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6. Ecuadom has said that it will not attend next Spring's Hemispheric, Eoreign Ministers if the President signs the Brade Bill which contains a provision denying generalized tariff preference to OPEC countries. Do you have any comment on Equador's position?

3/35 <u>GUIDANCE:</u> This is something you should take up with the Department of State. I would simply point out that the Administration opposed the restrictive sections of the Trade Bill which Ecuador and other countries have protested. Nevertheless, Congress wrote them

into the legislation.

2. Do you have any comment on Equador's seizure of U.S. fishing boats?

1/31/15 <u>GUIDANCE</u>: The U.S. Embassy is lodging a protest with the government of Equador concerning these seizures and I would suggest you check with State for any detailed comment. 4. Do you have any comment on the outcome of the OAS meeting in Quito? Didnitute US abstention contribute to the failure of the conference?

Guidance: Deputy Secretary of State Ingersoll represented the US in Quito and I would prefer that a detailed statement on the results of the Quito Conference come from the Department of State. We do not believe the conference was 'a failure" just because a consensus was not obtained on the Cuban sanctions issue. We made it very clear that the US would not press its position on any other country and we consulted closely with the other members of the OAS throughout. If the necessary two-thirds majority was lacking it was because there are not enough OAS nations now persuaded to lift the OAS sanctions.
