Notice to The Press

At the President's direction this morning, the Secretary

of HEW has suspended, pending review by HEW's General Counsel,
the ruling of HEW's Office for Civil Rights that father-son breakfasts
held in a public school receiving Federal financial assistance would
violate Title IX of the 1972 amendments of the education laws. The

President advised the Secretary that he cannot believe that it was
the intent of Congress to prohibit mother-daughter, father-son events
at schools

If, upon the legal review, it appeared that the
wording of Title IX mandated such an interpretation, he would
immediately seek an amendment of the law. Secretary Mathews is
announcing today that HEW plans no enforcement action as to these
kinds of events occurring during the review period and will advise
any school to have such events to proceed.
