ABRAM'S DELIGHT—1754: Built by Abraham Hollingsworth, early settler. Restored and furnished in early American style. Open to public. Rouss Spring Road, off Millwood Avenue. Admission charge.

GLEN BURNIE: Old home, built 1750-94. Present structure replaced 1735 log cabin of Colonel James Wood, founder of Winchester. Route 50 West, just west of shopping center.

RUINS OF OLD LUTHERAN CHURCH: Built in 1764, church was used as barracks during Revolution. Destroyed by fire in 1854. Located at west end of Mt. Hebron Cemetery where Daniel Morgan is buried.

FORT STEPHENS: Located on Route 628 (Middle Road) 11 miles southwest of Winchester. A frontier fort for protection against Indians. Built in 1752. Open to public.

HOME OF DANIEL MORGAN: "Amber Hill" on Amherst Street. Built 1786. General Morgan, hero of Saratoga and Cowpens, lived his last years here, dying in 1802.

WAYSIDE THEATER: Summer theater of professional repertory company offering a play each week May to October. In Middletown, 10 miles south of Winchester.

BELLE GROVE: Historic residence built 1787 by Major Isaac Hite, grandson of first settler, and brother-in-law of President James Madison. One half mile west of Middletown (12 miles south of Winchester). Site of Indian massacre. James and Dolly Madison spent honeymoon here. Headquarters of General Sheridan. In middle of Cedar Creek battlefield, October 19, 1864.

OLD STONE PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH: This church, built in 1788, is located on East Piccadilly Street. General Daniel Morgan of Revolutionary fame was a member of the church. His remains are now in Mt. Hebron Cemetery, nearby. Open daily. Free. The beautiful interior is a fine example of churches of the Colonial era.

TOMB OF LORD FAIRFAX: In the church yard of the Christ Episcopal Church (1828), corner of Boscawen and Washington Streets, lie the remains of Thomas, Lord Fairfax, original proprietor of 5 million acres in Northern Virginia. Fairfax, friend and patron of young Washington, lived at Greenway Court near Winchester 1748-1782.


OLD FREDERICK COUNTY COURT HOUSE: An edifice of Greek Doric architecture, erected in 1840 on site of original Court House built in 1745-51 by Colonel James Wood, founder of Winchester. Located on North Loudoun Street. Collecting station for wounded after battle of Kernstown, March 23, 1862.

CONFEDERATE AND NATIONAL CEMETERIES: The cemeteries lie side by side only a few blocks east of the main business street. 3,000 Confederate soldiers and nearly 4,500 Union soldiers are buried here, most of them casualties of the five battles fought near Winchester during the Civil War.

SHERIDAN'S HEADQUARTERS—1864-65: Here General Philip Sheridan started his famous 12-mile ride south down Valley Pike (Route 11) on October 19, 1864, to the Cedar Creek Battlefield. Arriving at Middletown, he rallied his retreating army and drove the Confederates from the field. Corner of Piccadilly and Braddock Streets. Private.



APPLE PIE RIDGE: Named by the Hessian prisoners of war who were camped nearby during the Revolution. Apples have been grown on this ridge since 1749.

STONEWALL JACKSON'S HEADQUARTERS—1861-62: General Thomas (Stonewall) Jackson and his staff occupied this house on North Braddock Street during the winter of 1861-62. Now a museum, it is now open every day. Admission charge.



WASHINGTON'S OFFICE—1748, 1756-58: Used by Washington while surveying for Lord Fairfax, and later when he commanded Virginia troops defending the frontier against the French and Indians. Now a museum. Open to the public during the spring and summer months, Admission charge.




BELLE GROVE-1787: Middletown. Open to public. See inside of

HISTORIC WINCHESTER and Frederick County in Old Virginia

Where the South Begins, at the Gateway to the Beautiful Shenandoah Valley

Winchester was once Shawnee Indian camping ground to which Pennsylvania Quakers came to settle in 1732.

The town was named Frederick Town after Frederick, father of George III of England. In 1752 the name was changed to Winchester in honor of the ancient English capital.

In 1748, Thomas, Lord Fairfax, proprietor of a five-million.acre royal grant lived near White Post (12 miles from Winchester) until he died in 1783. Having met George Washington at Belvoir, near Mt. Vernon, he employed him to survey lands in what is now Frederick County. During Washington's three years in this area he had his office in a small building at the corner of Cork and Braddock Streets in Winchester. This building still stands and is open to the public as

During the French and Indian Wars, Winchester was a center of defense against Indian raids. During the period 1756-1757 Washington was a young Colonel commanding Virginia troops here, with headquarters in his old survey office.

The Civil War

Winchester's importance during the Civil War is evident by the six battles fought near the town; by the 70 times the opposing armies marched and counter-marched through her streets; and by the eight thousand Union and Confederate soldiers who sleep in her National and Stonewall Cemeteries.

Then, as now, Winchester was the hub of the finest highways arteries for the movement of troops and supplies.

In Confederate hands, Winchester guarded the rich farms of the Shenandoah Valley which provided food for the Confederate armies around Richmond. Winchester was a threat to Washington, and to the roads, railroads and canals which connected the Union capital with the mid-west.

Near-By

In and near Frederick County are many scenic attractions, and opportunities for a wide variety of sports and recreation.

Easy half-day or all-day trips from Winchester include Skyline Drive, many Caverns, the Battlefields of Antietam and Manassas, Harpers Ferry, and George Washington National Forest.
