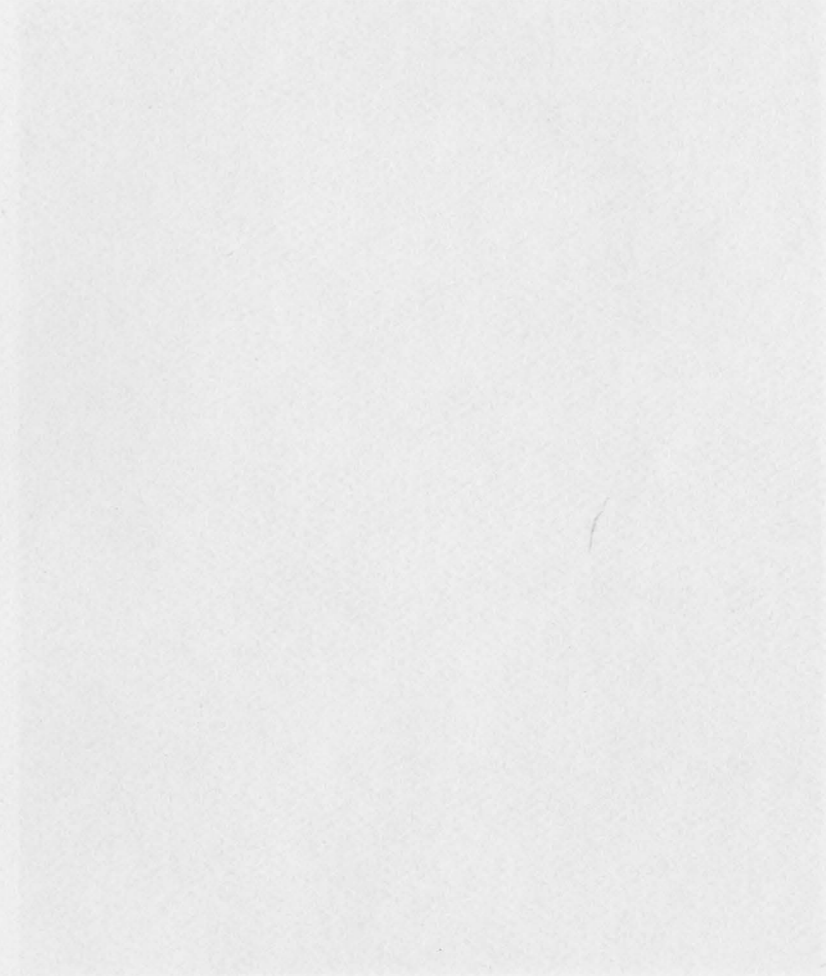

- Job training and creative activities in the ghetto.

- Cooperation in narcotic and alcoholic prevention programs.

CHURCH ORIENTED PROGRAMS

- Produce 3,000 radio and television broadcasts.
- Coordinate the chaplaincy services in hospitals and prisons.
- Cooperate with individual churches and denominations in research and long range planning.
- Finance the Protestant Chapel at Tri-Faith Chapel complex at Kennedy Airport.
- Inter-faith programs to elevate moral, ethical and spiritual climate of the New York Metropolitan area.

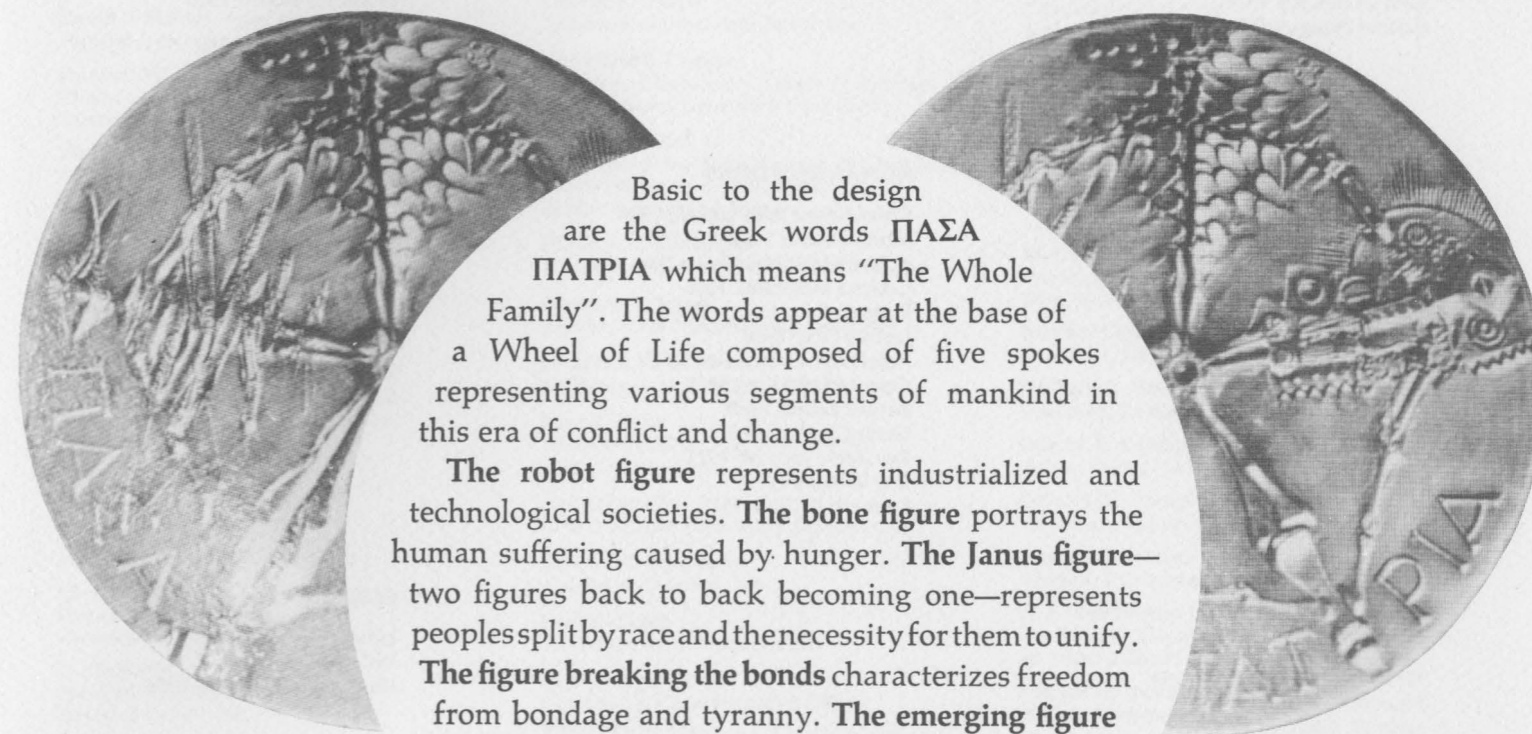
A system of ethics is fundamental to all human engagements.

THE FAMILY OF MAN MEDALLION



Basic to the design are the Greek words ΠΑΣΑ ΠΑΤΡΙΑ which means "The Whole Family". The words appear at the base of a Wheel of Life composed of five spokes representing various segments of mankind in this era of conflict and change.

The robot figure represents industrialized and technological societies. **The bone figure** portrays the human suffering caused by hunger. **The Janus figure**—two figures back to back becoming one—represents peoples split by race and the necessity for them to unify. **The figure breaking the bonds** characterizes freedom from bondage and tyranny. **The emerging figure** speaks of the nations newly born in our time and seeking to stabilize. **The five figures** are joined by clasped hands to indicate the total strength which can be obtained only in unity.

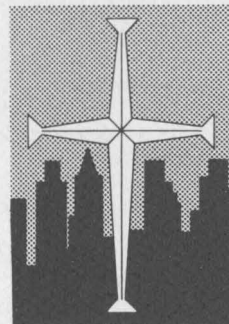

Buchanan and Sorensen: President Veto Power

Columnist Pat Buchanan said in an interview Friday that President Ford exhibited courage in vetoing programs which are popular but too expensive for the country to handle at this time.

In a face-off with former special council to President Kennedy Theodore Sorensen concerning President Ford's veto power, Buchanan said, "I think the President of the US has been right in those vetos and I think he's been economically wise. If he hadn't done it, as a matter of fact, I think we'd have no credibility whatsoever on the economic issue which I think is the issue facing the country today."

Sorensen argued that the President thinks all the cutbacks and "sacrifices must come from those who cannot afford school lunch, those who cannot afford to pay the high cost of medical care and those who aren't in a position to fend for themselves."

Sorensen added, "He is not asking for any sacrifice from those who have the large tax loopholes, he is not asking for a cut in the Defense Department....We need leadership from the President, not vetos. -- ABC Good Morning America (11/7/75)

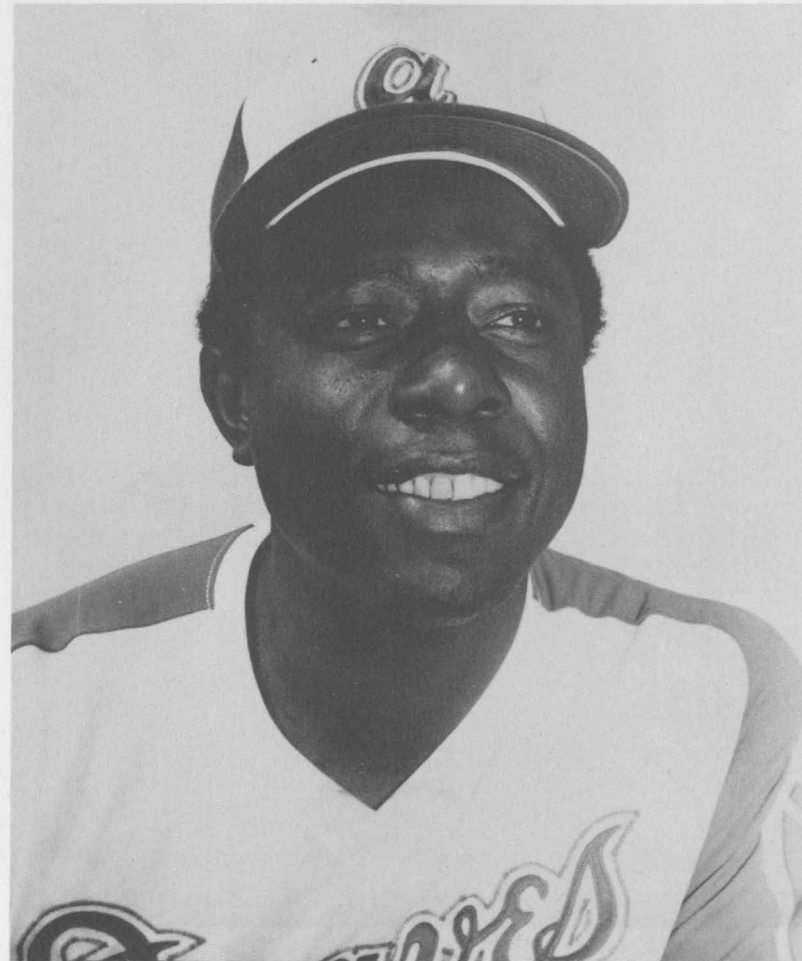

With a history dating back to 1816 the new ecumenical structure of the Council of Churches combines the efforts of 31 denominations, 1700 churches, observers from the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of New York, and, through the Committee of Religious Leaders, cooperation with the New York Board of Rabbis.

The growing programs of the Council reaching more than 250,000 individuals and families are separated into the following major areas:

COMMUNITY ORIENTED SERVICES

- The non-sectarian delinquency prevention program for thousands of teen-agers located in 8 centers in depressed areas in the City.
- Assistance to court related and institutionalized children.
- Family counseling, psychiatric consultation, treatment through the Community Guidance Service to those unable to afford full payment.
- Assistance in developing local housing corporations to meet the critical housing shortage.
- Work for improved quality of public education.
- Job training and creative activities in the ghetto.
- Cooperation in narcotic prevention programs.
- Community organizing to help churches and other groups address immediate neighborhood problems.

CHURCH ORIENTED PROGRAMS

- Coordinate the chaplaincy services in hospitals and prisons.
- Cooperate with individual churches and denominations in research and long range planning.
- Produce 3,000 radio and television broadcasts.
- Finance the Protestant Chapel at Tri-Faith Chapel complex at Kennedy Airport.

PRESIDENT KENNEDY'S ADDRESS

Thank you; Dr. Kinsolving, Dr. Sockman, Dr. Potter, Father Morgan, Rabbi Ronsblum, Mr. Noyor, Governor Stevenson, Mr. Champion, Mr. Leidesdorf, distinguished guests, ladies and gentlemen. I had wondered what I would do when I retired from the Presidency, whenever that time might come, but Dr. Sockman was the first man to suggest work as challenging as the Presidency in becoming chairman of the Protestant Council's Annual Dinner, and I am very grateful to him.

I also regret very much that another honored guest on a previous occasion is not with us tonight. I follow his career with more interest than he might imagine in his quest for the Presidency, Governor Rockefeller follows the example of other distinguished New Yorkers, Wendell Willkie, Thomas Dewey, Richard Nixon, and I wish him some margin of success.

I am gratified to receive this award from the Council and I am impressed by what you are doing here in the city, and I think that the words of Rev. Potter bear very careful reflection by us all.

The United States is not in the position that England was when Benjamin Disraeli described it as two nations divided - the rich and the poor. This is generally a prosperous country, but there is an extreme of poverty - prosperity which runs across the United States which is not exposed to the lives of a good many of us and therefore we are relatively unaware of it except statistically. It is concentrated to some measure in the large cities from which, as I said so many people are moving out, concentrated in some of our rural areas. The New York Times two weeks ago, I think, had an article by Mr. Bigot on the desperate poverty in several rural counties in Eastern Kentucky - schools which were without windows, in some cases with occasional teachers, counties without resources to even distribute the surplus food we make available and what is true in some of the older coal mining areas of the United States is very true in our cities, and we see it in some of our statistics where we have a mental retardation rate for some of our children three times that of Sweden; and where we have an infant mortality and rate behind half the countries of Europe; where we have about 8,000,000 young boys and girls in the next years in this decade who will drop out of school, and a good many of them out of work; and this Council and the religious leaders of the Catholic faith and the Jewish faith have a great responsibility, not only for the moral life of the community, but also for the well being of those who have been left behind. But we are attempting in cooperation with the state and the city, as Rev. Potter described to carry out a pilot program here in the City of New York, but it is only a beginning and there are hundreds of thousands without resources and we have a responsibility to all of them. We have it in Washington. The schools were integrated a few years ago. About half the population in Washington are Negro. Others, whites who are more prosperous generally have moved away and left the problem behind. So I commend this Council for its concern for the Family of Man here in the City of New York and I hope that its efforts will be matched by other cities across the country and that we will remember in this very rich constantly increasing Prosperity there are some for whom we have a responsibility.



I want to speak tonight very briefly, however, about the Family of Man beyond the United States. Just as the Family of Man is not limited to a single race or religion, neither can it be limited to a single city or country. The Family of Man is more than three billion strong. It lives in more than 100 nations. Most of its members are not white, most of them are not Christians, most of them know nothing about free enterprise or due process of law, or the Australian ballot. If our society is to promote The Family of Man, let us realize the magnitude of our task. This is a sobering assignment, for the Family of Man in the world today is not faring very well. The members of a family should be in peace with one another, but they are not, and the hostilities are not confined to the great powers of the east and the west. On the contrary, the United States and the Soviet Union, each fully aware of their mutually destructive powers and their world-wide responsibilities and obligations, have on occasion saw to introduce a great note of caution in their approach to areas of conflict. Yet lasting peace between east and west would not bring peace to the Family of Man. Within the last month, the past four weeks, the world has witnessed active or threatened hostilities in a dozen or more disputes, independent of the struggle between Communism and the free world. Disputes between Africans and Europeans in Angola, between North African neighbors in the Madrid, between two Arab states of Yemen, between India and Pakistan, between Indonesia and Malasia, Cambodia and Vietnam, Ethiopia and Somalia and a long list of others. In each of these cases of conflict neither party can afford to devote to these needless hostilities, the precious resources that their people require. In almost every case the parties to these disputes have more in common ethically and ideologically, than do the Soviet Union and the United States. Yet they often seem less able and less willing to get together and negotiate. In almost every case their continuing conflict invites outside intervention and threatens world-wide escalation. Yet the major powers are hard put to eliminate events in these areas. As I said recently at the United Nations, even little wars are dangerous in this nuclear world. The long labor of peace is an undertaking for every nation large and small, for every member of the Family of Man. In this effort none of us can remain unallied. To this goal none can be uncommitted. If the Family of Man cannot achieve greater unity and harmony, the very planet which serves as its home may find its future in peril. But there are other troubles upsetting the human family. Many of its members live in poverty, and misery and despair. More than one out of three, according to the FAO suffers from malnutrition or under-nutrition or both. While more than one in 10 live below the bread line. Two out of every five adults on this planet are, according to UNESCO, illiterate.

One out of 8 suffers from trachoma or lives in an area where malaria is still clear and present danger. Ten million, nearly as many men, women and children as inhabit this city and Los Angeles combined still suffer from Leprosy and countless others suffer from yaws or tuberculosis or intestinal parasites, for the blessings of life have not been distributed evenly to the Family of Man. Life expectancy in this most fortunate of nations has reached the biblical three score years and ten. But in the less developed nations of Africa, Asia and Latin American, the overwhelming majority of inhabitants cannot expect to live two score years and five. In those vast continents more than half the children of primary school age are not in school. More than half the family



live in sub-standard dwellings. More than half the people live on less than \$100 a year. Two out of every three adults are illiterate. The Family of Man can survive difficulties of race and religion. Contrary to the assertions of Mr. Khrushchev it can accept difficulties of ideology, politics and economics, but it cannot survive in the form in which we know it - a nuclear war - and neither can it long endure the growing gulf between the rich and the poor. The rich must help the poor. The industrialized nations must help developing nations, and the United States along with its allies must do better, not worse by its Foreign Aid Program which is now being subjected to such intense debate in the Senate of the United States.

Too often we advance the need of foreign aid only in terms of our economic self interest. It provides more than a half million jobs for workers in every state. It finances a rising share of our exports and builds new and growing export markets. It generates the purchase of military and civilian equipment for other governments in this country. It makes possible the stationing of 3½ million troops along the Communist periphery at a price one-tenth the cost of maintaining a comparable number of American soldiers, and it helps to stave off the kind of chaos or Communist takeover, or Communist attack that would usually demand our critical and costly attention. The Korean conflict alone, forgetting for a moment the thousands of Americans who lost their lives, cost four times as much as our total world-wide aid budget for the current year. But foreign aid is not advanced only out of American economic self-interest. The gulf between rich and poor which divides the Family of Man is an invitation to agitators, subversors and aggressors. It encourages the ambitions of those who desire to dominate the world which threatens the peace and freedom of us all. Never has there been any question in my mind as President Eisenhower said recently, as to the necessity of a program of economic and military aid to keep the friendly nations of the world from being overrun by the Communists. It is that simple. This is not a partisan matter. For seventeen years, through three administrations, this program has been supported by presidents and leaders of both parties. It is being supported today in the Congress by those in leadership on both sides of the aisle who recognize the urgency of this program in the achievement of peace and freedom. Yet there are still those who are unable or unwilling to accept these simple facts who find it politically convenient to denounce foreign aid on the one hand, and in the same sentence to denounce the Communist menace.

I do not say that there have been no mistakes in aid administration. I do not say it is purchased for us lasting popularity or servile satellites. I do say it is one essential instrument in the creation of a better, more peaceful world. I do say that it has substituted strength for weakness all over the globe, encouraging nations struggling to be free to stand on their own two feet, and I do not say that merely because others may not bear their share of the burden that it is any excuse for the United States not to meet its responsibilities. To those who say it has been a failure, how can we measure success by the economic liability of 14 nations in Western Europe, Japan, Spain, Lebanon, where our economic aid after having completed its task is ended, but by the refusal of a single one of the more than 50 new members of the United Nations to go the Communist route, by the reduction of malaria in India for example, from 75,000,000

cases to 2,000, by the 18,000 classrooms and 4,000,000 text books bringing learning to Latin America, under the infant Alliance for Progress.

Nearly two years my wife and I visited Bogota, Columbia where a vast new alliance for progress housing project was just getting under way. Earlier this year I received a letter from the first resident of this 1200 new home development. "Now," he wrote, "we have dignity and liberty."

These words are the foundation as they have been since '47 of the Mutual Security Program, for the dignity and liberty of all free men of a world of diversity where the balance of power is clearly on the side of free nations is essential to the security of the United States and weakens and waters down the pending program to confuse and confine its flexibility with rigid restrictions and rejections, will not only harm our economy, it will hamper our security. It will waste our present investment and it will, above all, forfeit our obligations to our fellow man, obligations that stem from our wealth and strength, from our devotion to freedom and from our membership in the Family of Man. I think we can meet those obligations.. I think we can afford to fulfill these commitments around the world when 90% of them are used to purchase goods and services here in the United States, including for example, one-third of this nation's total fertilizer exports, one-fourth of our iron and steel exports around the world, one-third of our locomotive exports. A cut of one billion dollars in our total foreign aid program may save one hundred million dollars in our balance of payments, but it cost us nine hundred million dollars in exports. I think the American people are willing to shoulder this burden contrary to the repeated warnings, prophecies and expression of hope. In the 17 years since the Marshall Plan began I know of no single office holder who was ever defeated because he supported this program, and the burden is less today than ever before despite the fact that this year's aid request is about one billion dollars less than the average request of the last 15 years. Too many members of Congress today complain that 4% of our Federal budget is too much to give to this program, yet in 1951 that program amounted to nearly 20% of our budget - 20% in 1951 and 4% today. They refuse today to devote more than four billion dollars to this effort. This Congress has already reduced this year's budget six hundred million dollars below the amount recommended by the Clary Committee.

Is this nation stating that it cannot afford to spend an additional six hundred million dollars to help the developing nations of the world become strong and free and independent. An amount less than this country's annual outlay for lipstick, face cream and chewing gum? Are we saying that we cannot help 19 needy neighbors in Latin America and do as much for the 19 as the Communist Block is doing for the Island of Cuba alone? Some say they are tired of this task, or tired of world problems and their complexities, or tired of hearing those who receive our aid disagree with us. But are we tired of living in a free world? Do we expect that world overnight to be like the United States? Are we willing to stop now merely because we have not produced complete success. I do not believe our adversaries are tired and I cannot believe that the United States of America in 1963 is fatigued. Surely the Americans of the 1960's can do half as well as the Americans of the 1950's. Surely we are not going to throw away our hopes and means for peaceful progress in an outburst of irritation and frustration. I do not want it said of us what T.S.



Eliot said of others some years ago, "These were decent people. Their only monument, the asphalt road and one thousand lost golf balls." I think we can do better than that.

My fellow Americans I hope we will be guided by our interests. I hope we will recognize that the struggle is by no means over, that it is essential that we not only maintain our effort, but that we persevere, that we not only endure Mr. Faulkner's words, but also prevail. It is essential in short that the word go forth from the United States to all who are concerned about the future of the Family of Man, that we are not weary in well doing and we shall, I am confident, if we maintain the pace.



THE FAMILY OF MAN MEDALLION

Designed by Sidney Simon



Basic to the design are the Greek words ΠΑΣΑ ΠΑΤΡΙΑ which means "The Whole Family". The words appear at the base of a Wheel of Life composed of five spokes representing various segments of mankind in this era of conflict and change.

The robot figure represents industrialized and technological societies. The bone figure portrays the human suffering caused by hunger. The Janus figure—two figures back to back becoming one—represents peoples split by race and the necessity for them to unify. The figure breaking the bonds characterizes freedom from bondage and tyranny. The emerging figure speaks of the nations newly born in our time and seeking to stabilize. The five figures are joined by clasped hands to indicate the total strength which can be obtained only in unity.

The Family Of Man Medallion has been exhibited at the Exposition Internationale de Medaille Contemporane, held in Greece in April of 1966. It was a part of the official entry of the United States.



FROM: MILTON FRIEDMAN

In preparing the suggested draft of the President's letter to the Society for the Family of Man dinner in New York City on November 6, I have learned from the host organization's leading officials that there are some last minute developments of sensitivity. I have taken these developments into account in the draft of the suggested letter by the President.

1. Before Mrs. Ford is presented with the award, the Reverend Kenneth Folkes, President of the Council of Churches of the City of New York, (a black minister) will present a check covering this year's proceeds of the Family of Man charity to Mayor Abraham Beame to buy Big Mac bonds as a gesture of confidence in the fiscal policies of New York City. Reverend Dan Potter, executive director of the Council of Churches of the City of New York, told me that Reverend Folkes is under heavy pressure to voice hope that the President will "soften his heart" toward New York City. Reverend Folkes may quote Biblical scripture about withholding help from the needy, the need for compassion and Christian values in Washington, etc. He will then present roses to Mrs. Ford and Mrs. Beame.

2. Hundreds of demonstrators from various New York churches, mainly Black, will be outside demonstrating against the award to the President. Reverend Potter said there would

(more)



be "hundreds" of choir members in robes singing protest songs like "We Shall Overcome" and the "Battle Hymn of the Republic". They may have a public address system and offer protest remarks by clergymen who are against the award to the President. There may be placards outside like "Betty, yes; Jerry, No."

3. I obtained a copy of the prepared remarks by Maurice Granville, of Texaco, who is dinner chairman. He will introduce Mrs. Ford at the close of the program. His remarks are attached and seem appropriate.

4. Arrangements are being made by the dinner leadership to respond to Mrs. Ford with a "very warm" standing ovation because of the dissent.

5. Reverend Potter is seeking an advance text of the President's letter to issue to the press at 5:00 p.m. (prior to the dinner). I recommend against the advance release of this message because prior knowledge would enable critics, who precede the First Lady on the program, to answer the President's words even before they are spoken. It would weaken the dramatic impact of the humane and compassionate tone of the President's letter.

REMARKS OF DINNER CHAIRMAN MAURICE F. GRANVILLE IN
PRESENTING MEDALLION FOR THE PRESIDENT TO MRS. FORD

Thank you, Governor Shafer (M. C.) and now as all of you have so eagerly anticipated the time has come to present the principal award of the evening.

It is a great honor for me to present the Family of Man medallion for 1975 for distinguished public service to the man who serves today as the leader of the United States of the Whole Family of man, President Gerald Ford.

Mr. Ford is the fifth President to receive this award which was established in 1963. The Society for the Family of Man has thus recognized the pivotal rôle of the President of the United States in dealing with the broad range of problems affecting all Americans.
