Q: What is the U.S. position with regard to independence for Croatia?

A: As you will recall in the statement issued at the conclusion of President Ford's visit to Yugoslavia on August 4, 1975, the United States expressed its support for the independence, integrity, and non-aligned position of Yugoslavia.
