NEW JERSEY ISSUES AND GUIDANCE

1. GENERAL BACKGROUND

New Jersey is a "swing" state. Voting patterns indicate that New Jersey voters generally choose the middle -- not too right and not too left. Although the state is currently controlled by Democrats, it is not in the far left column. Republicans are conservative in their life style but moderate in their politics.

The New Jersey President Ford Committee believes that you have a slight edge in the Garden State and that the voters view Reagan as a "sabre rattler." The Reagan organization, however, is working hard.

The New Jersey PFC reports that speakers are very effective in New Jersey; the people like to be informed. Vice President Rockefeller is very popular. You should stress that you have brought Decency, Honesty, and Integrity back into government. You also should elaborate on your efforts and plans for spending cuts, for ways to further stimulate the economy, and to reduce the federal bureaucracy.

2. ECONOMY AND UNEMPLOYMENT

The number one issue throughout the state is the state of the economy. New Jersey claims to have one of the highest unemployment rates in the country. The actual figures is disputed. The state claims that the Federal government determines unemployment rates differently than they do, and that their figure is much higher than the Federal one. It is probably somewhere around 11 and 12 percent. State officials want the percentage as high as possible so they will be eligible for more welfare and unemployment funding.

Among New Jersey's problems is the fact that many private businesses are moving to more favorable

states -- a common problem with the industrialized states of the northeast. The prime causes are environmental problems, taxes, and local restrictions. It could be pointed out here that New Jersey state government is heavily controlled by the Democrats and thus many of the problems are of their making.

Additionally, there is substantial automotive industry here which is only beginning to recover from the recession. But New Jersey also has a growing research and development and a service industry which is stable and which is seen as the hope of the future for the state's economy.

New Jersey's problems are further compounded in the minds of the voters of New Jersey by the phasing out of portions of Fort Monmouth (which are also being relocated in the southern states), and a widespread rumor that Ford Dix will be closed. These should be discussed and answered as follows:

No defense or military installation is closed or phased down until complete economic and other impact studies have been done by the appropriate government agencies. These studies determine the feasibility of closing or relocating a facility and its effect on the states involved. In no case is a base or facility closed or relocated when it is believed that this would have a negative effect on the state. Fort Monmouth is being phased down and changed for a variety of reasons. However, there is no truth to the rumor about Fort Dix. IT IS NOT BEING CLOSED.

The groups hardest hit by unemployment are the minorities and those in the construction trades. All of your positive actions for these groups should be discussed. You might want to emphasize how you are getting business "back on track" and providing permanent jobs rather than government makeshift temporary jobs.

2. REVENUE SHARING

This program is very popular in New Jersey. It provides welcome relief for hard-pressed municipalities. If the bill presently in Congress to extend

revenue sharing is passed and signed, New Jersey will receive \$33 million in the first half of next year. The legislature is counting on this to balance the budget.

3. OFFSHORE OIL DRILLING

There is a general controversy over offshore drilling plus development of deep water ports to pipe in foreign oil. Most citizens realize and accept the need for increased oil sources, but New Jersey has a large shore and beach resort industry and people do not want it damaged. Governor Byrne is a proponent of offshore drilling, but a vocal minority feel the beaches will be ruined and are frightening other people. You may want to mention that the administration is well aware of the environmental impact problems and will strive to keep these at a minimum as we balance the need for energy.

4. <u>DEFENSE</u>

New Jersey citizens favor a strong defense posture for the United States. Reagan's scare tactics do not seem to be having much effect in New Jersey, but there is a nominal anti-Kissinger attitude. Concern over overall defense is heightened by concern over the base closings noted above.

5. ENVIRONMENT

Due to the high density of its population, more stringent pollution control is necessary in New Jersey. What controversy there is revolves around "don't touch our livelihood." The state has strong laws of its own, but many feel there should be uniform federal standards.

6. CRIME

Political scandals are commonplace in New Jersey. But there also is increasing crime rate, which is causing great concern. Your strong efforts to curb crime should be mentioned.

NEW JERSEY -- ISSUES TO AVOID

1. STATE INCOME TAX

New Jersey is one of the few states with no state income tax. Property, business, and sales tax are among the highest in the nation. Legislation proposing state income tax and directed at reducing the others is pending in the legislature. But the issue of an income tax is still unpopular, especially with Republicans. This is strictly a state issue and should be avoided at all costs.

2. ABORTION

There is a very active pro-life minority here, but the majority support no constitutional amendment. Always a dangerous issue.

3. HIGHWAYS

Some of their major interstate highways are incomplete, and some people believe that the Governor is holding up funds. Others believe New Jersey has enough highways. This is a very sticky item -- best avoided as it varies considerably from area to area.

4. NUCLEAR POWER PLANT

The administration is currently considering establishment of a nuclear power plant for a site in the ocean off the coast of central New Jersey. Many understand the need for this due to the great need for more power for this highly industrialized state. However, there is much confusion and rumor. People are not well-informed on the issue, and it is best not discussed at this time.

New Jersey Issues

Listed below are several New Jersey issues that we are aware of based on correspondence we have received.

1. PATH Extension

The Port of Authority of New York and New Jersey have proposed an extension of the current PATH transit line for another 17 miles to Plainfield from its present terminus in Newark. The Urban Mass Transportation Administration gave a tentative "no" to the project, but has left the door open to alternatives.

2. Welfare Reform

Governor Brendan Bryne has been an outspoken critic of existing welfare legislation and procedures. He along with several other Democratic Governors have called for a new approach to income maintenance. The Governors will discuss this issue at their annual meeting, July 5-7.

3. Public Works/Countercyclical Legislation

Numerous New Jersey local officials, particularly the Mayor of Newark, have been strong proponents of Federal public works legislation and countercyclical aid to help the unemployment problems of New Jersey. The President to date has not supported these resolutions because he believes they would not strengthen the economy without adding additional inflationary pressures.

4. Plainfield, New Jersey

On April 14th the President congratulated Mayor Paul O'Keeffe and the citizens of Plainfield for their selection as an All-American City for 1975-1976.

5. Camden, New Jersey

Mayor Angelo Errichetti of Camden has been a strong proponent of the VA hospital being located in Camden, New Jersey. The President's recent decision to release funds for design work included funds for a Camden location.

The Mayor has also taken issue with some of the Department of Labor's administrative requirements under the CETA program. Some of these problems are focused on the population of Camden and its eligibility under this program.

6. New Brunswick, New Jersey

Johnson & Johnson has been negotiating with the City of New Brunswick to maintain a major facility in that city and to expand it. This has been identified as a unique example of how public and private cooperation can help the inner city. However, there is a question lingering over the construction of a new bridge over the Raritan River.

Johnson & Johnson feels that this bridge is essential to provide access to the industrial area. DOT is currently reviewing the impact of this proposal.

7. Summer Youth Employment Program

Governor Bryne was unable to attend the recent signing of the President's request for a supplemental appropriation for the Summer Youth Employment program. However, the Governor expressed his strong support for this action and indicated it would be a considerable help to the State of New Jersey.

8. New Jersey/New York Relationship

With the continuing exodus of firms from New York City to other states including New Jersey, there has been some tension between these two states over whether New Jersey is actively promoting this kind of relocation. Governor Bryne has indicated he feels the two states should not enter into warfare, but has indicated his willingness to attract firms to New Jersey.

9. State Income Tax

The Supreme Court of New Jersey has ruled that State schools should be closed as of July 1 due to an improper balance of property taxes within the towns of New Jersey. One alternative to be considered to solve this problem is the initiation of a State income tax. This is becoming a highly debated issue, and the President should indicate his awareness of it and his belief that it should be solved locally.

10. Newark

The city of Newark has been plagued with chronic unemployment, flight of industry from the city, and a severe financial condition. The President should be prepared to discuss his proposals for dealing with problems of our urban centers.

11. Offshore Drilling

As a coastal State, New Jersey does have an interest in the federal policy on offshore drilling and oil exploration. While this issue has not dominated the news, there is considerable interest in what impact such exploration and development would have on the State.

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NEW JERSEY

Income Tax

- Q. Mr. President, the Supreme Court of New Jersey has come down with a ruling closing the schools as of July 1 of this year because of the improper balance of property taxes within the towns of New Jersey. It has been suggested that if the schools are to open next year, that a New Jersey income tax is the only way to go. Would you comment on this?
- A. The decision of the courts, of course, is the law of the State of New Jersey, and I know the suggestion of income tax has been discussed and voted on many times. This issue is a local problem and one which I feel I should not become involved in. I am sure that your State Representatives who are in touch with their constitutents on this matter will develop the proper solution.

NEW JERSEY

Welfare

- Q. Mr. President, virtually everyone in the United States now agrees that the present welfare system is a mess, and I understand that Governor Byrne, along with several other governors, sent you a telegram requesting that substantial reforms be made in our present welfare program. What have you done to reform our welfare system?
- A. I am certainly in agreement with you that the welfare system is a mess. Problems of administrative complexity, program overlap, and uncoordinated planning place a heavy burden on the recipient, taxpayer, and the program administrator. Figuring out what to do about these problems is another matter.

As one important step towards solving these problems, I am submitting to Congress very soon my proposed Income Assistance Simplification Act. The purpose of this proposal is to help simplify, clarify, and rationalize our major income assistance programs. It would provide authority to make modifications in these programs from a perspective which views them as closely related pieces of an overall effort by the Federal Government to assist persons in need. It is only from this broad viewpoint that we can fully understand the unintended and unwanted effects of the overlap and inconsistencies among these programs.

I should add that I do not view this proposal as the final answer to the problems of the welfare system. But while we continue to seek the best long-range solution to the welfare "mess," I believe these interim corrective steps are necessary and important.

I would also like to indicate that members of the White House Staff and HEW have discussed this issue with several Governors and county officials. I can assure can assure you that as we seek to develop a long-term solution to this problem, my Administration will make every effort to seek the ideas and suggestions of State, county, and local officials who must administer our welfare programs.

NEW JERSEY

Newark

- Q. Mr. President, the city of Newark has had chronic unemployment, industry has fled the city, and the problems continue. Can you comment on any initiatives your Administration has or will be taking to help Newark and other cities similarly situated?
- Α. I am aware of the problem that Newark and some of the other northeastern cities are experiencing. While I feel the problems are best solved on a state and local level, I have suggested to the Congress one approach which would provide tax incentives for the private sector to stimulate business in our urban areas. To date Congress has not acted on this initiative as well as others, that being the reenactment of General Revenue Sharing. In April 1975, I asked for a 5 3/4 year renewal of the present program and to date no final action has been taken on either issue. It is possible that I will be meeting with Mayor Gibson and a caolition of state and local leaders later this week to prompt Congress to move swiftly on my proposal.

I want to emphasize that while the Federal government can provide certain kinds of assistance to our cities, the solution will not come through Federal assistance alone. Cities and States must take firm measures to bring into balance their financial revenues and commitments and create as much as possible a positive environment for long-term private sector employment opportunities.

ACCELERATE OFF-SHORE OIL DEVELOPMENT

- Q. Is there anything you can do to speed up the development of off-shore oil or the building of refineries in the Northeast?
- A. We have and we will continue to support every possible means of accelerating energy development -- so long as it can be done safely and without damaging the environment. I regard off-shore oil drilling as one such area.

With respect to off-shore oil, the Department of the Interior is moving ahead with an aggressive program to evaluate the environmental, energy, economic and other considerations in leasing developing outer continental shelf oil. Interior's schedule would permit a decision this summer on a lease sale in the Georges Bank area off New England. In all areas where OCS development is being considered there is controversy as to its desirability, but we are moving ahead in a way that permits balanced consideration of all the factors involved.

With respect to refineries, the principal problem is finding acceptable sites and this involves a variety of local, state, regional and national considerations. The contribution that the Federal Government can make is to help provide a process for making decisions on particular sites which (a) permits all appropriate considerations to be heard and balanced and (b) permits decisions on sites in a reasonable period of time. To that end, I have proposed legislation that would improve the process for making energy facilities siting decisions. That legislation is awaiting Congressional action.

UNEMPLOYMENT - NEW JERSEY

Question

Unemployment is a major problem in New Jersey as in many other states. Do you see any improvement on the horizon?

Answer

Although New Jersey has a higher unemployment rate than the nation as an average the trend for the first three months of 1976 has been good. It reflects the imrpoving national picture where total employment has increased by 700,000 people since March, 1976, and the total number of people employed reached a new national high of 87.4 million.

Background Only

The New Jersey total unemployment figures (which are seasonally unajusted) for January, February and March, 1976, were: January 11.1%; February 10.8%; and March 10.4%

PUBLIC SCHOOL FUNDING - NEW JERSEY

Question

Mr. President, the Supreme Court of New Jersey has found the State's method of financing public elementary and secondary education unconstitutional and ordered the situration remedied by July 1, 1976, or else state spending for public elementary and secondary education must cease. What can the Federal Government do in this matter?

Answer

The responsibility for education lies constitutionally with the states. For the Administration to intervene in this matter which involves state courts and the state legislature would be an inproper Federal involvement in a local issue.

Background Only

The New Jersey Supreme Court has ordered the state legislature to create a tax structure that would "guarantee all school age children a thorough and efficient education." New Jersey does not have an income tax and efforts to adopt one have failed. The court has ruled that heavy reliance on property taxes to finance public educational systems create unacceptable *disparities from one school district to another. If the New Jersey State Legislature does not find an acceptable solution no funds can be expended. If no funds are expended the Federal monies obtained by matching or maintaining certain levels of effort will also be lost. This would amount to a loss of \$150 million in Federal funds in programs serving 350,000 children.

Answer

Yes it is. I have approved the design and construction of 8 hospitals throughout the country over the next four fiscal years. I have requested design funds for all eight hospitals and will make a request for construction funds for the Camden VA Hospital in FY 1980. The priority order for construction of the hospitals was determined by the VA.

OHIO -- ISSUES AND GUIDANCE

1. BACKGROUND

Several Ohio Congressmen and other Republican leaders advise that Ohioans have a very low level of faith in government at all levels — but especially the Federal Government. They believe one of the reasons for Gov. Carter's success is not only his anti-Washington stance, but his optimism. They feel Republicans have a negative attitude and that the party is run by mediocre individuals.

Several, however, have indicated that much of the antipathy is actually directed toward Democrats since there are presently local scandals involving Democrats. They feel your best posture is to be anti-Congress. They believe you should stress the overwhelming control of Democrats in Congress and your Democratic tax and spend policies. Your vetoes are popular in most parts of Ohio.

2. ECONOMY, UNEMPLOYMENT, AND INFLATION

The major issues everywhere in the state relate in some way to one or all of these items. There is a general fear of renewed inflation and the belief that it has not really receded. Grocery prices are still going up. The statewide unemployment rate is around 8½%, but in some areas as high as 12%. The obvious point to stress is that your leadership in getting the economy moving again. People are being rehired, plants are building up again, and conditions are improving. However, in urban areas, where unemployment is still the greatest, your veto of the public service jobs bill is unpopular. People in those areas want jobs — any kind.

There are a number of specific issues that you should be aware of.

A. Strikes. Firestone Tire and Rubber has been shut down for some time and there is a possibility the unions will spread this to other firms. It is hurting the auto industry, and there is a further possibility that Ford Motor Co. may be

struck in Ohio. There is a growing feeling that if these continue, you should invoke the Taft-Hartley Act.

- B. Tank Plant. The Defense Department has awarded the SMl Tank Project to the city of Lima in northwest Ohio, where a now-vacant tank plant will be used. The project will employ an estimated 5,000 persons. Senator Taft and Congressman Guyer worked for two years to get this project for Ohio. The announcement is presently not scheduled till July. Northwest Ohio is a pro-Reagan area, and the Senator and Congressman feel it is vital that the word get out before the June 8 primary to win support for your candidacy.
- C. Volkswagen Plant. The Volkswagen Co. has announced plans to locate a manufacturing plant in the U.S., either in Pennsylvania or Ohio. Senator Taft and Governor Rhodes believe you should encourage the choice of Ohio. (Ohio is still one of the strongest Republican states supporting your candidacy.) It is believed the facility will employ 20,000 people. The State Legislative leadership of both parties is pushing Sen. Taft's office advised that there hard for it. is an old tank plant near Cleveland (in Brook Park) that would be an ideal site, but you should avoid getting this specific as Columbus is bidding for it also.
- D. Atomic Energy Plant. There is a controversy as to the location of a new uranium enrichment plant. A federal facility of this type now exists in Portsmouth, Ohio, (Scioto County, 6th Cong. Dist.), and Sen. Taft and Congressman Harsha feel that this existing plant should be expanded to incorporate the proposed project. However, Alabama and Georgia also are bidding for the project. If given to either of these states, it would be built by private industry, which is the type of philosophy you have been espousing. Congressman Harsha is pressing hard on this. He leans toward Reagan now, and says if the project does not go to Ohio, he will endorse Reagan.

The Senator and the Governor have generally supported your position of creating new jobs by expanding the private sector, but they feel an exception should be made in this case as Ohio's unemployment picture has been worse than many other states.

E. Steel Import Quotas. The administration decision to curtail imports of specialty steel is very popular in Ohio. It helps local plants.

3. AGRICULTURE

Ohio is a substantial farm state. There is still much anger over the grain embargo. Even though the issue is nearly a year old, the farmers haven't forgiven you or Secretary Butz for letting George Meany bully them. Congressman Brown's office advises however, that there is increasing feeling that you are coming out of it in his district (7th) and that it is best avoided here. If raised, the best answer is that Reagan would abolish all or most trading with Soviet nations, thus the farmers would really be hurt.

Your efforts to change the farm inheritance tax laws should be mentioned. They are very well-liked. Congressman Brown is co-sponsor of a bill to raise the exemption to \$185,000 which is higher than your \$150,000.

4. DEFENSE

Ohio believes in strong defense and further defense spending. Wright Patterson Air Force Base is located in Green County (east of Dayton); the B-l Bomber is built in Ohio. There is much concern over defense cuts.

Sen Taft's office advises that you should criticize the "over-reaction" of Congress to Intelligence community abuses and especially that attacks by Sen. Church and others are harmful to the nation.

5. TORNADO RELIEF

You should mention, if possible, the continued relief you have given to the city of Xenia, Ohio, since the tornado struck several years ago. Citizens are not aware that you have been sending relief all this time.

6. NIOSH

In 1972, HEW made the decision to locate the permanent site of the National Institute of Occupational Safety and Health in the city of Cincinnati. Thus far no construction has taken place and no action to begin the project. You have been urged to ask Congress for supplemental funds to begin the project.

7. CUYAHOGA VALLEY NATIONAL PARK

You and Sen. Taft worked together to have the Cuyahoga Valley area declared a national park. IT IS THE FIRST NATIONAL PARK IN OHIO and is located in the most populous area of the state -- just south of Cleveland. Ohioans are very proud of it, and you have not been given credit due for promoting this project. Mention it if possible.

8. FOREIGN RELATIONS

Ohioans are concerned with problems of world peace. They have little faith in the United Nations, reacted negatively to Dr. Kissinger's trip to Africa, and are reacting to Reagan's attacks on the Panama Canal issue.

In addition, they are concerned with the Rhodesian issue. Ohio needs chrome to use in manufacturing stainless steel and imports most of this chrome from Rhodesia. The steel companies are distressed for fear they will have to buy it from Russia, if Rhodesia goes.

9. REVENUE SHARING

There are 61 separate political subdivisions in Ohio. Most cities are in trouble. The mayors all like revenue sharing and want it continued. It is the biggest source of income for communities and they like the allowance for local initiative it gives. Mention your efforts to continue and expand it.

10. STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT

Ohio state government has grown out of proportion with the state's growth. Except for the Governor, it is totally dominated by the Democrats. They are presently scandal ridden, and their leadership is being blamed for many problems. You can capitalize on these scandals. In addition, local governments are having problems with programs that the state and federal governments are imposing on them and that they can't fund. They want a greater voice in the selection of these programs.

11. CRIME

It is increasing in rural and suburban areas. There is a growing support for mandatory sentences for some crimes. Ohio is generally a conservative, work-oriented state, and the people believe criminals should pay the price for their actions.

12. OLDER AMERICANS

Ohio has a large elderly, poor population. All obvious issues are of concern to them. Best position is to point out your concern for their problems, and Reagan's attacks on the Social Security system.

Governor Rhodes has a program for the elderly called the "Golden Buckeye Card" which provides discounts for them for services. He should be complimented for this.

13. URBAN PROBLEMS

Because of their age and concentrations of poor and minorities, Ohio cities have severe economic problems. You should be prepared to answer the question of what you are doing for the cities, particularly in terms of stimulating the inner-city environment. Along this line you should be aware of the strong support for your anti-redlining actions.

14. CETA PROGRAM

There have been specific problems with the Department of Labor's regulations affecting the administration of CETA program. Mayor Moody of Columbus had a long standing argument with DOL about the percentage of funds that could be used for rehiring laid-off city employees. That issue has been resolved; however, there is a continuing sense that the CETA program is being recategorized through administrative regulations and procedures.

15. GREAT LAKES ISSUES

Governor Rhodes has long asked for a relocation of the headquarters of the St. Lawrence Seaway Administration to the Cleveland area. He has based this request on the assumption that proximity to the lake area would result in better decision making. Secretary Coleman has written to the Governor and indicated that there is a strong rationale for keeping the location here in Washington and in fact, most state and local officials as well as members of the Congressional delegation from that area strongly endorsed the Washington location from the very beginning.

16. CONRAIL

There is a general sentiment that the nation's rail freight system did have to be consolidated and improved. However, there has been some negative economic impact in such communities as Marion, Ohio, where there have been lay-offs as a result of this merger. You could be sympathetic of such lay-offs, but indicate your strong belief that the nation needs a more efficient and reliable freight transportation system and that consolidation was the only alternative.

17. STATUS OF MEDICAID

Ohio is facing dollar shortages in the medicaid area. The state has indicated that it will cut back on the medicaid "optional" service provisions of this program. There is also consideration of utilizing private sector companies for the management of medicaid to improve in the administrative efficiency and reduction of errors. You may be asked about his support for medicaid and increased funding levels.

18. CENTRAL AND SOUTHERN OHIO

Mayor Moody mentioned that concern over prices and inflation remain high in this part of Ohio. The people support a strong military posture, but are not "radical" about it. Our foreign policy positions are unclear, and while people are not angry, they are concerned.

19. PRESIDENTIAL SUPPORT FROM LOCAL OFFICIALS

Mayor Stanley Cmich of Canton, Ohio recently sent to the President a resolution of support from approximately 40 Mayors throughout the State of Ohio.

MEDICAID FRAUD

- Q: Is it true that a "Strike Force" of federal investigators will be coming into Ohio to look into Medicaid fraud and abuse?
- A: By agreement between Governor Rhodes and Secretary Mathews, a joint Federal-State management team consisting of various specialists will conduct a review in Ohio in August. A small team is presently working in the State to prepare for this review. Other States with similarly large Medicaid expenditures will also participate in such reviews at a later date to identify possible fraud and abuse violations.

BACKGROUND

Earlier this year, several investigations uncovered the fact that there was widespread fraud and abuse in the Medicaid program among the various States. Illinois, for example, was found to have numerous clinical laboratories, physicians and other health providers whose records showed a pattern of fraud and abuse. Nationally, it was estimated that fraud could approach 2-5 percent of the total \$15 billion Medicaid program, or about \$750 million in a single year. To bring this problem under control, HEW has designed a team of Medicaid management examiners who will work with the States in conducting thorough reviews to ferret out fraud and abuse. An increased emphasis will be placed on the use of computerized Medicaid Management Informations Systems (MMIS) which will be capable of producing accurate patient profiles that will help highlight cases of individual fraud. Plus, an additional 108 investigators have been added to Washington and regional staffs to look into fraud. It is hoped these efforts will prove helpful in bringing the problem under control.

OHIO - RUBBER INDUSTRY STRIKE

- Q. Mr. President, what is your Administration doing to bring about a contract settlement in the Rubber Industry strike?
- A. This is a situation we have been staying very close to. The Federal Mediation and Conciliation Service has one of their top representatives and five mediators working to help find a solution to the impasse.

BACKGROUND

On April 20, 1976, the United Rubber Workers (URW) instituted a strike against the BIG four tire manufacturers (Firestone, Goodyear, Goodrich, and Uniroyal). The nationwide strike affects some 70,000 employees at 47 plants. Union and management officials have wide differences of opinion as to what a fair settlement would be. Among other demands the Union is seeking an uncapped cost of living escalator.

The URW President has visited Geneva, Switzerland to encourage a world wide boycott of Firestone products, which the AFL-CIO Executive Council has endorsed. Firestone was chosen as the boycott target because the Union is concentrating on getting an industry-wide pattern setting settlement with Firestone.

- Q. Mr. President, several cities in Ohio are experiencing revenue shortages and have had to lay-off experienced city employees. Now the Department of Labor is limiting the number of laid-off cities employees that can be rehired through CETA's Title VI. Does it make any sense to hire people totally unfamiliar with the jobs they will be performing when the former holders of those jobs are on the unemployment roles themselves?
- A. The issue is actually a bit more complicated than your question suggests. CETA funds are meant to help all kinds of unemployed workers, and not just those who previously worked for a local government. The issue centers on the percentage of CETA positions which can be used by local governments to rehire their own laid-off workers. In each instance, Department of Labor officials are working with local leaders to arrive at acceptable solutions.

Background

Nationwide several cities, including Warren, Cleveland and Columbus in Ohio, have objected to DOL placing a limit on the number of laid-off city employees that can be rehired through CETA, Title VI. DOL has a policy limiting city employee rehires to a proportion that relates to their incidence among the total number of unemployed eligibles for public service employment in the given area.

URANIUM ENRICHMENT PLANT AT PORTSMOUTH, OHIO

You undoubtedly will be pressed for a firm commitment to build a Government-owned add-on enrichment plant at Portsmouth.

There follows:

A Q&A on uranium enrichment which has three alternative endings -- depending upon your decision on the extent of commitment to the Portsmouth plant that you wish to make at this time.

(The answer is a condensed version of the three alternative statements prepared in response to your instruction to Jim Cannon on this subject.

The alternatives are:

- 1. Portsmouth is merely a contingency -- if private ventures don't succeed.
- 2. Commit to proceed with design, planning, etc., but no firm commitment at this time that it would proceed ahead of private industry.
- 3. Firmly commit to Portsmouth, regardless of private ventures.
- . A follow-on question -- in the event you select alternative #2 and are then pressed for a more firm commitment.

GOVERNMENT-OWNED ADD-ON TO THE URANIUM ENRICHMENT PLANT AT PORTSMOUTH, OHIO

Question

There is general agreement that we must move quickly to increase capacity in this country to enrich uranium. This could be done quickly and easily by adding on to the existing plant at Portsmouth, Ohio. Why have you opposed this approach and favored, instead, having private industry build enrichment plants? (Building a plant in Ohio would help relieve the high unemployment in the Portsmouth area.)

Answer

Last June, I proposed legislation that would establish a major new private industry in America -- providing the enriched fuel for nuclear power reactors. My proposal would make it possible for the U.S. to maintain its leadership as the world's supplier of uranium enrichment services for peaceful uses.

The Joint Committee on Atomic Energy (JCAE) of the Congress has, after ten months, made some modifications in my proposal and approved it.

I have reviewed the changes in the bill and concluded that I will support it. The bill meets the fundamental objectives I outlined ten months ago. For example, it establishes the principle of creating a new private uranium enrichment industry.

Particularly important for the people of Ohio, the bill and committee report also would authorize and direct ERDA to initiate planning, design and other work for the expansion of the existing government-owned uranium enrichment plant at Portsmouth, Ohio.

In this connection, I recently requested Congressional approval of \$12.6 million to fund this planning and design work during the next four months. As soon as Congress passes the Nuclear Fuel Assurance Act, I will ask them to appropriate \$170 million for FY 1977 to proceed with design and planning necessary for construction of the Portsmouth plant.

Four major U.S. companies have submitted proposals to ERDA to build uranium enrichment plants. Contracts will be negotiated with these firms and will be submitted to Congress for approval. We will give these companies an opportunity to prove themselves to the Congress and in the marketplace.

NOTE: BELOW ARE THREE ALTERNATIVE ENDINGS -- DEPENDING ON

YOUR DECISION ON THE EXTENT OF THE COMMITMENT YOU WISH TO MAKE AT THIS TIME TO BUILD AND OPERATE THE PORTSMOUTH ADD-ON PLANT:

(Alt. #1: Portsmouth plant is a contingency measure only)

"As a backup plan, we will also proceed with design and planning of the Portsmouth addition to make certain that no time need be lost in providing the uranium enrichment capacity necessary for U.S. needs and the needs of our customers around the world."

(Alt. #2: Commit to proceed with design, planning etc., but no firm commitment at this time that it would proceed ahead of private industry or regardless of the success of private ventures.)

"We will also proceed with design and planning of the Portsmouth addition to make certain that no time need be lost in providing the uranium enrichment capacity necessary for U.S. needs and the needs of our customers around the world."

(Alt. #3: Firmly commit now to proceed with the Portsmouth add-on regardless of private ventures.)

"In order, however, for the U.S. to have sufficient supplies to meet present and prospective commitments here and abroad, we will also move ahead promptly with the Portsmouth addition."

BACKGROUND

- You undoubtedly will be pressed while in Ohio to make a firm commitment to build the Portsmouth plant as the next increment of capacity -- ahead of any privately-owned plant. Outside Ohio, on the other hand, private firms and their potential customers may be discouraged if you do make a firm commitment.
- The above is a condensed version of alternative statements prepared in accordance with your instructions to Jim Cannon.
- A follow-on question is enclosed which could be used if you select Alt. #2, and you are then pressed for a more firm statement as to you commitment with respect to Portsmouth.

ARE YOU FIRMLY COMMITTED TO BUILD AN ADD-ON ENRICHMENT PLANT AT PORTSMOUTH?

We still cannot tell whether you are really committed to build an add-on enrichment plant at Portsmouth or whether you are regarding the add-on as a contingency -- to be built only if private ventures don't succeed. Which is it?

ANSWER

I have indicated that I will support the Nuclear Fuels Assurance Act, as reported by the JCAE. That bill directs initiation of work necessary for the Portsmouth add-on.

I should point out that design work for such an add-on plant has been underway for some time. On May 5, 1976, I asked the Congress to approve \$12.6 million to fund the work through September 1976.

If the Congress passes the NFAA, I will request \$170 million to continue the work during FY 1977.

I should also point out that, as a practical matter, no one can make an irrevocable commitment at this time that either the prospective privately owned plants or the add-on plant will be completed and operated, for a number of reasons. For example:

- A final decision to construct any enrichment plant would have to be proceeded by compliance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), including the preparation of a final environmental impact statement (EIS). Even the appearance of a firm commitment at this time to build or permit building a plant might provide grounds for later challenge as to whether NEPA had been observed.
- . Also, there are remaining uncertainties that have to be resolved. In the case of the add-on plant, for example:
 - There is uncertainty about the availability of electrical power. Apparently it will be necessary to build two or more coal-fired or nuclear plants and the questions of whether, when and where such plants could be built is unresolved.
 - ERDA plans to use equipment in the add-on plant that is much larger than used previously. The larger systems have not yet been demonstrated or produced and this work must be preceded by construction of test facilities and by testing of the system.
