STEPHEN BULL

Q. Has Steve Bull resigned?

A. No, he is still on the White House Staff. As you know, he was detailed to San Clemente following the resignation of the former President. His work there has been completed and he is no longer assigned to the former President.

Q. What is he doing?

A. I understand that he is on leave for a week or so and is expected to be in Washington next week. (FYI ONLY: He is in New York City this week. END FYI)

Q. Has he been asked to submit his resignation?

A. Not that I am aware of. As far as I know, no one has talked to Steve about his future as of now.

Q. Who is handling the Bull question?

A. It is one of the items that would be covered by Jack Marsh's directive from the President to oversee the transition. I think that Don Rumsfeld also will be involved because it involves the White House Staff.

Q. Do you expect him to stay on at the White House?

A. There is nothing I can give you on that.

Q. What will he be doing to earn his salary.

A. No one has had a chance to talk to him yet so that question is premature.

Q. How much does he get paid?

A. \$34,000 a year.
