Dear Ron:

I read with some alarm your letter to Dirck Halstead suggesting that his conduct had been unprofessional and your warning that you might revoke his White House press pass. I think that perhaps we should meet on this matter since it is very serious for him and for TIME Magazine. I confess that the lack of details in your letter bothers me immensely. Who is the Secret Service person or persons who reported that "Dirck wandered away from the pool on several occasions"? And just what does that mean? I'm sure that you can appreciate any photographer making an attempt to avoid the "herd" picture as long as he stays within the bounds of good taste and protocol. Knowing Dirck as well as I do I find it hard to believe that he would deliberately violate the rules of conduct at such times. But I do know that he would attempt to get his own picture. Surely it is not now the duty of the White House and Secret Service to select camera angles.

Dirck flatly denies to me the second incident which you report about bringing a young lady into the White House press area and the President's office. Once again, who are the accusers and what are the details?

I have been working with photographers in and around the White House for more than 17 years and this is the first such reprimand I've seen from the press office. It is doubly curious since Dirck is one of the most gentlemanly, thoughtful and intelligent White House photographers that I have encountered over these years.

Can we talk about this so it can be cleared up?
