PRESIDENT MEETS WITH INDIANS

The President yesterday met with eight Ogala Sioux indians, following their four hour meeting with Ted Marrs. Their discussions centered on local Pine Ridge reservation problems, and general matters concerning housing, education, and government.

It is my understanding the meeting was very productive, and there is good communication between the indians and Mr. Marrs.

What did the indians specifically want and what did the White House agree to, if anything?
