SANX

The **San** Jicento **MERRX** Monument, constructed in1936 and 1939, commemorates the heroes of the battle of San Jicento and al others who helped win the indepence of Texas. It was constructed with Federal and State funds at a cost of about one million five hundred dollars. It is 570 feet high and built of reinforced concrete faced with Texas fossilized buff limestone.

Battle Ship Texas (San Jicento Ceremony).

The site of the San Jicento Ceremony is the Battle Ship Texas. moored at the battleground since San Jicento Bay, 1948. The U. S. S. Texas, is a veteran of 2 world wars and many campaigns. The State of Texas was the first to save its namesake Battleship from the scrap-heap. The States of North Carolina, Alabama, and Massachusetts have followed suit.

Lead by General Sam Houston, about 969 920 Americans routed Mexican forces numbering more than 1200 under the command of general Santa Anna. The battle lasted 18 minutes.
