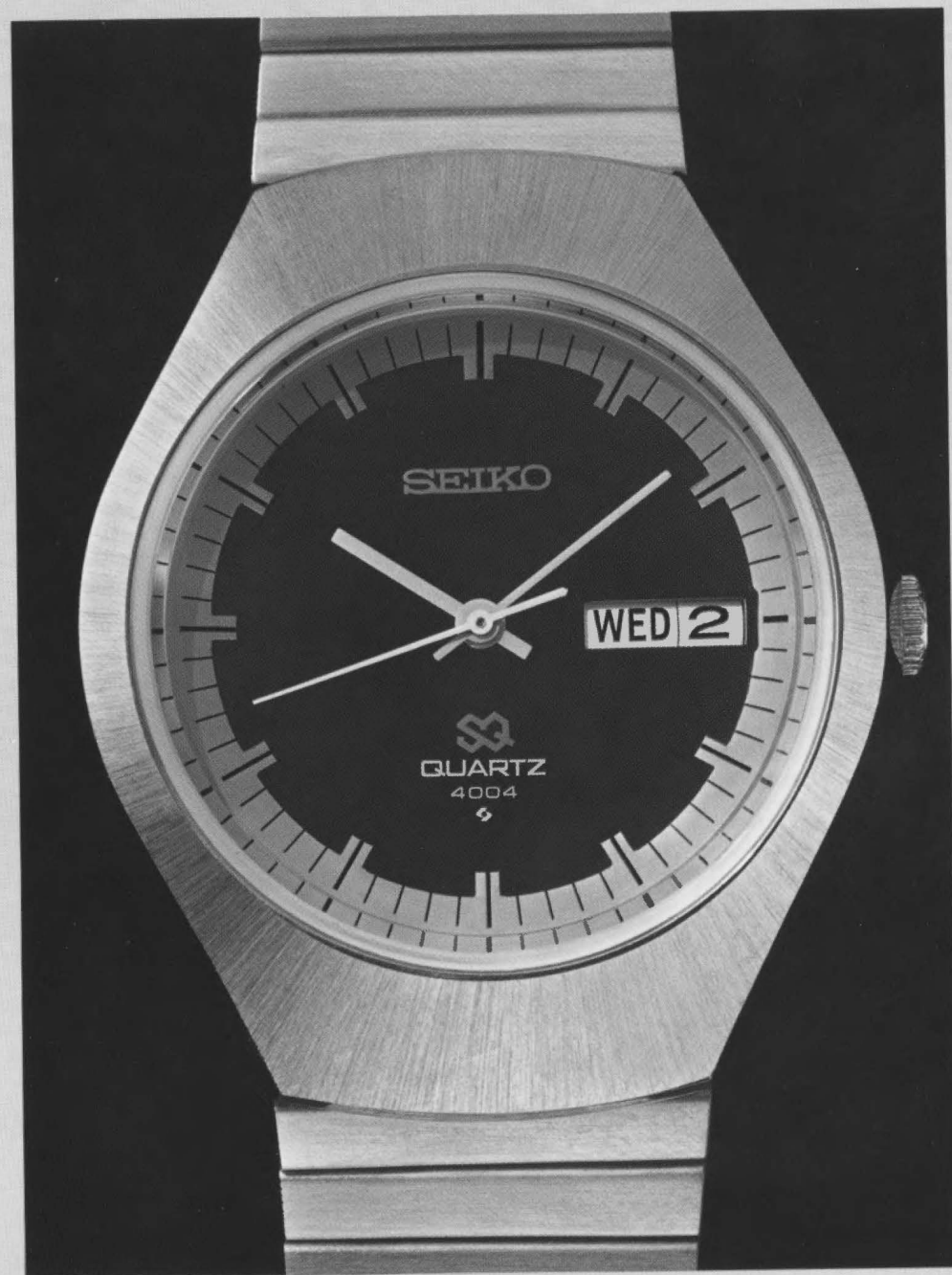

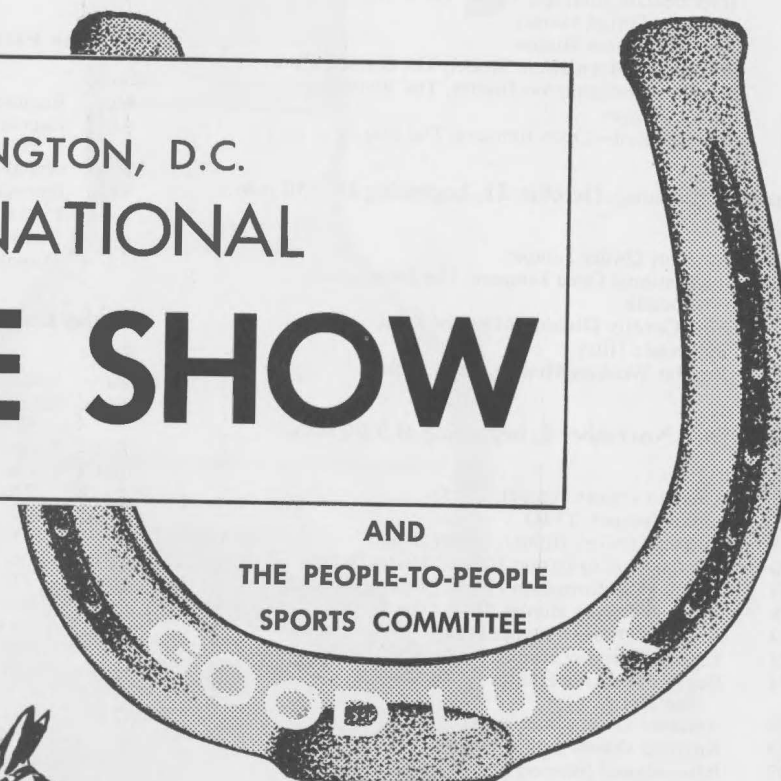

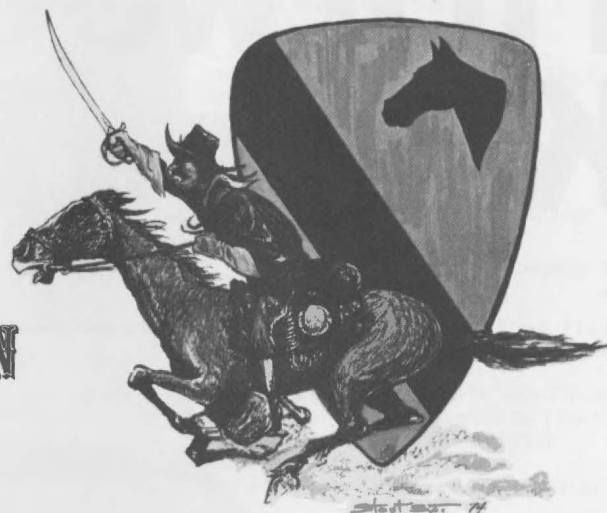

1st Cavalry Division

HORSE CAVALRY PLATOON



Cast in the colorful image of the US Cavalry of a century ago, the 1st Cavalry Division's Horse Cavalry Platoon serves as a living bridge between past and present.

Created in 1971 soon after the division's return from Vietnam, the Platoon mirrors the Cavalry's historic past and its horse-mounted ancestors of the last century. Since its creation the unit has traveled more than 100,000 miles to perform in parades, rodeos and horse shows throughout the United States in support of the Army's recruiting program.

The troopers of the platoon are selected by a combination of criteria. They must be experienced horsemen and, because of the platoon's work involves so many weekends and evenings, they must be volunteers. There is no extra pay for their work. Members are hand-picked after personal interviews and riding auditions and subsequently serve a trial period before final acceptance into the unit. While troopers spend most of their time involved in the platoon's activities, they are required to maintain proficiency in their modern military skills as well.

The platoon is especially proud of its authenticity. All drill and training is derived completely from the official US Cavalry Tactics Manual of 1879, an original copy of which is kept in the Division Headquarters. McClellan saddles are used exclusively.

The Horse Cavalry Platoon also prides itself on the fact that it is a working cavalry outfit, rather than being strictly a ceremonial horse-mounted showpiece. Drill for the platoon includes the same pistol and saber courses, and close order maneuvers, used in training by the pony-soldiers of a century ago. Only the pistol course has been changed to permit the safe firing of wax plugs—instead of real bullets—before audiences.

Accompanying the platoon in most of its performances is a restored 1880 Studebaker escort wagon,

drawn by two matched mules who, in their pre-Army days, appeared in the motion picture, *The Cowboys*.

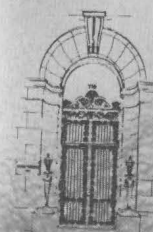
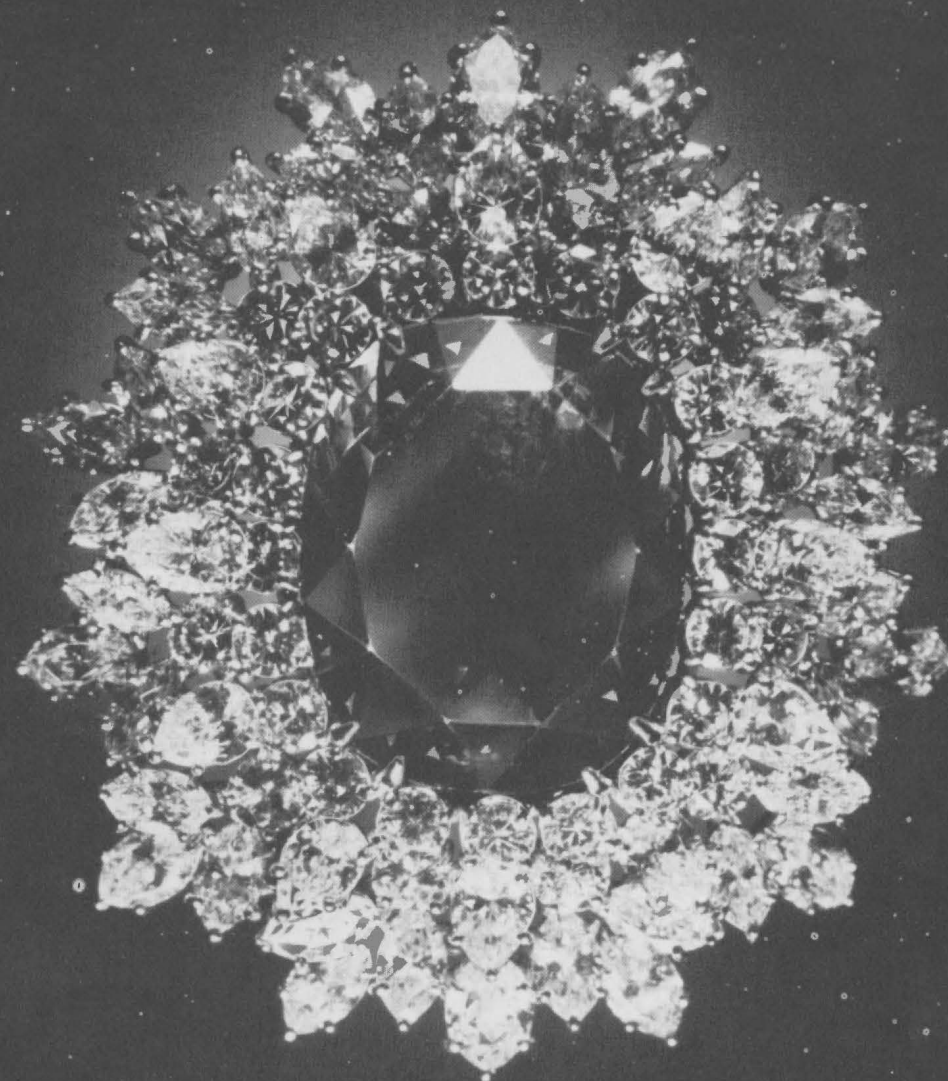
Cavalry horses of the regiments of the last century were usually picked for stamina and endurance, rather than simple speed or beauty. As far as funds and availability of horses allow, the mounts of the Horse Cavalry Platoon are matched in color and size, and all of the horses are "working" horses. For example, the matched blacks of the mounted color guard frequently perform the other platoon maneuvers.

Normally, the platoon performs with the mules and wagon, and twenty outsiders. In all, however, the platoon numbers 22 riders and 28 horses, in addition to the mule teams, escort wagon, muleskinner and guard.

Since the platoon is not an official military organization, no military funds are used for the acquisition or maintenance of its animals or equipment. That is accomplished through private contributions. Individuals and groups throughout the United States, including several museums and armories, have helped in locating and donating saddles, tack, uniforms, weapons, equipment, specification documents, restorations services, and even money to buy horses.

Additional support for the platoon comes from the 1st Cavalry Division Association, whose membership provided the initial funding for the platoon and which still serves as the official owner of the platoon's horses and other property.

Skillfully combining professionalism and showmanship, the platoon has brought to delighted audiences of all ages both stirring understanding of the Cavalry of the 1880's and a glimpse of the breadth of pride, tradition, and spirit which characterizes modern Cavalry. And alongside the platoon, unseen but felt, rides the Spirit of the Cavalry—dusty, unbowed and grinning. The Cavalry indeed lives.

UNITED STATES PARK POLICE SERVICE DOG UNIT



The Service Dog Unit was established in 1957 with the acquisition of the first German Shepherds. All the dogs used are donated by citizens who have a sincere interest in the unit.

The primary purpose of the unit is that of a support unit for the daily law enforcement activities in addition to the effectiveness of tracking lost children, senior citizens or criminals. The dogs have been highly trained in obedience, tracking and searching. Months of long and tedious training are required before the handler and his companion begin their daily patrols. Each service dog lives at home with his handler and his family, thus becoming a family member. As you watch the handler and his dog perform, notice the close relationship between the two. The trust, respect and willingness of both are the making of a true team.

A program has been established whereby children from various school, church and civic organizations throughout the area can visit the service dog training area in Rock Creek Park. This program is so popular that reservations must be made months in advance.

UNITED STATES PARK POLICE

Since the early 1930's the United States Park Police have used horses as a means of police patrol when it was found that in many places horses could patrol more effectively than footmen or motorized patrols. During the 1940's and 1950's the horses, in addition to being an attractive unit for display in parades, were found to be highly effective in crowd and traffic control at the many civic functions held in the Nation's Capital.

The horses had to be properly trained and conditioned to maneuver in crowds of people and through heavily traveled roadways so as not to be a danger to the public, themselves, and the men who rode them. Complete confidence and trust had to be established between horse and rider.

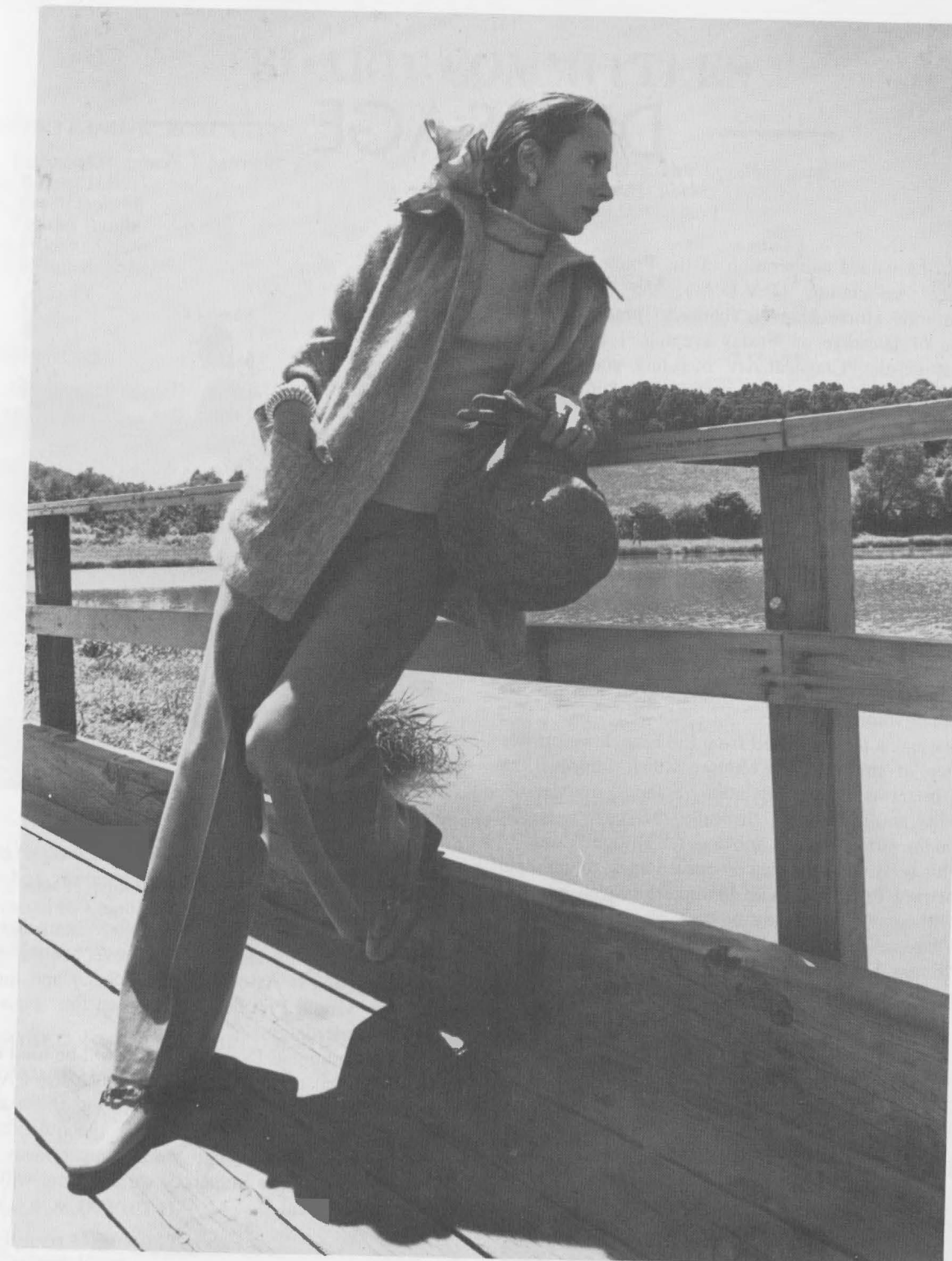
During the 1960's and 1970's the era of demonstrations, a new dimension of police concern arose in the movement of crowds numbering upwards to a quarter-million people and placed new demands on both horse and man.

As you watch the precision movements of the man and his horse in the musical ride and the competition class, they will demonstrate many of the maneuvers used in their every day patrol. Their effectiveness and versatility have proved a tremendous asset to the field of law enforcement.

DRESSAGE

With the valued cooperation of the Potomac Valley Dressage Association (P.V.D.A.), the Washington International Horse Show is happy to present an exhibition of Dressage on Friday evening, 1 November.

Dressage, the "Classical Art" of riding, goes back to the 16th Century when it first was practiced in Europe. Since then, it has been refined by great riding institutions, of which the most famous is the Spanish Riding School in Vienna. In comparatively recent times, Dressage has spread to America, where there now exist more than 40 local Dressage Associations, of which the P.V.D.A. is one of the oldest. In addition, regional groupings have been formed and finally, there is an overall coordinating agency, the U.S. Dressage Federation. All of these organizations, as well as the American Horse Shows Association, support U.S. Dressage efforts, which culminate in regular participation by our teams in Dressage World Championships and in Pan-American and Olympic Games.

Dressage, a term adopted from the French, comprises a series of progressive exercises which improve the horse in terms of his relaxation, balance, suppleness, flexibility and obedience. Basically, the horse is taught to remain straight when moving on straight lines; to bend his body when moving on curved lines; to maintain his forward impulsion, with hindquarters well engaged and with quiet and steady contact on the bit; and to make his transitions (changes from one movement or gait to another) not only accurately but gracefully. Through this training, the horse becomes highly respon-



sive to the rider's aids—hands, legs and weight; and he performs the exercises asked of him calmly and cheerfully.

Dressage training is given on some nine progressive levels, starting with the "Training Level" of the American Horse Shows Association (A.H.S.A.) and finishing with the "Grand Prix de Dressage" on the "Federation Equestre Internationale" (F.E.I.).

While traditional Dressage figures will be used during the exhibition, a main impression which the P.V.D.A. will seek to make will be that of beauty: the beauty of the horses in movement and under the quiet but full control of the riders, all to the accompaniment of orchestral music. The audience, we are sure, will enjoy the spectacle created.

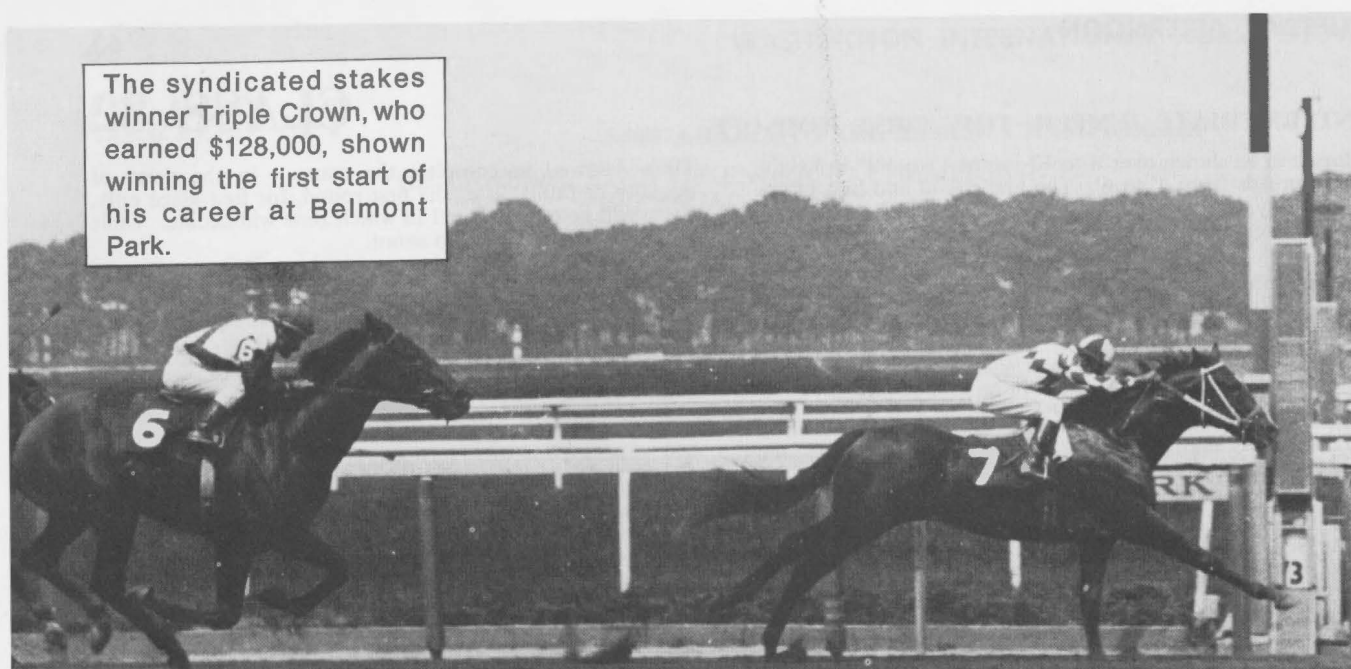

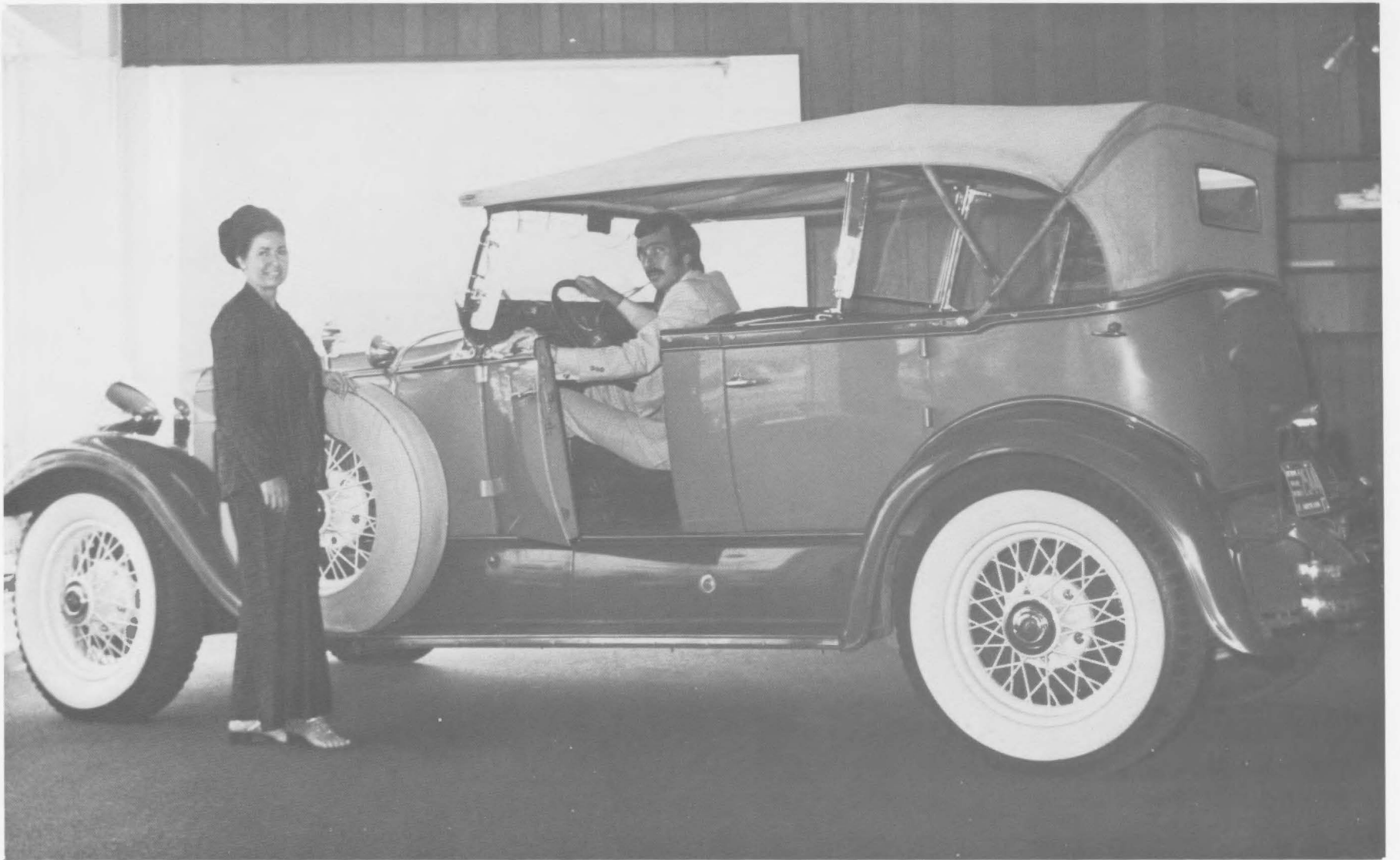
